Fair Dates —July 9-16

Rate of Gain

Steers—will be weighed Saturday, February 29, 8:00-9:00am. If you plan on participating you must RSVP to 439-3178.

Barrows, wethers (goat & sheep)—will be weighed Saturday, April 18, 8-9:00am. If you plan on participating you must RSVP to 439-3178.

Weighing and tagging will be done at the Fairgrounds by Rend Lake College.

Vet. Check Day

The date has been set for June 29 please put this on your calendar. We are working on ways to speed the day up.

YQCA

You do have the opportunity to print your certificates if you would like them for your records. You will need to sign in, return to course menu, click on print certificate, download and print. This will only be necessary if you are showing at any other shows, otherwise I have the list for the county show.

Livestock Deadlines

All livestock must be owned and on the stated address, being cared for by the 4-H member by the dates listed below for each species. Forms must be turned in to the Extension Office by the required date. April 15, 2020—Swine, Sheep & Goats

June 1, 2020—-Rabbits & Poultry & Horses

For animals born after those dates, they are automatically included. Random farm visits will be conducted without notice.

QUALITY ASSURANCE & ETHICS (QA&E):

The Quality Assurance and Ethics training is required for all youth that enroll in horses, rabbits, poultry, dogs, and cats. Members must take the training whether they own a live animal or not. It is advised that they complete this one time as soon as they are enrolled in the project area. Counties will monitor completion of this. Failure to complete QA&E will result in the member's animal science project enrollment being cancelled and they will be ineligible to exhibit at county fairs. The QAEC is done only 1 time. This quiz will be in effect for your entire 4-H career.

NOTE: Youth must be logged on to a computer for this program, either a desktop or laptop; not an iPad or iPhone. The program cannot capture the information for county staff to see when it is completed using iPads or iPhones.

You be the judge at Illinois 4-H State Livestock Judging Contest

June 15 | 9 AM – 4 PM Stock Pavilion | University of Illinois, Urbana

The Illinois 4-H Livestock Judging Contest will be held Monday, June 15 at the Stock Pavilion in Urbana (1402 West Pennsylvania Ave.) beginning with registration at 8:30 a.m. All participants must be checked in by 9:30. The contest will begin at 10. Each county may enter a total of three teams, with no more than two junior teams or two senior teams. Get all the rules and details online @ go.illinois.edu/4Hlivestock. There will be three classes of beef, three classes of swine and two classes of sheep. There may also be a class of meat goats substituted for one class of the other species. There will also be a class of 15 questions (5 from a beef class, 5 from a swine class and 5 from a sheep class). Cost for each senior competitor is \$10 to cover the cost of lunch. Juniors will be dismissed by lunch to get their own meals.

4-H Poultry judging returns to state fair

The Illinois 4-H State Poultry Judging Contest will be held from 4 to 6 PM Aug. 17 in the junior livestock barns on the State Fairgrounds in Springfield. There is no limit to the number of exhibitors each county may send. Teams of three or four contestants may be submitted. The four top seniors (age 14-18 on Jan. 1, 2020) will compete as the Illinois team at the National 4-H Poultry and Egg Conference in November. Registration begins at 3:30. STATE 4-H HORSE SPEAKING CONTEST

Any 4-H members may participate. No pre-qualifying is needed, but you must register at the Extension office by mid-March. Cost is \$3 per entry. There are 5 divisions

Original individual formal speech

- **Original individual presentation**: either demonstration (step by step process) or illustrated talk on an idea or topic; both use visual aids.
- **Original team presentation**: either demonstration (step by step process) or illustrated talk on an idea or topic; both using visual aids.
- **Extempore speaking**: topic is selected at the event and participants have 25 minutes to prepare a 4-to 6-minute speech.
- NEW IN 2020: **Interpretive Reading** is the art of reading aloud from a printed page. The reading must be published works that are horse-related. They may be prose, poetry, short stories, play cuttings, narratives, book or review, or theatrical. You should NOT memorize; they are intended to be read from a page.

How strong is your 4-H family spirit?

The Illinois 4-H Foundation welcomes nominations for the 2020 4-H Family Spirit Award. The Illinois 4-H Family Spirit Award recognizes a family with at least three generations and at least 15 different family members (including in-laws) that have either been 4-H members, leaders, or volunteers with at least 100 cumulative years of 4-H membership or volunteerism represented within the family. Selection is based on the total number of family members with 4-H connections, the total number of years of 4-H involvement, the diversity of experiences and recognitions earned by the 4-H members, and the collective impact that family members have made as advocates of their county and state 4-H programs.
