### 4-H Federation Meeting

Fulton County 4-H Federation met on February 23rd at the Extension Office. After their business meeting, they worked on a community service project. Operation Santa is an organization that sends Christmas stockings filled with much-needed items to all branches of the military who are stationed overseas. Each year they send thousands of filled stockings in time to reach the troops by Christmas. The organization needs three things, in preparation for this year's stockings — stockings made from their pattern, cards and letters to go in the stockings, and money for postage. A group of 11 4-H Federation members and adults did the ironing, trimming, and sewing of the stockings, and also wrote messages in Christmas cards. These 37 stockings and 36 cards have been sent to the Operation Santa headquarters.

### **4-H Enrollments**

Check with your leader to make sure you are enrolled in the right projects — You cannot exhibit something you are not enrolled in.

May 1, 2020 is the deadline for making changes (except for those production livestock projects which had a January deadline — see the November/
December 4-H Newsletter). Young persons may join 4-H at any time of the year, but to show at the 4-H Shows, they must be enrolled in their projects at the Extension Office by May 1st of each year.

Many projects will have requirement changes, as there have been changes in State Fair requirements, on which we base ours. # YQCA and Quality Assurance — Important Animal Project Information

### Beef, Sheep, Swine, Goat, and Dairy Cattle (if showing live animals)

New statewide requirement is that members in these projects must complete **YQCA** – **Youth for the Quality Care of Animals.** 

Must be done every year they are in the project. There are options –

# **Fulton County 4-H Offers College Scholarships**

Fulton County 4-H offers college scholarships to Fulton County 4-H members who are graduating this spring. Complete information was in the January/February 4-H Newsletter. If you need another copy of this, call 547-3711.

For each scholarship, the recipient must be a current Fulton County 4-H member; must also be an achievement member; and must actively participate in 4-H events. The application will include a place for the 4-H member to list accomplishments and career goals.

The scholarships will be given to seniors in high school; therefore, these scholarships can only be received once by individuals.

To receive a 4-H Federation College Scholarship Application, contact the Fulton County Extension Office at 547-3711, or stop by. The deadline for submitting an application is May 1, 2020.

### What Is an Achievement Member?

A 4-H Achievement Member is one who does what is expected of an active 4-H member —

- Attend 2/3 of the club meetings after joining. Leaders may authorize excused absences.
- Give a talk or demonstration, or exhibit a project.
- Turn in some kind of paperwork can be record (planning) sheet, 4-H award application, or completed project manual.

This information is in the 4-H Show Book. Most 4-H members do more than this.

### **International Hosting**

Host a Japanese or Korean youth this summer through States' 4-H International! Expand your family's cultural understanding, learn about new foods and customs, and possibly learn a new language, all while sharing your own. Your children will build lifelong friendships and will gain new perspectives on their own country, too! Families are needed for July 22 through August 17.

Families hosting a youth must have a child the same gender and approximate age (12-18) as the incoming youth. Youth must have a separate bed; a separate room is not required. Host family selection is dependent on completion of an application and screening process, as well as student availability and personality compatibility. ### **Barrow Tattooing and Weigh-Ins Rules For Barrows**—

To be eligible for the County Rate-of-Gain Contest or the Illinois State Fair Premiere Contest, your barrow(s) must be weighed and tattooed before they are 35 days old. All pigs must be tattooed by April 15, 2020. Tattooing of barrows is done at the Extension Office, by appointment only, and must be done by the deadlines listed. Call 547-3711 to schedule an appointment.

# You only have to do this if you are showing in the Rate of Gain class at the Fulton County Fair, or if you are showing Premiere at State Fair.

For State Fair, all barrows must have been farrowed on or after January 1, 2020. For State Fair Premiere Barrows and County Rate of Gain Contest, the farrowing date is on or after February 10, 2020.

Barrows must be castrated and ear-notched prior to tattooing. Both purebred and crossbred pigs are eligible. Each exhibitor may nominate a maximum of 25 barrows at the time of tattooing. Pigs cannot weigh more than the equivalent of 1.0 pounds per day of age when tattooed.

Please read the rules and deadlines carefully, and check the age and weight per day of age to determine when you may need to have your barrows weighed and tattooed.

### 4-H Livestock Judging Contest, April 4

The 4-H Livestock Judging Contest will be Saturday, **April 4**, at the WIU Livestock Pavilion, located at the intersection of N. Wigwam Hollow Road and Tower Road, Macomb (near the WIU golf course).

### The cost is \$5.00 per person, payable at the contest.

This contest is open to 4-H members only. Junior division is for those under 14 as of 1/1/20. Senior division is for those 14 and older as of 1/1/20.

Check-in will begin at 8:00 a.m. The contest will begin at 9 a.m. Each contestant should provide their own pencil, clip board, and paper for notes. Fulton County 4-H members who score the highest at this event will be invited to attend the State Judging Contest on June 15.

