To make your fair entries, please go to the website <u>https://fairentry.com</u>. You can use the "find your fair" option to search for your fair and will sign in with your 4HOnline information. Here are a few tips that might make it go faster.

• First, review the 4-H showbook and the classes that you plan to enter

• Second, write out the class name. Keep in mind you can only have one General Show project per category. This is based on your level in the 4-H project. Please review your project enrollment in 4HOnline before you move into the FairEntry system.

Third, go into FairEntry and click on the projects that you plan to take to the fair. You will notice that you will select the word "choose" many times. Once you have completed your selection, you will see all the classes that you entered.

Please contact Nicole with any questions you may have about the 4-H Fair Entry process. We are happy to help but ask that you don't wait until the last minute to register.

## **Fair Entry Deadline**

Members can make their fair entries by visiting <u>fairentry.com/Fair/SignIn/16521</u> Each 4-H member will make their entry as an individual. You should see a list of family members eligible to exhibit.

- Cloverbuds WILL use the FairEntry system this year
- Families with multiple children, once you are done selecting projects for the first child you will need to select "register another Exhibitor" to enter your second child's projects and so on. Once the family is completed you can then submit everyone at once. Otherwise you will need to wait until the office approves entries before you can enter your second youth's projects.

We ask that you are very patient and you give yourself plenty of time to complete the entries before **June 7**. The fair entry system will close at 11:59 p.m. on **June 7**. We will not have a scheduled Fair Entry Night. If you need one on one help we encourage you to make special arrangements with the office. We are happy to help but ask that you don't wait until the last minute to register.

#### MARK YOUR CALENDARS—OUR DAY AT THE STATE FAIR

Mark your calendars! Knox County's day to exhibit General Show projects at the Illinois State Fair is **Friday**, **August 12.** To help plan ahead we are sharing that parking passes for the State Fair will **NOT** be available to purchase ahead of time in our offices. This is to help mainstream the parking process on the fairgrounds.

#### **CHANGES IN FAIR PROJECTS**

The following changes are coming to the General Show . There will be more details in your 2022 Fair Book. Animal Science ~ Animal Science will be broken into two classes based on number of years in project. Animal Science 1 will be for youth enrolled in this project 1-2 years. Animal Science 2 will be for youth enrolled in this project for 3 or more years. Food & Nutrition ~ Cooking 101, 201, 301 and 401 will now have additional classes. You will be able to enter in each class under the project level you enrolled in.

#### CHECK OUT THE MASTERS AT THIS YEAR'S STATE FAIR

Each county may send one entry into the Illinois State Fair Master Showmanship Contest. The contest begins at 7 p.m. **Friday, August 12**. Exhibitors must be at least 14 and no older than 18 (as of 9/1/21). You need to supply your own animals for the contest, but may make arrangements to borrow animals from exhibitors at the fair. The contest is sponsored by Illinois Farm Bureau and RFD Radio.

Knox County's Master Showmanship Contest will be held during **Monday, July 18** at 5 p.m. The participant with the highest score will represent Knox County during the Illinois State Fair Master Showmanship Contest.

## SUPERIOR YOUNG PRODUCER SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

This is offered by the Illinois State Fair to 4-H members in Beef, Sheep, Swine, Dairy, and Horses as an educational activity at the Illinois State Fair to promote youth development and personal growth. Three \$1,000 scholarships will be provided in horses and three \$1,000 scholarships will be provided in dairy. A total of nine \$1,000 scholarships will be provided in a combined contest for beef, sheep, and swine contestants.
