#### **Keeping Safe During Club Meetings**

As 4-H'ers, we consistently go above and beyond to ensure the health, safety, and wellbeing of others. During the current pandemic we are facing, I have been amazed at the selflessness displayed by 4-H members across the county, state, country, and world. We once again call on your to practice this service to others by following the following protocol during club meetings.

- Once your leader determines if your club will meet in-person or virtually, they will be in contact. Clubs
  may also offer both a virtual and in-person options. Please practice proper online etiquette if that
  option is used. If you are uncomfortable meeting in person and you club is not prepared to offer a
  virtual option, email Shelby at srcarls2@illinois to make other arrangements. For this year, virtual
  attendance counts as being present at a meeting.
- All attendees are encouraged to wear a mask outside and required inside and practice proper social distancing. Those from different households should be at least 6 ft apart at all times.
- All surfaces will be sanitized before and after the meeting. Please refrain from sharing writing utensils during the meeting unless it has been properly sanitized.
- Refreshments can not be served during meetings. You may choose to bring your own snack but you are unable to share this snack.
- Follow all directions given by club leaders posted signs and stay home if you are feeling unwell.

#### 4-H Shooting Sports Fall Update

After a survey of shooting sports discipline instructors; key volunteers; and state shooting sports venues - the decision has been made to move all in-person state shoots to a virtual tournament format for health and safety reasons. This will allow for smaller, local competitions to be conducted and supervised by certified Level I 4-H discipline instructors who will then report the youth scores centrally through an on-line system.

Also, we are happy to announce that our 2020 Illinois 4-H Shooting Sports team members who were scheduled to attend the National 4-H Shoot last June (cancelled due to COVID-19) will be invited to shoot at the same national event in 2021 if they are still age eligible. Our 2020 virtual shoot results and the data from 2019 State Shoots will then be used to fill any gaps in the 2021 Illinois team.

The virtual shoot will run for the months of September – December, 2020. Registration will be free and have both a Junior (11-13 years) and Senior (14-18 years) division! Disciplines offered will be compound archery; recurve archery; shotgun (trap); and air rifle. Virtual Shoot registration opens Sept. 1<sup>st</sup>. Email Julian Inniss, 4-H SPIN Program Coordinator at jinniss@illinois.edu to learn more or to register for the Virtual Shoot. **Due to safety reason, members will only be allowed to shoot in disciplines they have previously been enrolled in. Stay tuned for more information about joining 4-H Shooting Sports in the spring.** 

#### Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA)

4-H members exhibiting animals entering the food production system will be required to complete the **Youth for the Quality Care of Animal** certification (YQCA). It will replace former trainings: PQA and QAEC. This program is the industry-standard certification. Check with local offices about completing the training. The training must be completed each year.

Horses, dogs, cats, poultry, and rabbits will still be required to take the **Quality Assurance and Ethics** (QAEC) training. This training is only required once in the member's career. **Dates TBD** 

#### **Registering for Events:**

4-H has so many opportunities for its members to take part in. Did you know the local extension office will help cover the cost of state conferences and events? It's true! Make sure you follow the correct procedure so you don't miss out on any opportunities. The Extension office will cover half of the fee up to a total of \$300 per year per member. The local 4-H Foundation may choose to cover more of the cost.

- Contact your local program coordinator and let them know about the event
- Register for event and select the "pay by check" or "my county will pay" option
- Let your program coordinator reach out to the 4-H Foundation
- Once the Extension Office has paid their portion and the Foundation has covered the amount they
  choose, you will be invoiced for the remaining balance
- Please do not pay until you have been invoiced for the total remaining cost

#### **Junior Leadership Conference**

#### **November 7 | Virtually held on ZOOM**

You'll laugh. You'll make new friends. You'll even learn cool ideas to take back to your own 4-H Club at this year's Illinois 4-H Junior Leadership Conference. The conference is open to 4-H members in 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade. Registration closes when we reach 250 participants, so don't wait to the Oct. 24 deadline. Do it now! REGISTER: go.illinois.edu/4Hjlc. This year's conference will be held virtually on ZOOM. Links for sessions, workshops and activities will be send in advance to participants.

