If you do not have one of these new 4-H Show Books yet, please contact your 4-H leader or the Extension office. PLEASE discard old 4-H Show **Books** so there is no confusion in knowing what to exhibit for your projects; there are several changes this year. Along with the show book, there is a Fulton 4-H Show Registration form for you to register all 4-H projects you are showing this year. 4-H Show Registration entries are due to the **Extension office by July 1.** The new 4-H Show Book and Registration form can also be found at this link extension.illinois.edu/fmpt/4-h-fulton-county

4-H General Show Day, July 9

The 4-H General Show will be held on **Saturday**, **July 9**, at Cuba Junior-Senior High School, 20325 North IL Route 97, Cuba (south of Cuba). We will be using the gym and lobby. All entry tags will be at the check-in table; no entry tags will be mailed to you this year. If you cannot be with your project at General Show Day, you may have someone else bring it. If so, it is encouraged that you write a paragraph and attach it to your project. Tell how you did your project, and what you learned from completing it.

If you are a person who needs a reasonable accommodation to participate in any listed events, contact the Extension office.

Dog Obedience School Offered

University of Illinois Extension in Fulton County and Dog Training by Danette will offer a Dog Obedience School for both youth and adult owners and their dogs.

The sessions will begin on June 1 at 6:30 p.m. at the Fulton County Fairgrounds in Lewistown. The four sessions will be instructed by Danette Phelps of Plymouth, and will be held on Wednesdays, June 1, 8, 15, and 22.

A registration fee (\$30 for youth 8-18, \$55 for adults) payable to the instructor, will cover the four weeks of training. To participate, registration and payment are due to the Extension office by May 31. Please make checks payable to Danette Phelps. Call the Extension office to receive a registration form or stop by their office in the Farm Bureau Building. The form and information can also be found online at go.illinois.edu/FultonDogTraining. The Dog Obedience School will be canceled if not enough registrations are received.

Participating dogs must be at least six months of age, and have up to date shots, including an immunization for Parvo Virus. You must submit a copy of the rabies slip with the registration form. Participants must bring a choke chain collar and a six-foot leather lead strap. The trainer must be able

to control his or her own dog, and only one handler per dog can participate in this four-week session. Any dogs that are a danger to others are not allowed, regardless of the breed.



Master Showmanship Contest

Fulton County 4-H has the privilege of sending a representative to the Master Showmanship Contest held at the Illinois State Fair. The County Competition will be held on Tuesday of the Fulton County Fair, July 26, time to be announced later. Only those entered by July 1 on the official form will be allowed to participate. Entrants must be Fulton County 4-H members who are at least 14 years old by July 26, 2022. Entrants must provide his or her own livestock for the competition. Entrants must own OR borrow each: a steer or heifer; a market or breeding lamb; and a market hog or breeding gilt.

We will award prizes for first and second places in the County Competition, plus participation awards. The winner of the County Competition will go on to participate in the State Fair Event.

YQCA and Quality Assurance Important Animal Project Information

Beef, Sheep, Swine, Goat, and Dairy Cattle (if showing live animals)

Statewide requirement is that members in these projects must complete YQCA – Youth for the Quality Care of Animals. Must be done every year they are in the project, to be able to show and be 4-H premium-eligible. Also, State Fair entries will not be approved without this.

Youth may attend a one hour, in-person training presented by Extension staff. YQCA Training Dates are as follows — **Sign up at** <u>yqcaprogram.org</u> May 21 11 a.m. Extension Office in Lewistown May 26 6:30 p.m. Extension Office in Lewistown

- Pre-registration online is **required**. You may not just show up.
- \$3 per person online payment ahead of time is required. You cannot pay by check or cash, it must be done online.

Youth may also take training online individually. Cost for this is \$12 per person at yqcaprogram.org

Cat, Dog, Horse, Poultry, and Rabbits

If a 4-H member is enrolled in Cat, Dog, Horse, Poultry, or Rabbits – They are required to complete Quality Assurance and Ethics training, **one time during their 4-H years**. https://web.extension.illinois.edu/qaec/

Animal Science Posters or Displays at 4-H General Show

If a 4-H member is showing a poster or other display (not a live animal) at 4-H General Show, they do NOT have to do any type of ethics training. They can do it if they want to, it is still a good learning experience!

Summer 4-H Show News

In the front of your 4-H Show Book is a copy of our 4-H Show Schedule for this year. Please review the Important Updates (blue sheet) included with your copy of the 2022 Fulton County Show Book. Following are some changes that are listed on the update sheet:

- Performing Arts Show no separate show this year. Members who were planning to participate in the Performing Arts show are encouraged to exhibit a Theater Arts project at the General Show. This exhibit class allows for members to use their creativity to incorporate their performing arts into the portfolio exhibit.
- Clothing and Textiles Judging combined with General Show, 10 a.m. judging start time.
- Pet Show exhibit opportunity moved to Animal Sciences classes at the General Show (no live animals).

As a reminder, the 4-H Show Registration Form is due at the Extension office by July 1. Please list all your projects with the selected exhibit classes on the green 4-H Show Registration Form. These forms can be obtained from your club leader, the Extension office, or found on our website

Fulton County Fair Books Available in June

The 4-H Livestock Shows are held in conjunction with the Fulton County Fair. County Fair Books will be available at the Extension Office sometime in June. To enter livestock in the County Fair, you must complete the entry blank found in the back of the fair book and turn it and the appropriate fees into the Extension Office by July 1.

Do NOT send them to the Fair Office. We process the 4-H entries here first, then we take them to the Fair Office.

If you are going to complete a non-livestock project for the 4-H Show, you are encouraged to also enter it in the County Fair Junior Show. Just pick up a Fair Book, and check all rules, procedures, and entry deadline. Showing your non-livestock 4-H project in the County Fair does not qualify you for a 4-H premium. You must show in the 4-H Show to receive a 4-H premium.

Important Notice for Livestock Exhibitors

If you are showing livestock at the Fulton County Fair, you are required to show health papers in the exhibitor's name (not just a family farm name) as you arrive at the fair with your animals, and the animals will also be physically inspected. You will not be allowed to unload until you do so. If you have forgotten your papers at home, you will not be allowed to unload. For those animals that are not required to have health papers, a physical inspection of the animals will be done by the superintendent and/or fair personnel before you unload your animals. Any animal showing signs of sickness will not be allowed to unload.

You will need to refer to the Fulton County Fair Book to see the specific times for each species' arrival.

4-H Poultry Exhibitors

IDOA has filed for emergency rule prohibiting the sale or exhibition of poultry and poultry products at Illinois events, including fair exhibitions, to prevent the spread of avian influenza. These rules will be assessed in 45-day increments and will stay in effect for up to 150 days. This would apply to 4-H shows, live animal workshops and exhibit opportunities. If live exhibitions cannot happen, your local Extension office will provide more details regarding optional exhibition opportunities.

Crop Scouting Competition


Aug 4, 2022 - Crop Sciences Research & Education Center, 4202 South 1st St., Savoy, IL 61874