This event is sponsored by Illinois Extension in McDonough County and by the WIU Intercollegiate Livestock Judging Team.

# **Livestock Registration and Health Papers**

If you have breeding stock that you want to show at a fair this summer, you must have registration papers. No joint ownership is allowed, and ownership must reflect appropriate deadlines. Livestock shows also require health papers on some animals. ### Reminder of Horse Helmet Rule

Horse Members -- All 4-H members are required to wear a properly fitted

ASTM or SEI standard F1163 (or above) certified equestrian helmet whenever mounted or driving AT all 4-H horse and pony events, shows, activities, or practices. THAT MEANS EVEN WHEN YOU ARE WARMING UP AT THE SHOW. Original tags must be present in all approved helmets. The 4-H member is responsible to see that this specified head gear is properly fitted with the approved harness fastened in place whenever mounted. Helmet policies apply to all county, area, and state 4-H horse and pony events, shows, and activities. It is recommended that all adults working with 4-H members model the desired youth behavior by also wearing protective helmets whenever mounted or driving. If cost is an issue, the 4-H Horse Committee will help you find a helmet that is affordable. Call 547-3711.

### 4-H Fish Camp

With the lake fully stocked, 4-H Fish Camp is back at 4-H Memorial Camp near Monticello. Fishing begins at 10 a.m. Saturday, May 2, and lasts until 2 p.m. Sunday, May 3. Learn how to catch largemouth bass, crappie, bluegill, and channel catfish. Learn about fishing tips, lures, bait, equipment, knots, fish behavior, fish management, and fish cleaning. Each group registered will be assigned their own log cabin for lodging with single bunks. Participants must bring their own bedding and toiletries.

Fish Camp is open to any adult/child "team" interested in learning more about fishing. Each adult may attend camp with up to three youth campers. An adult must attend the entire weekend event with the youth campers. It is recommended that youth campers be at least eight years of age. A fee of \$50 per person covers the complete program, lodging, boat, bait, and three buffet meals, including Saturday lunch and supper and a Sunday brunch. You'll also have fresh fish fillets to take home! Pre-registration and payment are required. ### Weighing and Tattooing Sheep and Meat Goat Wethers

### **Sheep Market Wethers & Market Ewe Lambs:**

Live Show Wethers – Nomination format — Lambed on or after January 1, 2020 Ownership Date – May 15, 2020

Self-nomination as follows: Nominations must be signed by local Extension staff.

Exhibitors fill out and send in nomination form with photo of lamb's ear with scrapie tag installed in ear (close up photo of ear so scrapie tag can be read). This must be completed between March 15 and May 15, 2020. Extension Office will mail for you to Dan Jennings.

# Junior and Open Premiere Wether and Ewe lambs: - Weigh-in, tattoo, and nomination procedures:

Lambed on or after January 1, 2020. Junior and open premiere lambs will be nominated, tattooed, and weighed at the county level by Extension staff, using designated tattoo. Call 547-3711 to make an appointment.

Completed nomination forms must be signed by local Extension staff, who will send to Dan Jennings for you. This must be completed between March 15 and May 15, 2020.

### <u>Meat Goat Wethers:</u> Live Show Wethers – <u>Nomination format</u> —

Wethers – Born on or after October 1, 2019 Ownership dates for Kids & Yearlings not in milk – May 15, 2020

Self-nomination as follows: Nominations must be signed by local Extension office.

Exhibitors fill out and send in nomination form with photo of goat's ear with scrapie tag installed in ear (close up photo of ear so scrapie tag can be read). This must be completed between March 15 and May 15, 2020. Extension Office will mail for you to Dan Jennings.

The State 4-H Horse Bowl Contest will be held Sunday, April 19 at the Education Building on the U of I campus, beginning about 8 a.m. Cost is \$5 per entry or \$25 per team. ### We will <u>not</u> have parking passes or admission tickets available for sale.

### Non-Livestock —

Projects will be conference-judged. That means that if your non-livestock project **is selected** for State Fair, and you choose for it to go, you must go with it. That is called being a State Fair Delegate. Your project remains on display all day. You will bring it home that same day. If you cannot go, the opportunity is passed to an alternate.

To have your non-livestock project exhibited at State Fair, it must be selected as a State Fair Delegate at one of our 4-H Shows in 2020. 4-H members will be allowed to exhibit **only one** non-livestock project at State Fair, if selected to do so. However, they are also allowed to exhibit in the State 4-H Public Presentations Contest if they were selected in that project, too.

Our exhibit day for non-livestock projects at State Fair will be **Friday, August 14**.

# What is the Difference Between Best of Show and State Fair Delegate?

Every project or project area will have a Best of Show selected at our County 4-H Shows. In larger project areas, sometimes, a Best of Show is selected per unit.