In addition to cool things to do, you'll each have the opportunity to select two of these workshops to attend:

- **Bouncin' Back: Resilient Me:** Have you ever received a bad test grade? Maybe you did not get the 4-H Officer position you ran for or you just had a bad day. We all face hardship or adversity in our daily lives, but do not let it be something that stops you! Join us as we learn how to build our resilience through a series of games and challenges!
- From Leading to Succeeding: Has the idea to become a successful leader ever crossed your mind? If so, this is the workshop for you! You will learn how to be a better leader in your county and hear about various 4-H opportunities at the state and national level.
- Inspire Others to Serve: A fun and interactive way to learn how to plan and run your own community service project in your community! We will begin giving you ideas, tips, and tricks to help you be successful in leading a project, then we will create and run mock projects. You'll leave knowing how to involve yourself in your community, and the ability to implement your own community service project.
- Mind Matters: Do you feel stressed out all the time? Maybe you can't help but procrastinate? Then this is the workshop for you! In this workshop, we will be going through time management skills and techniques to help you manage stress. So don't stress, you got the time to join this workshop!
- Speak Out: Learn to listen, effectively share thoughts, and speak out! In this workshop we will also talk
  about confidence, how to send positive body language and provide constructive feedback. Improve your
  communication skills through games and activities with us!
- **Teaming Together to Lead the Fun:** Are you ready to take action? Join us and begin to learn some creative ways to gain communication and leadership skills through our fun virtual team building games! With both small groups and the entire team, collaborate together to solve problems and create stories that enhance your teamwork skills.

#### **Officer & Leadership Training**

Do you know what your job is as an officer of your 4-H club? Do you know how to write the minutes? The order of business? When you can write a check and when you cannot? Do you feel comfortable being a leader? If you are a club officer or a club member and the answer to any of these is no, you need to attend this workshop. There is no cost to attend. Open to all 4-H members and leaders in McDonough County. Training will be Friday, November 6 from 4-6 pm, location 4-H Center. Online registration is open until November 3. This training is geared towards younger, less experienced members. A more advanced training will be held this winter for older members.

#### **Unit-Wide Policies**

- The new year begins September 1. Please make sure you read and understand the policies. We are trying to keep the deadlines consistent so it is easier for everyone to remember the dates. <u>If a deadline lands on a weekend the paperwork needs to be turned in the drop box on Monday prior to 7:59 a.m.</u> before the office opens.
- **October 11** RISK forms need to be turned into the office by all new members and those who do not have one on file. Medical forms need to be turned into your leader.
- December 1 Re-enrollment, project selection, and RISK form need to be completed. If you were a member last year, and you miss the December 1 re-enrollment deadline, you will not be eligible to participate in the 2021 4-H shows at the fair. Check with your club leader about the \$20 program fee. Each club will be invoiced for the total amount due.
- Members will need to attend at least four meetings a year to be eligible to participate in your county's
   4-H fair. This year attending meetings virtually as well as in person counts for attendance.
- At minimum members must complete a talk or demonstration. However, clubs may require both.
- Secretaries are required to send attendance sheets to the Extension Office monthly after each 4-H
  meeting. Attendance reports may be emailed, scanned, mailed, or dropped off. We ask that you use
  the online Secretary Record Book. You may print it out.
- Treasurers need to make sure they are **balancing accounts monthly** and providing reports during each meeting. Also, make sure you are using the required online Treasurer Record Book.
- January 1 Livestock and Companion Animal (dogs and cats) Project Enrollment deadline. This is the
  last date you may add ANY livestock project and still be eligible to show that project at the county 4-H
  fair.
- March 1 General Project enrollment deadline. This is the last date you may add a general project and still be eligible to show that project at the county 4-H fair. Remember that you already turned in your enrollment in December, but if you need to add a general project you may do so before this deadline.
- May 1 Horse project members' ownership/lease papers and pictures due to the office.
- May 1 Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) <u>yearly</u> certification is <u>required of all livestock</u> <u>project members</u> (aside from cats, dogs, horses, poultry, and rabbits). For all other animals, QAEC will still be required. If you plan to show livestock at the county and/or state fair, this is now a state requirement for all of us at the county level. Ask your local extension office about ways to complete this training online or in person. <u>For all other animals</u> (cats, dogs, horses, poultry, and rabbits), QAEC will still be required.
- June 1 Dog project members' ownership/lease papers due to the office.
- 4 weeks before show Online entries will be due at the close of the day. This is where you tell us what projects you are bringing to the fair. Keep in mind—do not delay!


