Let's protect that beautiful head of yours

Equine Headgear:

All 4-H members are **required** to wear a properly fitted ASTM or SEI standard F1163 (or above) certified equestrian helmet whenever mounted or driving at all 4-H horse and pony events, shows, activities, or practices. Original tags must be present in all approved helmets. The 4-H member is responsible to see that this specified head-gear is properly fitted with the approved harness fastened snugly in place whenever mounted. Helmet policies apply to all county, area, and state 4-H horse and pony events, shows, and activities. <u>Protective helmets are recommended for all riders and drivers at all times. It is recommended that all adults working with 4-H members model the desired youth behavior by also wearing protective helmets whenever mounted or driving.</u>

A few helmets will be provided, but please bring one if you have it. Also, all horses 12 months of age or older must have a copy of a negative Coggins test. Exhibitors need to have a copy with them at the show.

ALL 4-H Members taking a livestock project are **REQUIRED** to complete a 4-H Livestock record for the following species: beef, dairy, swine, sheep, poultry, rabbit, goat, and horse.

Records may be emailed or brought into the office June 1 - June 17. Records should be completed through the end of May.

Tips for Livestock Exhibitors

You should be prepared to answer the following as it applies to your project:

- When was the animal born/hatched?
- What breed, sex and variety is the animal?
- Who are the dam/sire?
- When did it freshen? How long has it been milking? How much is it milking?
- How do you care for your animal?
- What are some diseases it may get?
- Are there any required vaccinations for your project animal?
- What do you feed your animal?

The questions above may be asked during judging or showmanship, so a 4-H member should always be ready to answer them.

Requirements to show at the 4-H Fair

Members must attend at least 4 club meetings, events, or activities **prior** to the fair to be eligible to participate in the 4-H fair and 4-H auction.

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) is a national multi-species quality assurance program for youth ages 8 to 21 with a focus on three core pillars: food safety, animal well-being, and character development.

YQCA is currently required for those showing: **Beef, Goats, Sheep, or Swine**



IDOA CONTINUES EMERGENCY RULE TO PROTECT POULTRY FROM HIGHLY PATHOGENIC AVIAN INFLUENZA

ILLINOIS 4-H ANNOUNCES COUNTY FAIR POULTRY SHOWS MOVE TO VIRTUAL FORMAT

SPRINGFIELD, IL - The Illinois Department of Agriculture (IDOA) announced today that it will continue to enforce emergency rules prohibiting the sale or exhibiting of poultry and poultry products at swap meets, exhibitions, flea markets, and auction markets in Illinois to prevent the spread of avian influenza.

The Department's emergency rules took effect on April 5, 2022. The emergency rules may be effective for up to 150 days; however, the Department is evaluating the need for the emergency rules every 45 days based on the most up to date avian influenza information. At the close of the first 45-day period, the Department has determined that the emergency rules should remain in effect as avian influenza has been detected in the State as recently as May 17, 2022. The Department will continue to evaluate in 45-day increments for up to 150 days.

In conjunction with this announcement, Illinois 4-H will move all county fair 4-H poultry shows to an alternate format while the emergency rules are in place. If and when the emergency rules are lifted, 4-H will return to live shows. "We want all youth to know they will still have an opportunity to exhibit and share what they've learned in their 4-H poultry project this year," said Dr. Lisa Diaz, University of Illinois Extension 4-H Director.

A decision regarding State Fair poultry shows will be made by June 17, 2022.

"The extended waterfowl migration, cooler average temperatures, and increased rainfall this spring, are factors contributing to the identification of additional detections in Illinois," said Dr. Mark Ernst, IDOA State Veterinarian. "It is our hope that within the coming weeks, migration will be completed, the weather will be consistently warmer and drier, and the risk for spread will be dramatically lower."

Flock owners, managers, or veterinarians should report any unusual findings in domestic poultry such as increase in mortality, decrease in water consumption, decrease in egg production, or respiratory signs including coughing and sneezing immediately to the IDOA at 217-782-4944 or the USDA at 866-536-7593.

We have partnered with the Fayette County Farm Bureau Young Leaders, who have generously agreed to host a Master Showmanship contest. Contestants are judged on their visual showmanship skills and are also asked questions about each of the species. We are planning to have two age divisions: Senior: 14-18 and Junior: 8-13. Animals will not be provided, therefore participants will have to secure their own/ask to borrow.

QAEC requirement (new livestock members)

All 4-H members enrolled in an animal project area are required to complete the online **Quality Assurance** and Ethics course one time in order to stay enrolled in an animal project area.

The certification must be done if you are enrolled in one of the following projects: beef, dairy, cats, dogs, goats, horses, poultry, rabbits, sheep, and swine. Members who don't complete the certification before the show will be removed from the project and not be allowed to show. Anyone who has already taken the certification does not need to retake the test.
