## **4-H Federation Meeting**

Fulton County 4-H Federation met on February 24th at the Extension Office. After their business meeting, they worked on a community service project. Operation Santa is an organization that sends Christmas stockings filled with much-needed items to all branches of the military who are stationed overseas. Each year they send thousands of filled stockings in time to reach the troops by Christmas. The organization needs three things, in preparation for this year's stockings — stockings made from their pattern, cards and letters to go in the stockings, and money for postage. A group of 19 4-H Federation members and adults did the ironing, trimming, and sewing of the stockings, and also wrote messages in Christmas cards. ## **4-H Enrollments**

May 1, 2019 is the deadline for making changes (except for those production livestock projects which had a January deadline — see the November/ December 4-H Newsletter). Young persons may join 4-H at any time of the year, but to show at the 4-H Shows, they must be enrolled in their projects at the Extension Office by May 1st of each year.

Many projects will have requirement changes, as there have been many changes in State Fair requirements, on which we base ours. # **Public Presentations Judging**

For those enrolled in the 4-H Public Presentations project, the judging this year will be Saturday, May 4th, at 10 a.m., at the Extension Office in Lewistown. If you wish to participate, and are not yet enrolled in that project, you have until May 1 to add it as a project. Call 547-3711 to do so.

Categories are Formal Speech, Illustrated Speech, Original Works, and Oral Interpretation. All presentations must be four to eight minutes in length. More information will be found in the 4-H Show Book. Call the Extension Office at 547-3711 if you would like a copy of the score sheet for a certain category.

This earlier date will allow Fulton County 4-H to enter 4-H members in the statewide contest, which will be held in June in Decatur. More information will be given to those chosen to go on to the state contest.

### What Is an Achievement Member?

A 4-H Achievement Member is one who does what is expected of an active 4-H member —

- Attend 2/3 of the club meetings after joining. Leaders may authorize excused absences.
- Give a talk or demonstration, or exhibit a project.
- Turn in some kind of paperwork can be record (planning) sheet, 4-H award application, or completed project manual.

This information is in the 4-H Show Book. Most 4-H members do more than this.

## **Fulton County 4-H Offers College Scholarships**

Fulton County 4-H announces college scholarships being offered to Fulton County 4-H members. Complete information was in the January/February 4-H Newsletter.

For each scholarship, the recipient must be a current Fulton County 4-H member; must also be an achievement member; and must actively participate in 4-H events. The application will include a place for the 4-H member to list accomplishments and career goals.

The scholarships will be given to seniors in high school; therefore, these scholarships can only be received once by individuals.

## *Speaking for Illinois 4-H* Training

Teens have an opportunity this spring to be trained as an Illinois 4-H spokesperson through the *Speaking for Illinois 4-H* program. Speaking for Illinois 4-H training is open to 4-H members who are 14 and older. The all-day training will be on Saturday, April 27, at the Logan County Extension Office in Lincoln. This will prepare teens to support our local 4-H program by soliciting donors, speaking to community groups, and updating county boards or other community governing bodies about local 4-H impact. On a state level, those attending a training can register for 4-H Legislative Connection events at the State Capitol where they will tell their story to Illinois legislators. The registration cost is \$12.

# Illini Summer Academies

Spend seven days and six nights on the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign campus for the 4-H Illini Summer Academies. Registration is open at <u>go.illinois.edu/illini4H</u>. Check in is at 3 p.m. Sunday, June 23. The conference ends the morning of Saturday, June 29.

The conference is open to youth who will have completed 8<sup>th</sup> thru 12<sup>th</sup> grade by the time of the conference, and will be at least 14 years old before the end of 2019. Cost varies based on the Academy section you choose, and varies from \$240 to \$465. A limited number of scholarships are available.

# **Barrow Tattooing and Weigh-Ins**

#### Rules For Barrows —

To be eligible for the County Rate-of-Gain Contest or the Illinois State Fair Premiere Contest, your barrow(s) must be weighed and tattooed before they are 35 days old. All pigs must be tattooed by April 15, 2019. Tattooing of barrows is done at the Extension Office, **by appointment only**, and must be done by the deadlines listed. Call 547-3711 to schedule an appointment.

#### You only have to do this if you are showing in the Rate of Gain class at the Fulton County Fair, or if you are showing Premiere at State Fair.

For State Fair, all barrows must have been farrowed on or after January 1, 2019 (date change this year). For State Fair Premiere Barrows and County Rate of Gain Contest, the farrowing date is on or after February 10, 2019.

