Public Speaking Contest & Performing Arts Show

The Public Speaking Contest will be held on Saturday, March 23, 2024, starting promptly at 10 a.m. at the Checkrow Community Church, located at 3564 E Checkrow Rd., Avon, IL. Doors will open at 9:30 a.m. The project enrollment deadline in ZSuite for Public Speaking is March 1. The Performing Arts Show will be held immediately after the Public Speaking Contest. Those members enrolled in Theater Arts 1, 2, and 3 are invited to perform at this show.

Members enrolled in Theater Arts project may exhibit at the Performing Arts Show by presenting a vocal or instrumental number, dance, dramatic skit, or other type of entertainment. Each performance should be no more than seven minutes long. A piano will be provided. If other equipment is needed, the member must provide it. If the performance requires an accompanist, the member must provide the person, who can be any age. No State Fair Delegates will be selected from those who choose this exhibit option. State Fair Delegates and Alternates will be selected from Theater Arts exhibits at the 4-H General Show on June 22, 2024. Please invite your family and friends to attend both contests!

*4-H program fees are paid annually and cover involvement in all 4-H clubs. Shooting Sports supply fees are paid for each discipline and each spring/fall session. 4-H Program Fees paid to University of Illinois. Supply Fees paid to Fulton 4-H Shooting Sports club.

Mandatory Safety Meeting – April 3, 6:30 p.m. at U of I Extension office in Lewistown. Those who attended a Safety meeting in a previous session for the same discipline are not required to attend. If you are enrolling in a new discipline this session, you must attend the Safety meeting.

How to register – Enrollment packets will be available on our website, or you can contact the office.

Payment and all signed forms must be submitted to reserve a spot. Additionally, youth will need to be enrolled in ZSuite at <u>4h.zsuite.org</u>. Fee waivers are available upon request.

Deadline to register – Space is limited and filled on first come, first served basis. Final deadline is April 2. You may sign up for multiple disciplines, as long as they are not at the same time.

All firearms are provided. The only participants who are allowed to bring their own are the advanced members who have permission from the instructors. Participants will be given eye and ear protection, which they will be responsible for bringing each time to use. If weather causes cancellations, additional dates will be set. Instructor Lonnie Van Pelt is willing to visit your 4-H club to share more about 4-H Shooting Sports.

Livestock

Beef Weigh -In

If you want your steer(s) to be eligible for the County Rate of Gain Contest, the Illinois State Fair Junior Show, or the Illinois State Fair Premiere Contest, you must bring your steer(s) to be weighed and tattooed on the following date:

Saturday, February 10, 2024 — At the Fairview Sale Barn, from 8-10 a.m. (arrival times).

This will be the only steer weigh-in this year in Fulton County.

Please arrive during the 2-hour time block listed. Letters were sent to all Fulton County 4-H members enrolled in the beef project with complete details. Contact the office to RSVP and reserve your spot.

In the event of extremely severe weather, those who registered will be notified directly and a notice will be posted on the Fulton County 4-H Facebook group.

Steers must be castrated prior to tattooing. If possible, exhibitors should be present during tattooing. Electronic ear tags will also be used.

If you are only weighing in the steer(s) for County Rate of Gain purposes, you don't have to get the tag, but without the tag, your animal will NOT be eligible to go to State Fair Junior Show — and you CANNOT get the tag later.

Each livestock member may nominate up to 10 steers for the State Fair Open and Junior Premiere Classes. Junior Premiere Steers are eligible for the Open Premiere Class, if they are properly entered at the time that State Fair Open entries are made.

To qualify, carcasses must grade at least low select, have a yield grade lower than 4.0, and weigh 950 pounds or less.

To qualify for State Fair, calves must have been born on or after Jan. 1, 2023. They must be owned and personally cared for by the exhibitor by Feb. 1, 2024.



Barrow Weigh-In and Tattooing

To be eligible for the Fulton County Fair Rate-of-Gain class or the Illinois State Fair Premiere (carcass) class, your barrow(s) must be weighed and tattooed before they are 35 days old. All pigs must be tattooed by April 15, 2024. Tattooing of barrows is done at the Extension office, by appointment only, and must be done by the deadlines listed. Call 547-3711 to schedule an appointment.

For State Fair, all barrows must have been farrowed on or after Jan. 1, 2024 and must be the property of the exhibitor by June 1, 2024. For State Fair Premiere Barrows and County Rate-of-Gain class, the farrowing date is on or after Feb. 10, 2024, and must be the property of the exhibitor by June 1, 2024.

Barrows must be castrated and ear-notched prior to tattooing.

