

Unit-Wide Policies

- The new year begins September 1. Please make sure you read and understand the policies. We are trying to keep the deadlines consistent so it is easier for everyone to remember the dates. If a **deadline** lands on a weekend the paperwork needs to be turned in the drop box on Monday prior to 7:59 a.m. before the office opens.
- October 15 RISK forms need to be turned into the office by all new members and those who do not have one on file. Medical forms need to be turned into your leader.
- December 1 Re-enrollment, project selection, and RISK form need to be completed. If you were a member last year, and you miss the December 1 re-enrollment deadline, you will not be eligible to participate in the 2022 4-H shows at the fair. Check with your club leader about the \$20 program fee. Each club will be invoiced for the total amount due.
- Members will need to attend at least four meetings a year to be eligible to participate in your county's 4-H fair. This year attending meetings virtually as well as in person counts for attendance.
- At minimum members must complete a talk or demonstration. However, clubs may require both.
- Secretaries are required to **send attendance sheets to the Extension Office monthly** after each 4-H meeting. Attendance reports may be emailed, scanned, mailed, or dropped off. We ask that you use the online Secretary Record Book. You may print it out.
- Treasurers need to make sure they are **balancing accounts monthly** and providing reports during each meeting. Also, make sure you are using the required online Treasurer Record Book.
- January 1 Livestock and Companion Animal (dogs and cats) Project Enrollment deadline. This is the
 last date you may add ANY livestock project and still be eligible to show that project at the county 4-H
 fair.
- March 1 General Project enrollment deadline. This is the last date you may add a general project and still be eligible to show that project at the county 4-H fair. Remember that you already turned in your enrollment in December, but if you need to add a general project you may do so before this deadline.
- May 1 Horse project members' ownership/lease papers and pictures due to the office.
- May 1 Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) <u>yearly</u> certification is <u>required of all livestock</u> <u>project members</u> (aside from cats, dogs, horses, poultry, and rabbits). For all other animals, QAEC will still be required. If you plan to show livestock at the county and/or state fair, this is now a state requirement for all of us at the county level. Ask your local extension office about ways to complete this training online or in person.
- June 1 Dog project members' ownership/lease papers due to the office.
- 4 weeks before show Online entries will be due at the close of the day. This is where you tell us what projects you are bringing to the fair. Keep in mind—do not delay!

YQCA

4-H members enrolled in dairy cattle, beef cattle, swine, sheep, and goats must completed their annual YQCA training either on-line at yqca.org (\$12) or at an in-person training (\$3) by **May 1.** An email from Beth will follow with details for registering. In-person trainings are scheduled as follows and subject to change pending weather. Details will be confirmed a week before the training. In-person trainings will be held on:

Saturday, February 19, Noon at the 4-H Center, Macomb

QAEC training is required for members enrolled in cat, dog, horse, poultry, and rabbit. This training must be completed once in a members career. Training must be completed by **May 1.**



4-H FAIR BOOK COVER CONTEST

Any 4-H member (age 8-18 only) interested in creating an original design for the 2022 McDonough County 4-H Fair Book must submit their entry to the Extension Office by **February 1 at 4:30 pm**. The entry that is selected for the cover will receive a \$15.00 voucher for the concession Stand to use during the fair and will have their art on display. All other entries will receive \$5.00 for the concession stand. **To be considered for the contest and to receive the prize, entries must meet the following requirements:**

Title: McDonough County 4-H Fair Book

Paper: 8.5x11 piece of paper with at least 1/2 inch border on all sides.

Ink: Black ink or Black Marker

*Do not use pencil. It is not dark enough to copy. Also, the finished copy is in black and white. Do not make a multi-colored copy.

Originality: Everything must be freehand. You may not use a computer or copyright graphics.

Fair Date: Leave a 1x3 inch space for the Extension Office to insert the dates and locations of the 4-H Show and Project Show.

4-H Clover: The 4-H Clover may not be distorted or rotated. Do not place text or pictures over the 4-H Clover. For a list of guidelines regarding the 4-H Clover, please contact your local Extension office.

QUILTING WORKSHOP

Join us for an afternoon learning about a new 4-H project, quilting. Piece by piece, you'll learn basic quilting techniques, patterns, selecting appropriate fabrics, quilting equipment, options for finishing quilts, and binding. This free workshop is open to beginner quilters, ages 8-18. 4-H membership is not required to attend. Participants under 10 years old will need to be accompanied by an adult. STATE ROBOTICS CHALLENGE

This year's competition will revolve around the work of the 4-H in Space Mission Command Team, which is preparing curriculum and programming options for Illinois youth working with the International Space Station National Laboratories (ISS) and The Lab for Advanced Space Systems at Illinois, Dept. of Aerospace Engineering, (LASSI). These collaborations will enable Illinois 4-H youth to send experiments to the ISS, and build/launch micro satellites into orbit.

The SpaceBot Mission Command Challenge will take place at the McLean County Fairgrounds in Bloomington, IL on Saturday, April 16, 2022. Team registration will open January 17, 2022 and will close March 16, 2022. There will be a \$20 Entry fee per team assessed at the time of registration. This year All Health Forms are due at time of registration and will be accessible through the Challenge Download Link on or by December 14.

This year we will be hosting a set of Webinars for all participating youth, coaches and volunteers centered around the challenge and how to think through it. We will premiere the Challenge Video and answer any questions folks may have around the challenge. In addition, we will be openly brainstorming the future of the State 4-H Robotics Challenge as the EV3 platform has been phased out. Please bring your questions and ideas as we work towards providing the best robotics experience for our youth.

HELPFUL TIPS FOR 1ST YEAR 4-H FAMILIES

Is it possible to be both excited and confused at the same time? Yes, just ask any 1st year 4-H parent. That is why we have put together a few helpful tips to get your thru your 1st year.

- Make sure to review the projects your kiddos are signed up for on v2.4honline.com/#/user/sign-in
- There is still time to enroll for General show projects (basically anything non livestock). You have until March 1 to add General Show projects.
- Once you get your 4-H Fair Book, hold it in your hands and say out loud "this is my fair book, there are
 many like it, but this one is mine." Sounds a bit silly but by saying it, you are allowing yourself to highlight,
 star, mark up the pages within. We encourage families to do this so that they can remember what projects their youth are signed up for and this is a great way to make looking up project details and fair dates
 quicker.
- Is your kiddo signed up for a livestock project? If yes, make sure they have completed their QAEC and or YQCA. Details are on page 3.
- Fair entries will be completed online starting in April. You will have until June 11 to complete them.
 - ☐ This is when you choose exactly what projects you want to take to the 4-H Fair. Please know that you by no means need to take everything that you signed up for. Choose projects that the 4-H member is most excited about and that you know you have time to complete.
- Know that your friendly neighborhood 4-H Program Coordinator, Beth Chatterton, and the rest of the Extension Office are here to help you with fair entries. We are more than happy to make arrangements for 1 on 1, to help you complete the entries or help answer questions about project details.
- Remember that everyone in your club or Extension office has had a 1st year in 4-H and are more than happy to help you with your questions. Feel free to ask your 4-H Club leader, officer team, fellow members and other 4-H families.
- Lastly take a deep breath you are doing great! You are more than half way thru your 1st year. The
 second year will be a walk in the park. Here is to a great 4-H year!