Barrows must be castrated and ear-notched prior to tattooing. Both purebred and crossbred pigs are eligible. Each exhibitor may nominate a maximum of 25 barrows at the time of tattooing. Pigs cannot weigh more than the equivalent of 1.0 pounds per day of age when tattooed.

Please read the rules and deadlines carefully, and check the age and weight per day of age to determine when you may need to have your barrows weighed and tattooed.

# **Poultry Testing**

The Illinois Department of Agriculture is again enforcing a clear pullorum test for all 4-H and county poultry in shows lasting longer than one day. The rule was suspended in 2018 due to a shortage of antigen. Be sure to allow adequate time and consult with your local veterinarian. This rule does not apply to waterfowl that normally swim, such as ducks and geese, per the county exhibition guidelines.

The Area 4-H Livestock Judging Contest will be Saturday, **April 6**, at the WIU Livestock Pavilion, located at the intersection of N. Wigwam Hollow Road and Tower Road, Macomb (near the WIU golf course).

# The cost is \$5.00 per person, payable at the contest.

This contest is open to 4-H members only. Junior division is for those under 14 as of 1/1/19. Senior division is for those 14 and older as of 1/1/19.

Check-in will begin at 8:00 a.m. The contest will begin at 9 a.m. Each contestant should provide their own pencil, clip board, and paper for notes. Fulton County 4-H members who score the highest at this event will be invited to attend the State Judging Contest on June 17.

Parents — Help is needed in the scoring room that day. Please let Janis Blout know if you can help. This event is sponsored by Illinois Extension in McDonough County and by the WIU Intercollegiate Livestock Judging Team.

## Livestock Registration and Health Papers

If you have breeding stock that you want to show at a fair this summer, you must have registration papers. No joint ownership is allowed, and ownership must reflect appropriate deadlines. Livestock shows also require health papers on some animals. # **Reminder of Horse Helmet Rule**



Horse Members -- All 4-H members are required to wear a properly fitted

ASTM or SEI standard F1163 (or above) certified equestrian helmet whenever mounted or driving AT all 4-H horse and pony events, shows, activities, or practices. THAT MEANS EVEN WHEN YOU ARE WARMING UP AT THE SHOW. Original tags must be present in all approved helmets. The 4-H member is responsible to see that this specified head gear is properly fitted with the approved harness fastened in place whenever mounted. Helmet policies apply to all county, area, and state 4-H horse and pony events, shows, and activities. It is recommended that all adults working with 4-H members model the desired youth behavior by also wearing protective helmets whenever mounted or driving. If cost is an issue, the 4-H Horse Committee will help you find a helmet that is affordable. Call 547-3711.

## 4-H Fish Camp

With the lake fully stocked, 4-H Fish Camp is back at 4-H Memorial Camp near Monticello. Fishing begins at 10 a.m. Saturday, May 4, and lasts until 2 p.m. Sunday, May 5. Learn how to catch largemouth bass, crappie, bluegill, and channel catfish. Learn about fishing tips, lures, bait, equipment, knots, fish behavior, fish management, and fish cleaning. Each group registered will be assigned their own log cabin for lodging with single bunks. Participants must bring their own bedding and toiletries.

Fish Camp is open to any adult/child "team" interested in learning more about fishing. Each adult may attend camp with up to three youth campers. An adult must attend the entire weekend event with the youth campers. It is recommended that youth campers be at least eight years of age. A fee of \$50 per person covers the complete program, lodging, boat, bait, and three buffet meals, including Saturday lunch and supper and a Sunday brunch. You'll also have fresh fish fillets to take home! Pre-registration and payment are required. ## Sheep Market Wethers & Market Ewe Lambs:

<u>Live Show Wethers – New nomination format</u> Lambed on or after January 1, 2019 Ownership Date – May 15, 2019 Self-nomination as follows: Nominations must be signed by local Extension staff. Exhibitors fill out and send in nomination form with photo of lamb's ear with scrapie tag installed in ear (close up photo of ear so scrapie tag can be read). This must be completed between March 15 and May 15, 2019. Extension Office will mail for you to Dan Jennings.

### Junior and Open Premiere Wether lambs: -

Weigh-in, tattoo, and nomination procedures: Lambed on or after January 1, 2019. Junior and open premiere lambs will be nominated, tattooed, and weighed at the county level by Extension staff, using designated tattoo. Call 547-3711 to make an appointment.

Completed nomination forms must be signed by local Extension staff, who will send to Dan Jennings for you. This must be completed between March 15 and May 15, 2019.

