- · Host family selection is dependent on completion of an application and screening process, as well as student availability and personality compatibility.

Public Presentation Contest

As in the past, to participate in this contest, youth must be 4-H members, and be registered in the Public Presentations project by $March\ 1^{st}$. They also need to register for the contest using their county's <u>FairEntry</u> system between $April\ 1^{st}$ and $April\ 16^{th}$. Below is the list of categories that you can choose from. Please note that 4-H members are able to attend the State Contest in one category.

- Formal Speech | Self-written | Notes Allowed | No props | Individual | 4-8 minutes
- Illustrated Speech | Self-written | Notes allowed | Illustrations Required | Individual | 4-8 minutes
- Original Works | Self-written | Notecards allowed | Props and Costumes Allowed |
- Individual or 2-Person Team | Manuscripts sent in Advance | 4-8 minutes
- Oral Interpretation | Published work | Props and Costumes Allowed | Individual or 2-Person Team | Manuscripts sent in Advance | 4-8 minutes

YQCA

4-H members enrolled in dairy cattle, beef cattle, swine, sheep, and goats must completed their annual YQCA training either on-line at yqca.org (\$12) or at an in-person training (\$3) by **May 1.** An email from Jill will follow with details for registering. Project Highlight: MAKER

Have your heard about the new project? Maker! Over the last decade, Do-it-yourselfers have shown the world that you do not need to be an engineer or computer scientist to create useful, innovative devices, gadgets, and gizmos through what is known as the Maker Movement. In fact, with very little background, and a can-do attitude, almost anyone can enter the Maker world and create anything their imagination guides them to.

This year, Illinois 4-H has brought the Maker Movement to your doorstep through a Multi Media curriculum experience called DIY Make & Build! DIY Make and Build is an opportunity for youth to learn about design, engineering, manufacturing, electricity and computer programming while being innovative and imaginative. You can still add the Maker project until March 1!

4-H Fair Book Cover Contest

Any 4-H member (age 8-18 only) interested in creating an original design for the Henderson and Warren 4-H Fair Book must submit their entry to the Extension Office by **February 8 at 4 pm**. The entry that is selected for the cover will receive a \$15.00 voucher for the concession Stand to use during the fair and will have their art on display. All other entries will receive \$5.00 for the concession stand. **To be considered for the contest and to receive the prize, entries must meet the following requirements:**

Title: Henderson County 4-H Fair Book or Warren County 4-H Fair Book

Paper: 8.5x11 piece of paper with at least 1/2 inch border on all sides.

Ink: Black ink or Black Marker

*Do not use pencil. It is not dark enough to copy. Also, the finished copy is in black and white. Do not make a multi-colored copy.

Originality: Everything must be freehand. You may not use a computer or copyright graphics.

Fair Date: Leave a 1x3 inch space for the Extension Office to insert the dates and locations of the 4-H Show and Project Show.

4-H Clover: The 4-H Clover may not be distorted or rotated. Do not place text or pictures over the 4-H Clover. For a list of guidelines regarding the 4-H Clover, please contact your local Extension office.

Registering for Events:

4-H has so many opportunities for its members to take part in. Did you know the local extension office will help cover the cost of state conferences and events? It's true! Make sure you follow the correct procedure so you don't miss out on any opportunities. The Extension office will cover half of the fee up to a total of \$300 per year per member. The local 4-H Foundation may choose to cover more of the cost.

*Contact your local program coordinator and let them know what event you are interested in attending.
