Together, 4-H is making a difference in the lives of young people and their families -Independent research confirms the impact of the 4-H experience, demonstrating that 4-H members are more likely to go to college, four times more likely to contribute to their communities; two times more likely to make healthier choices; two times more likely to be civically active; and two times more likely to participate in STEM programs.

Illinois 4-H is also there to help in the next steps of life: \$170,000+ in college scholarships are available to 4-H members; including \$135,000+ to youth interested in attending the College of Agriculture, Consumer and Environmental Sciences at University of Illinois. If youth are interested in attending University of Illinois, there are even more scholarships available and the skills and experiences learned in 4-H give youth an edge in preparing for scholarships. And if a family has under \$67,100 or less in combined family income, the University of Illinois, 4-H's parent college, has a commitment to provide FREE four-year tuition.