# Meat Goat Wethers: Live Show Wethers – New nomination format

Wethers – Born on or after October 1, 2018 Ownership dates for Kids & Yearlings not in milk – May 15, 2019

Self-nomination as follows: Nominations must be signed by local Extension office.

Exhibitors fill out and send in nomination form with photo of goat's ear with scrapie tag installed in ear (close up photo of ear so scrapie tag can be read).

This must be completed between March 15 and May 15, 2019. Extension Office will mail for you to Dan Jennings.

## Attention: <u>All</u> Animal Project Members — Quality Assurance and Ethics (QA&E)

### If you have not done this before:

All 4-H members who enroll in ANY animal project must complete the online Quality Assurance and Ethics training, unless they have already done this in the past. This even applies to those who plan to do a poster at General Show Day about their animal project. The online training is easy to do, and does not take very much time. This must be done by July 1st. If you did it in a previous year, you do not have to do it again. Any 4-H animal members who do not have the training done by the deadline will have their name removed from the animal project they had enrolled in. This would mean they could not show for 4-H or receive 4-H premiums or awards. Anyone who does not have internet access at home to do this may come to the Extension Office and do it here. Once you have completed it, your name appears on a register that Extension Offices can refer to. You do not have to print anything out, even if it looks like you are supposed to. This is a one-time training, good for all your 4-H years. You must complete the basic training plus choose one specie, and complete that. You do not have to do more than one specie, no matter how many you show. Here is the website —

Go ahead and get it done soon, so you won't forget!

Please disregard the article from the last 4-H Newsletter regarding this topic, as the requirement called YQCA is not being required this 4-H year for 4-H shows.

### **State 4-H Horse Contests**

The State 4-H Horse Judging Contest will be held **Saturday, April 27, at Black Hawk College**, 26230 Black Hawk Road, Galva. Registration begins at 11 a.m., with the contest following at noon. The contest is open to all 4-H members; one does not need to own a horse or be enrolled in a horse project to participate. Be sure to pick up horse judging cards signed by Extension staff from your county Extension Office. Top-placing youth will be invited to participate in an invitational judging contest where the national team will be determined. Go to the Illinois 4-H website @ go.illinois.edu/ IL4H. Click on EVENTS, then State 4-H Horse Judging.

The State 4-H Horse Speaking Contest is **Saturday**, **April 13**, at the David Kinley Hall on the U of I campus, beginning at 10 a.m. All 4-H members may participate. You must register at the Extension Office by mid-March. Cost is \$3 per entry.

Regional horse contests will be held across the state to determine who goes to the State Horse Bowl and Hippology contests. State 4-H Hippology contest is **Saturday, April 13**, beginning at 8 a.m. at the David Kinley Hall on the U of I campus. Cost is \$5 per person. The State 4-H Horse Bowl Contest will be held **Sunday, April 14**, at the Education Building on the U of I campus, beginning at 8 a.m. Cost is \$5 per entry or \$25 per team. Go to the Illinois 4-H Website @ go.illinois.edu/IL4H. Click on EVENTS, then State 4-H Horse Bowl or State 4-H Horse Hippology for contest details.

The Central Regional Horse Bowl and Hippology Contests will be held on April 6 at Lincoln Land College, Springfield.

### **State Fair Information**

August 8-18, 2019

We will <u>not</u> have parking passes available for sale as of this year. We will have discounted admission tickets for sale.

### Non-Livestock —

Projects will be conference-judged. That means that if your non-livestock project **is selected** for State Fair, and you choose for it to go, you must go with it. That is called being a State Fair Delegate. Your project remains on display all day. You will bring it home that same day. If you cannot go, the opportunity is passed to an alternate.

To have your non-livestock project exhibited at State Fair, it must be selected as a State Fair Delegate at one of our 4-H Shows in 2019. 4-H members will be allowed to exhibit **only one** non-livestock project at State Fair, if selected to do so.

Our exhibit day for non-livestock projects at State Fair will be **Sunday, August 11**.

# What is the Difference Between Best of Show and State Fair Delegate?

Every project or project area will have a Best of Show selected at our County 4-H Shows. In larger project areas, sometimes, a Best of Show is selected per unit.

However, State Fair tells us how many projects we can send there. Therefore, many more 4-Hers receive Best of Show honors than can go to State Fair. Just because you get a Best of Show, that does not automatically mean you can take your project to State Fair.

Plus, not every 4-H project has a category at State Fair. Over the years, State Fair has had to eliminate some projects from their list because of budget cuts. They eliminated the ones where there had been the lowest number of participants.

### <u>Livestock</u> –

Our office will print off the sections that you need, if you are unable to access this information from your home. Entries (non-Horse) are due at the Fulton County Extension Office by June 27. State Horse entries are due June 1.

