Illinois Extension office suspends regular office hours and programming in Franklin, Jackson, Perry, Randolph and Williamson Counties

The impact of the COVID-19 (novel coronavirus) continues to create uncertainty and concern both globally and here in our community. Illinois Extension is in the process of activating strategies with campus to protect everyone's health and safety.

This week, the University of Illinois announced a suspension on all in-person events and meetings in campus facilities to protect you and our entire community. Illinois Extension, as the outreach program of the university, aligns with all policies related to public health and safety.

Effective Friday, March 13, all university-sponsored events are suspended indefinitely. As a result of this action, all 4-H club and volunteer activities are also suspended and will be held in a virtual/on-line capacity. *University of Illinois Extension offices in the above mentioned counties will be closed until April 7,* 2020 and all in-person university supported clubs and events are cancelled until May 31, 2020.

# So, what does this mean?

There will not be any face to face 4-H meetings. Your clubs can hold virtual meetings by skype, zoom or facetime, but no face to face meetings until after May 31.

Requirements to be an achievement member and eligible to sell in the Franklin County Youth Auction. We have reduced those requirements to 4 meetings or events. So for those that still need 2 or more meetings you will need to call or email me for additional activities that you can do to fulfill those requirements. You should be able to get 1 meeting in June.

Talks and Demonstrations—those still have to be done. Your leader will be contacting you with the way they prefer you to complete these. My preferred option: send a video to your clubs Facebook page of your talk or demonstration. This way your whole club gets to see. This is only fair since the members that did their talks and demonstrations at the beginning of the year had to stand in front of the club to do theirs. Questions just give me a call, text or email.

#### **Livestock Deadlines**

All livestock must be owned and on the stated address, being cared for by the 4-H member by the dates listed below for each species. Forms must be turned in to the Extension Office by the required date.

April 15, 2020 -- Swine, Sheep & Goats

June 1, 2020—-Rabbits & Poultry & Horses

For animals born after those dates, they are automatically included. Random farm visits will be conducted without notice.

# You be the judge at Illinois 4-H State Livestock Judging Contest

June 15 | 9 AM - 4 PM Stock Pavilion | University of Illinois, Urbana

The Illinois 4-H Livestock Judging Contest will be held Monday, June 15 at the Stock Pavilion in Urbana (1402 West Pennsylvania Ave.) beginning with registration at 8:30 a.m. All participants must be checked in by 9:30. The contest will begin at 10. Each county may enter a total of three teams, with no more than two junior teams or two senior teams. Get all the rules and details online @ go.illinois.edu/4Hlivestock. There will be three classes of beef, three classes of swine and two classes of sheep. There may also be a class of meat goats substituted for one class of the other species. There will also be a class of 15 questions (5 from a beef class, 5 from a swine class and 5 from a sheep class). Cost for each senior competitor is \$10 to cover the cost of lunch. Juniors will be dismissed by lunch to get their own meals.

# 4-H Poultry judging returns to state fair

August 17 | 4-6 PM Jr. Livestock Barns | Illinois State Fair

The Illinois 4-H State Poultry Judging Contest will be held from 4 to 6 PM Aug. 17 in the junior livestock barns on the State Fairgrounds in Springfield. There is no limit to the number of exhibitors each county may send. Teams of three or four contestants may be submitted. The four top seniors (age 14-18 on Jan. 1, 2020) will compete as the Illinois team at the National 4-H Poultry and Egg Conference in November. Registration begins at 3:30. #### Be a true leader in service



# How strong is your 4-H family spirit?

The Illinois 4-H Foundation welcomes nominations for the 2020 4-H Family Spirit Award. The Illinois 4-H Family Spirit Award recognizes a family with at least three generations and at least 15 different family members (including in-laws) that have either been 4-H members, leaders, or volunteers with at least 100 cumulative years of 4-H membership or volunteerism represented within the family. Selection is based on the total number of family members with 4-H connections, the total number of years of 4-H involvement, the diversity of experiences and recognitions earned by the 4-H members, and the collective impact that family members have made as advocates of their county and state 4-H programs.