However, State Fair tells us how many projects we can send there. Therefore, many more 4-Hers receive Best of Show honors than can go to State Fair. Just because you get a Best of Show, that does not automatically mean you can take your project to State Fair.

Plus, not every 4-H project has a category at State Fair. Over the years, State Fair has had to eliminate some projects from their list because of budget cuts. They eliminated the ones where there had been the lowest number of participants.

Our office will print off the sections that you need, if you are unable to access this information from your home. Entries (non-Horse) are due at the Fulton County Extension Office by June 29. State Junior Horse entries are due June 1.

Please see page 3 in this newsletter regarding the Youth for the Quality Care of Animals requirement. Your State Fair entry will not be approved and signed if you have not completed YOCA.

The State Junior Horse Show is July 26-August 2. Entries are due **June** 1.

All Illinois State Fair Junior exhibitors will need to pay entry fees for their animals entered. Fees will be due at the same time as entry forms, June 29th at the Extension Office (Horse deadline is June 1st). Fees are listed on the website.

#### **State Fair Junior Show age eligibility**

4-H members aged 8-18 as of September 1, 2019 are eligible to participate in the Illinois State Fair Junior Department, both livestock and non-livestock.

FFA members (who are not also in 4-H) up to 18 years of age as of September 1, 2019 are eligible to participate in the Illinois State Fair Junior Livestock Division. THESE ENTRIES MUST BE SIGNED BY FFA ADVISORS; THEY CANNOT BE SIGNED BY EXTENSION/4-H STAFF. Individuals **previously** enrolled as active members in Illinois 4-H and/or FFA programs and turning 19-20 years of age by September 1, 2019 may participate in the Junior Livestock Division of the Illinois State Fair only if they are active FFA members as verified by Illinois FFA and in accordance with one of the following program options:

Maintain active membership on the roster of their local high school FFA Chapter; Maintain active membership in a collegiate FFA Chapter in a post-secondary institution of higher education in the State of Illinois; or Maintain active membership in an Illinois FFA Alumni Chapter. FFA members 21 years of age prior to September 1, 2019 are ineligible to show in the Junior Livestock Division of the Illinois State Fair.

Deadline to register – April 14, or earlier if it becomes full. You may sign up for multiple disciplines, as long as they are not at the same time. Spots are filled on a first come, first served basis. Payment and all signed forms must be submitted to reserve a spot. If you need assistance with the fee, contact the Extension Office at 547-3711.

All firearms are provided. The only participants who are allowed to bring their own are the advanced members who have permission from the instructors.

Participants will be given eye and ear protection, which they will be responsible for bringing each time to use. If weather causes cancellations, additional dates will be set.

### **4-H Leader Notes**

### 4-H Program Fees

Again this year, there is a \$20 per member 4-H Program Fee. In our county, there is a family (household) cap of \$60, meaning that a family (household) will only pay \$60 at the most, regardless of how many children are members.

4-H key leaders will receive a statement shortly after May 1, listing their members and the amount due. The payment from the club will be due June 1.

It is very important that the due date of June 1 is honored. There is a fee waiver form for families to submit if they cannot afford to pay the fee. No one will be denied membership because of inability to pay.

Some 4-H clubs that have larger treasuries may decide to pay the fees (or a portion) from the club treasury. Some 4-H clubs may receive a donation from a local business that could help pay the fees. Some 4-H clubs will opt to collect it from individual families. Some 4-H clubs may decide to have fundraisers to raise these funds. It is up to the individual 4-H clubs how they want to handle the collection of the fees. It is up to the clubs whether they collect the fee now or later, but it must be turned in to the Extension Office no later than June 1st.

### **Count Them All**

Please make sure that ALL 4-H-age youth who attend your 4-H club meetings are enrolled. This provides them with accident insurance at the meetings and legal parental permission to be there. This is important! Please check the lists we send you, or ask Janis to be able to see the lists online.

# **Treasurer and Secretary Book Printouts**

At the end of the 4-H year, you **must** turn in your club's 4-H Treasurer's record book (unless you do not have a treasury) <u>and</u> the 4-H Secretary's book to the Extension Office. This is required by the state. <u>Please periodically check</u> with your treasurer and secretary, to be sure they are keeping track of and working on the book on their computer. These MUST be turned in. There are IRS and other rules that mandate this, and it is <u>not</u> optional. Due date is September 30.

# Required Training For All New 4-H Leaders/Volunteers —

ANCRA (Abused and Neglected Child Reporting Act) training is required of all NEW 4-H and Extension volunteers. To become a 4-H volunteer, this training must be completed, and a form signed and submitted to our office.

This training is available only online. You may take it at home (or at our office by appointment), but you <u>must</u> follow up by printing out and signing a *Protection of Minors Acknowledgement Form* and bringing it to our office (or mail, fax, or send as an email attachment). You are not shown as complete until you do the training and submit the form to us.
