If you need another copy of this, call 547-3711. For each scholarship, the recipient must be a current Fulton County 4-H member; must also be an achievement member; and must actively participate in 4-H events. The application will include a place for the 4-H member to list accomplishments and career goals.

The scholarships will be given to seniors in high school; therefore, these scholarships can only be received once by individuals.

To receive a College Scholarship Application, contact the Fulton County Extension Office at 547-3711, or stop by. The deadline for submitting an application is May 1, 2022.

Reminder of Horse Helmet Rule

Horse Members -- All 4-H members are required to wear a properly fitted ASTM or SEI standard F1163 (or above) certified equestrian helmet whenever mounted or driving at all 4-H horse and pony events, shows, activities, or practices. That means even when you are warming up at the show. Original tags must be present in all approved helmets. The 4-H member is responsible to see that this specified head gear is properly fitted with the approved harness fastened in place whenever mounted. Helmet policies apply to all county, area, and state 4-H horse and pony events, shows, and activities. It is recommended that all adults working with 4-H members model the desired youth behavior by also wearing protective helmets whenever mounted or driving. If cost is an issue, the 4-H Horse Committee will help you find a helmet that is affordable. Please call 309-547-3711.

* 4-H program fees are paid annually and cover involvement in all 4-H clubs. Shooting Sports supply fees are paid for each discipline and each spring/fall session.

Mandatory Safety Meeting – **April 6, 6:30 p.m**. at U of I Extension office in Lewistown. Those who attended a Safety meeting in a previous session <u>for the same discipline</u> are not required to attend. If you are enrolling in a new discipline this session, you must attend the Safety meeting.

How to register – Enrollment packets will be available at: <u>https://go.illinois.edu/FultonShootingSports</u> or you may call to have one mailed to you (547-3711), or pick one up in person at the U of I Extension office in Lewistown. You may not enroll online for this; signed forms and payment are required.

Deadline to register – Space is limited and filled on first come, first served basis. Final deadline is April 5. You may sign up for multiple disciplines, as long as they are not at the same time. Payment and all signed forms must be submitted to reserve a spot. If you need assistance with the fee, contact the Extension office at 547-3711.

All firearms are provided. The only participants who are allowed to bring their own are the advanced members who have permission from the instructors.

Participants will be given eye and ear protection, which they will be responsible for bringing each time to use. If weather causes cancellations, additional dates will be set.

Weighing and Tattooing Sheep and Meat Goat Wethers

Sheep Market Wethers & Market Ewe Lambs: Live

Show Wethers – Nomination format —

Lambed on or after January 1, 2022

Ownership Date – May 15, 2022

Self-nomination as follows: Nominations must be signed by local Extension staff.

Exhibitors fill out and send in nomination form with photo of lamb's ear with scrapie tag installed in ear (close up photo of ear so scrapie tag can be read). This must be completed between March 15 and May 15, 2022.

Extension Office will mail for you to Dan Jennings. Junior and Open Premiere Wether and Ewe lambs: -Weigh-in, tattoo, and nomination procedures:

Starting this year ewe lambs (females) will be eligible for the Premiere show.

Lambed on or after January 1, 2022.

Junior and open premiere lambs will be nominated, tattooed, and weighed at the county level by Extension staff, using designated tattoo. Call 547-3711 to make an appointment.

Completed nomination forms must be signed by local Extension staff, who will send to Dan Jennings for you. This must be completed between March 15 and May 15, 2022.

Meat Goat Wethers: Live Show Wethers – **Nomination** format —

Wethers - Born on or after October 1, 2021

Ownership dates for Kids & Yearlings not in milk – May 15, 2022

Self-nomination as follows: Nominations must be signed by local Extension office.

Exhibitors fill out and send in nomination form with photo of goat's ear with scrapie tag installed in ear (close up photo of ear so scrapie tag can be read). This must be completed between March 15 and May 15, 2022. The Extension Office will mail for you to Dan Jennings.

Barrow Tattooing and Weigh-Ins

Rules For Barrows —

To be eligible for the County Rate-of-Gain Contest or the Illinois State Fair Premiere Contest, your barrow(s) must be weighed and tattooed before they are 35 days old. All pigs must be tattooed by April 15, 2022. Tattooing of barrows is done at the Extension Office, **by appointment only**, and must be done by the deadlines listed. Call 547-3711 to schedule an appointment.

You only have to do this if you are showing in the Rate of Gain class at the Fulton County Fair, or if you are showing Premiere at State Fair.

For State Fair, all barrows must have been farrowed on or after January 1, 2022. For State Fair Premiere Barrows and County Rate of Gain Contest, the farrowing date is on or after February 10, 2022.

Barrows must be castrated and ear-notched prior to tattooing. Both purebred and crossbred pigs are eligible. Each exhibitor may nominate a maximum of 25 barrows at the time of tattooing. Pigs cannot weigh more than the equivalent of 1.0 pounds per day of age when tattooed.

Please read the rules and deadlines carefully, and check the age and weight per day of age to determine when you may need to have your barrows weighed and tattooed.

Leader News

4-H Program Fees

Again this year, there is a \$20 per member 4-H Program Fee. There is a family (household) cap of \$60, meaning that a family (household) will only pay \$60 at the most, regardless of how many children are members.

4-H key leaders will receive a statement shortly after May 1, listing their members and the amount due. The payment from the club will be due June 1.

It is very important that the due date of June 1 is honored. There is a fee waiver form for families to submit if they cannot afford to pay the fee. No one will be denied membership because of inability to pay. Some 4-H clubs that have larger treasuries may decide to pay the fees (or a portion) from the club treasury. Some 4-H clubs may receive a donation from a local business that could help pay the fees. Some 4-H clubs will opt to collect it from individual families. Some 4-H clubs may decide to have fundraisers to raise these funds. It is up to the individual 4-H clubs how they want to handle the collection of the fees. It is up to the clubs whether they collect the fee now or later, but it must be turned in to the Extension Office no later than June 1st.
