ZSuite **Enrollment**

Enrollment has begun in the new Illinois 4-H enrollment and registration system. Thank you to those who have already enrolled in ZSuite. Please enroll and

submit your program fee payment by November 30th to receive the "early-bird" registration fee of \$15 per youth. Now is the time to invite new members to join 4-H! Please check with your club leader if you have questions about payment of the program fee. After November 30th, the program fee reverts to \$20 per youth, so register soon to save 25%!

4-H Enrollment Deadlines

The following projects have a January 3, 2023, deadline. All other project enrollments and changes are due May 1, 2023. To be eligible to exhibit at the 2023 4-H Shows enrollment deadlines must be met.

Beef (for production animals)

Dairy (for production animals)

Goat (for production animals)

Horse (for production animals)

Poultry (egg production)

Sheep (for production animals)

Swine (for production animals)

Basically, any livestock project where production is the main focus needs to be enrolled in by early January each year.

Be aware that a young person may join 4-H at any time of the year, but to show at the 4-H Shows, the above deadlines are in place.

Livestock Ownership Dates: 4-H Show & State Fair

Listed below are the **tentative** dates by which animals must be owned **and personally cared for by the exhibitor** to be shown at the County 4-H Shows and State Fair.

BEEF

Steers - February 1, 2023 (calved on or after 1/1/22)

Cows - January 1, 2023 (born before 9/1/21) Heifers - June 1, 2023 (State Fair — birthdates from 9/1/21 to 3/31/23; County Fair — birthdates from 9/1/21 to 3/1/23)

DAIRY

Calves and Heifers - June 1, 2023 Cows - January 1, 2023

DAIRY GOATS

Kids and Yearlings not in milk - June 1, 2023 Milking Does - January 1, 2023

MEAT GOATS

All meat goats — May 15, 2023 Wethers—Must be registered and tattooed in the name of the exhibitor only by May 15, 2023 (must be born on or after October 1, 2022)

POULTRY AND RABBITS

June 1, 2023 (or out of stock owned prior to June 1) <u>HORSES</u> — Ownership and/or lease forms must be on file with the Extension Office by May 1 each year.



Insurance Coverage Statement

Liability Insurance: The University of Illinois has liability coverage for screened and enrolled adult 4-H volunteers at 4-H activities and programs.

Accident Insurance: Through the 4-H program fee paid by members, accident insurance coverage is provided for enrolled 4-H members, for accidents at 4-H club meetings or county events which are Extension-sponsored and supervised.

SHEEP

Breeding Sheep - June 1, 2023

(Yearling Ewes = birthdates 1/1/22-8/31/22)

(Ewe lambs = birthdates 9/1/22 and after)

(Ram lambs = birthdates after 1/1/23)
State Fair Wethers May 15, 2023 (lam

State Fair Wethers - May 15, 2023 (lambed on or after 1/1/23) (County Fair — ownership by June 1, 2023).

SWINE

May 1, 2023 (for County Fair) June 1, 2023 (for State Fair)

State Fair and County Fair gilts must be farrowed on or after 1/1/23.

For State Fair, all barrows must have been farrowed on or after January 1, 2023 and must be the property of the exhibitor since June 1, 2023. Premier barrows must have been farrowed on or after February 10, 2023.

For County Fair Rate of Gain, barrows must have been farrowed on or after February 10, 2023 (or on or after January 15, 2023, if not Rate of Gain).

Note that these are ownership, not enrollment deadlines. Livestock enrollment deadlines, in most cases, are prior to the ownership deadlines.




Illinois 4-H History Project
