To be considered for the contest and to receive the prize, entries must meet the following reguirements: Title: Knox County 4-H Fair Book Paper: 8.5x11 piece of paper with at least 1/2 inch border on all sides. Ink: Black ink or Black Marker (pencil isn't dark enough and the book is printed in black and white) Originality: Everything must be freehand. You may not use a computer or copyright graphics. Fair Date: Leave a 1x3 inch space for the Extension Office to insert the dates and locations of the 4-H Show and Project Show. 4-H Clover: The 4-H Clover may not be distorted or rotated. Do not place text or pictures over the 4-H Clover. For a list of guidelines regarding the 4-H Clover, please contact your local Extension office. Deadline: Friday, February 28

RoboStorm *Report by Seth King* RoboStorm participated in the FIRST Lego League qualifier competition at Woodruff High School on Saturday, December 11. This was the first live competition for everyone except one member, but they performed like seasoned veterans. They were very consistent and efficient during the robot game competition. Then, in a rather cramped and sweltering judging room, they showcased all the work they did throughout the season. Over the course of 30 minutes, they were scored on their Innovation Project, Robot Design, and Core Values. Later that evening, they were awarded the top Innovation Project out of all 32 teams in an online awards ceremony. This season's FLL theme was focused on problems with transporting cargo, and the team focused on keeping large livestock safe during transit. Their project, "Your Onboard Livestock Observer", used artificial intelligence to monitor the health and safety of horses, cattle, and pigs. This system would allow the driver to focus on safely driving and only be alerted if there was an issue in the trailer. This idea, along with their research and presentation skills, achieved a nearly perfect score from the judges. All team members reported having a great time and learning a lot this season. HELPFUL TIPS FOR 1ST YEAR 4-H FAMILIES

Is it possible to be both excited and confused at the same time? Yes, just ask any 1st year 4-H parent. That is why we have put together a few helpful tips to get your through your 1st year.

- Make sure to review the projects your kids are signed up for on il.4honline.com
- There is still time to enroll for General Show projects (basically anything non livestock). You have until March 1 to add General Show projects.
- 4-H Fair Books are available online typically starting in April. We encourage you to look up project details for all projects you plan to exhibit. Don't forget to check out the fair dates and deadlines.
- Is your kiddo signed up for a livestock project? If yes, make sure they have completed their QAEC and or YQCA.
- Fair entries will be completed online through fairentry.com starting in April. You will have until June 6 to complete
 - □ This is when you choose exactly what projects you want to take to the 4-H Fair. Please know that you by no means need to take everything that you enrolled for in 4HOnline. Choose projects that the 4-H member is most excited about and that you know you have time to complete.
- Know that your friendly neighborhood 4-H Program Coordinator, Nicole Nelson, and the rest of the Extension Office are here to help you with fair entries. We are more than happy to make arrangements for 1 on 1, to help you complete the entries or help answer questions about project details.
- Remember that everyone in your club or Extension office has had a 1st year in 4-H and are more than happy to help you with your questions. Feel free to ask your 4-H Club leader, officer team, fellow members and other 4-H families.
- Lastly take a deep breath you are doing great! You are more than half way through your 1st year. The second year will be a walk in the park. Here is to a great 4-H year!
