YQCA/QAEC

4-H members enrolled in dairy cattle, beef cattle, swine, sheep, and goats must complete their annual YQCA training either on-line at <https://yqcaprogram.org/> (\$12) or at an in-person training (\$3) by **May 1**. See your email (3/31) from Shelby for details on how to register. In-person trainings are scheduled as follows. Details will be confirmed a week before the training. In-person trainings will be held on:

- **Friday, April 15, 4-5 p.m. at the 4-H Center, Macomb**

QAEC training is required for members enrolled in cat, dog, horse, poultry, and rabbit. This training must be completed once in a member's career. Training must be completed by **May 1**.

STATE FAIR SHEEP/GOAT NOMINATION PROCESS

Sheep and Goat Nomination forms have been emailed and mailed to our families for this year. Please look over them carefully as some details have changed. Forms must be completed between March 15- May 15, 2022. A clear, close up image of the ear with the scrapie tag must be included. Forms will need to be signed up 4-H Extension Staff by the deadline.

ENTRY DEADLINES APPROACHING

Reminder that May 1 is the horse ownership/lease papers due date

May 1 is the deadline to file horse ownership/lease papers with the local Extension office. In addition to the ownership/lease papers, a photo of each side of the animals is required. We strongly encourage members who own or lease more than one horse to file paperwork on ALL potential exhibit horses by the deadline. If a horse is injured or dies, it may be replaced ONLY by a horse whose paperwork is already on file by the deadline. A horse may only be owned or leased to and exhibited by ONE 4-H or FFA member at the State Fair Junior Horse Show. Download the form @ <https://4h.extension.illinois.edu/members/projects/horse>.

CHANGES IN FAIR PROJECTS

The following changes are coming to the General Show. There will be more details in your 2022 Fair Book.

Animal Science ~ Animal science will be broken into two classes based on number of years in project. Animal Science 1 will be for youth enrolled in this project 1-2 years. Animal Science 2 will be for youth enrolled in this project for 3 or more years.

Food & Nutrition ~ Cooking 101, 201, 301 and 401 will now have additional classes. You will be able to enter in each class under the project level you enrolled in.

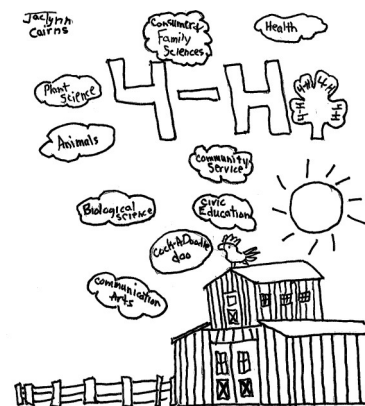

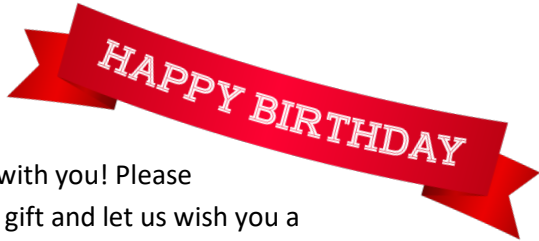