Quality Assurance and Ethics Certification is required for all animal exhibitors, unless they have completed it in the past.

The State Junior Horse Show is July 22-28. Entries are due <u>June</u> 1.

All Illinois State Fair Junior exhibitors will need to pay entry fees for their animals entered. Fees will be due at the same time as entry forms, June 27th at the Extension Office (Horse deadline is June 1st) Fees are listed on the website.

#### State Fair Junior Show age eligibility

4-H members aged 8-18 as of September 1, 2018 are eligible to participate in the Illinois State Fair Junior Department, both livestock and non-livestock.

FFA members up to 18 years of age as of September 1, 2018 are eligible to participate in the Illinois State Fair Junior Livestock Division. THESE ENTRIES MUST BE SIGNED BY FFA ADVISORS; THEY CANNOT BE SIGNED BY EXTENSION/4-H STAFF. Individuals **previously** enrolled as active members in Illinois 4-H and/or FFA programs and turning 19-20 years of age by September 1, 2018 may participate in the Junior Livestock Division of the Illinois State Fair <u>only if they are active FFA</u> <u>members</u> as verified by Illinois FFA and in accordance with one of the following program options:

Maintain active membership on the roster of their local high school FFA Chapter; Maintain active membership in a collegiate FFA Chapter in a postsecondary institution of higher education in the State of Illinois; or Maintain active membership in an Illinois FFA Alumni Chapter. FFA members 21 years of age prior to September 1, 2018 are ineligible to show in the Junior Livestock Division of the Illinois State Fair.

# 4G STEM Camp

4G STEM Camp introduces girls entering sixth, seventh, and eighth grade to careers in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math). The camp includes five days of hands-on activities, lab experiments, and field trips to area businesses offering STEM-related careers.

4G STEM Camp is set for June 24-28, 2019. Camp meets at Bradley University and includes tours at Advanced Medical Transport, Illinois American Water, The Nature Conservancy at Emiquon, University of Illinois - Springfield, and more.

**Mandatory Safety Meeting** – April 24, 6:30 p.m. at Fulton County Extension Office. Those who attended a Safety meeting in a previous session <u>for the same discipline</u> are not required to come. If you are enrolling in a new discipline this time, you must attend the safety meeting.

# **4-H Leader Notes**

## **4-H Program Fees**

Again this year, there is a \$20 per member 4-H Program Fee. In our county, there is a family (household) cap of \$60, meaning that a family (household) will only pay \$60 at the most, regardless of how many children are members.

4-H key leaders will receive a statement shortly after May 1, listing their members and the amount due. The payment from the club will be due June 1.

It is very important that the due date of June 1 is honored. There is a fee waiver form for families to submit if they cannot afford to pay the fee. <u>No one</u> will be denied membership because of inability to pay.

Some 4-H clubs that have larger treasuries may decide to pay the fees (or a portion) from the club treasury. Some 4-H clubs may receive a donation from a local business that could help pay the fees. Some 4-H clubs will opt to collect it from individual families. Some 4-H clubs may decide to have fundraisers to raise these funds. It is up to the individual 4-H clubs how they want to handle the collection of the fees. It is up to the clubs whether they collect the fee now or later, but it must be turned in to the Extension Office no later than June 1st.

# **Count Them All**

Please make sure that ALL 4-H-age youth who attend your 4-H club meetings are enrolled. This provides them with accident insurance at the meetings and legal parental permission to be there. This is important! **Please check the lists we send you, or ask to be able to see the lists online.** 

# Treasurer and Secretary Book Printouts

At the end of the 4-H year (8/31), you **must** turn in your club's 4-H Treasurer's record book (unless you do not have a treasury) <u>and</u> the 4-H Secretary's book to the Extension Office. This is required by the state. <u>Please periodically</u> <u>check</u> with your treasurer and secretary, to be sure they are keeping track of and working on the book on their computer. **These MUST be turned in.** There are IRS and other rules that mandate this, and it is <u>not</u> optional.

## Required Training For All <u>New</u> 4-H Leaders/Volunteers —

ANCRA (Abused and Neglected Child Reporting Act) training is required of all NEW 4-H and Extension volunteers. To become a 4-H volunteer, this training must be completed, and a form signed and submitted to our office.

This training is available only online. You may take it at home (or at our office by appointment), but you <u>must</u> follow up by printing out and signing a *Protection of Minors Acknowledgement Form* and bringing it to our office (or mail, fax, or send as an email attachment). You are not shown as complete until you do the training and submit the form to us.