Both purebred and crossbred barrows are eligible. Each exhibitor may nominate a maximum of 25 barrows at the time of tattooing. Barrow cannot weigh more than the equivalent of 1.0 pounds per day of age when tattooed. Please read the rules and deadlines carefully and check the age and weight per day of age to determine when you may need to have your barrows weighed and tattooed.

Livestock

Sheep Market Wethers & Market Ewe Lambs

Rules for live show Wethers

Must be lambed on or after Jan. 1, 2024 and owned and personally cared for by the exhibitor by May 15, 2024. Self- nomination as follows: Nominations must be signed by local Extension office. Exhibitors fill out and send in nomination form with photo of lamb's ear with scrapie tag installed in ear (close up photo of ear so scrapie tag can be read). This must be completed between March 15 and May 15, 2024.

Jr. & Open Premiere Wether & Ewe lambs Rules

Junior and open premiere lambs will be nominated, tattooed, and weighed at the county level. Premiere lambs must be weighed and tattooed and witnessed by Fulton Extension staff, who will sign the form and send it to the Illinois 4-H office. Ownership and nomination deadline is March 15 to May 15, 2024. Must be lambed on or after January 1, 2024.

Meat Goat Wethers – Live show Wethers

Wethers born on or after October 1, 2023. Ownership dates for Kids & Yearlings not in milk is May 15, 2024. Self-nominations must be signed by the Extension office. Exhibitors fill out and send in nomination form with a photo goat's ear with scrapie tag installed in ear (close up photo of ear so scrapie tag can be read). This must by completed between March 15 and May 15, 2024. Extension office will mail completed forms and photos to Illinois 4-H office.

Exhibitors and their families should read complete rules and regulations included in the 2023 Illinois State Fair Junior Department Premium book once it is posted on the ISF website: www.illinoisstatefair.info/

YQCA

Beef, Sheep, Swine, Goat, and Dairy Cattle (if showing live animals)

Statewide requirement is that members in these projects must complete YQCA – Youth for the Quality Care of Animals. Must be done every year they are in the project, to be able to show and be 4-H premiumeligible. Also, State Fair entries will not be approved without this. There are options for youth to attend a one hour, in-person training presented by Extension staff, or youth may take online training individually.

Quality Assurance and Ethics Training

4-H members are required to take this online training when they sign up for horse, dog, cats, rabbits, and poultry projects. You only need to take it once in your lifetime. This requirement MUST be completed prior to exhibiting the project at county 4-H shows and fairs. NOTE: Youth must be logged on to a computer for this program, either a desktop or laptop; not an iPad or iPhone. This rule applies to 4-H members who exhibit live animals AND poster exhibits.

Livestock Ownership Dates

Listed below are the dates by which animals must be owned and personally cared for by the exhibitor to be shown at the County 4-H Shows and State Fair.

BEEF

- Steers February 1, 2024 (calved on or after 1/1/23)
- Cows January 1, 2024 (born before 9/1/22)
- Heifers June 1, 2023 (State Fair birthdates from 9/1/22 to 3/31/24; County Fair birthdates from 9/1/22 to 3/1/24)

DAIRY

- Calves and Heifers June 1, 2024
- Cows January 1, 2024

DAIRY GOATS

- Kids and Yearlings not in milk June 1, 2024
- Milking Does January 1, 2024

MEAT GOATS

- All meat goats May 15, 2024
- Wethers—Must be registered and tattooed in the
- name of the exhibitor only by May 15, 2024 (must
- be born on or after October 1, 2023)

POULTRY AND RABBITS

• June 1, 2024 (or out of stock owned prior to June 1)

HORSES — Ownership and/or lease forms must be on file with the Extension Office by May 1st each year.

• Ownership, Lease papers, photos, and Entries are to be sent in together directly to: Stephanie Hardy at the Illinois State Fair by June 1 for verification of State Fair entries.

SHEEP

- Breeding Sheep June 1, 2024
- (Yearling Ewes = birthdates 1/1/23-8/31/23)
- (Ewe lambs = birthdates 9/1/23 and after)
- (Ram lambs = birthdates after 1/1/24)
- State Fair Wethers May 15, 2024 (lambed on or after 1/1/24) (County Fair ownership by June 1, 2024).

SWINE

- May 1, 2024 (for County Fair)
- June 1, 2024 (for State Fair)
- State Fair and County Fair gilts must be farrowed on or after 1/1/24.
- For State Fair, all barrows must have been farrowed on or after January 1, 2024 and must be the property of the exhibitor since June 1, 2024. Premier barrows must have been farrowed on or after February 10, 2024.
- For County Fair Rate of Gain, barrows must have been farrowed on or after February 10, 2024 (or on or after January 15, 2024, if not Rate of Gain).

Note that these are ownership, not enrollment deadlines. Livestock enrollment deadlines, in most cases, are prior to the ownership deadlines.
