


New 4-H Year Begins September 1!

- Give a talk or demonstration to civic organizations about what 4-H has to offer.
- Plan a member recruitment drive for your club; distribute fliers about 4-H to area schools.

4-H Promotional Display Guidelines

- 1. Entries (call or email) are due to the Extension office by October 14.
- 2. Displays must be in place by noon on Monday, October 17, and remain in the window until 5 p.m. on Friday, October 21.
- 3. Displays will be given ratings based on the same criteria as used in the past. Copy available at the office. Make sure 4-H is clearly shown on the display.

KEY LEADERS: Call or email to inform us of your 4-H Week plans. Recognition will be given to all clubs that participate in some activity during the week (and notify us).

Robyn Hendel Inducted into the 4-H Hall of Fame

Each year, the Illinois 4-H Foundation honors extraordinary members of our 4-H family by inducting them into the Illinois 4-H Hall of Fame. The Illinois 4-H Hall of

Fame recognizes 4-H volunteers that have a track record of exemplary service to 4-H for outstanding career and community achievement and are nominated by either county University of Illinois Extension staff or by the Illinois 4-H Foundation Board. The 2022 Fulton County inductee to the 4-H Hall of Fame is Robyn Hendel. Robyn is the leader of the Fulton County 4-H Livestock Judging Team. This club was started in late 2014 and Robyn has been instrumental in teaching 4-H members how to analyze different classes of animals. Robyn works tirelessly with these Junior and Senior team members practicing at different farms, the Fairview Sale Barn, and numerous Livestock Judging Contests around the state. Robyn and her team competed in June at the State 4-H Livestock Judging Contest in Champaign. The Fulton County 4-H Junior Team came home with the honor of first place!


