Quality Assurance & Ethics (QA&E)

The Quality Assurance and Ethics training is required for all youth that enroll in horses, rabbits, poultry, dogs, and cats. Members must take the training whether they own a live animal or not. It is advised that they complete this one time as soon as they are enrolled in the project area. Failure to complete QA&E will result in the member's animal science project enrollment being cancelled and they will be ineligible to exhibit at county fairs. The website is open year round at http://web.extension.illinois.edu/qaec/

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA)

The YQCA is a livestock quality assurance program for youth enrolled in the following species: dairy cattle, beef cattle, swine, sheep, and goats. All 4-H exhibitors of these animals will be required to certify in the YQCA program **yearly**. Youth must either attend a face-to-face class or certify on-line via the website: <u>http://yqcaprogram.org</u> ***NOTE NEW WEBSITE!!!***

The YQCA program is for youth ages 8-21. The online version is broken into age divisions as follows: juniors 8-11, intermediate 12-14, senior 15-18, and young adults 19-21. This certification is annual with test out options of 1-3 years. Youth exhibiting swine at the Illinois State Fair and 4-H fairs are no longer required to be PQA plus certified. The cost for the face-to-face training will be \$3 and \$12 for the online version.

Requirements to show at the 4-H Fair

Members must attend **at least 4** club meetings, events, or activities **prior** to the fair to be eligible to participate in the 4-H fair and 4-H auction.

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) is a national multi-species quality assurance program for youth ages 8 to 21 with a focus on three core pillars: food safety, animal well-being, and character development.

YQCA is currently required for those showing: Beef, Goats, Sheep, or Swine

The YQCA training can be done either online or in-person. The cost for the face-to-face training will be \$3 and \$12 for the online version. YQCA website to register: <u>http://yqcaprogram.org</u>

QAEC Requirement (new livestock members)

All 4-H members enrolled in an animal project area are required to complete the online **Quality Assurance** and Ethics course <u>one time</u> in order to stay enrolled in an animal project area.

The certification must be done if you are enrolled in one of the following projects: beef, dairy, cats, dogs, goats, horses, poultry, rabbits, sheep, and swine. Members who don't complete the certification before the show will be removed from the project and not be allowed to show. *Anyone who has already taken the certification does not need to retake the test.*

If you have not been receiving emails with 4-H updates, this is why. Please log into 4honline <u>https://v2.4honline.com/#/user/sign-in</u> to enroll today! The Effingham County Fair Board will be contacting me on May 2 to get the list of active superintendents, leaders, and members. The Fair Board will use the list to issue fair passes so you can enter the fairgrounds for free. Youth who are twelve and under will not be issued a fair pass, since you get into the fairgrounds for free.

Remember! You can enroll in 4-H at any time, however in order for you to exhibit at any of the Effingham County 4-H Exhibition Days, you must be entered in your projects by May 1, 2022. Please take the time to review the 4-H Highlights—Members with Projects as of 3/24/2022 to ensure you are enrolled in 4-H and you are in all the projects you wish to explore.

If you notice missing projects, please email me your list by May 1, 2022. If you are wanting to enroll in Animal Science, be sure to enroll in the species you will be exhibiting. For example: Rabbit Animal Science, you will enroll under Rabbit. Once Fair entry is sent out, you then will select Animal Science under the General Projects Department.

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA)

Mark your calendars for Saturday, May 7, 2022.

Kasey Kemme will be offering the Youth for the Quality Care of Animals program, that is replacing PQA. This program also replaces the Quality Assurance & Ethics (QAEC) program for youth in the following species: dairy cattle, beef cattle, swine, sheep, and goats. All 4-H exhibitors of these animals will be required to certify yearly in the YQCA program for the show season. Youth must either attend a face-to-face class or certify on-line via the website https://yqcaprogram.org/

Effingham County 4-H members need to contact our office to receive your code for payment. You may use this code at any in-person training. You must register at <u>http://yqcaprogram.org</u> for in-person or online training. Online certification is \$12.

Quality Assurance and Ethics Certification (QAEC)

Online ethics certification required for everyone taking 4-H animal projects. All 4-H members enrolled in an animal project area are required to complete either the online Quality Assurance and Ethics course OR the YQCA training in order to stay enrolled in an animal project area. The QAEC certification must be completed if you are enrolled in one of the following projects: cats, dogs, horses, llamas, poultry, and rabbits. This is a one-time certification for your entire 4-H career. The website for the certification is: <u>http://web.extension.illinois.edu/qaec/</u>.



Enrollment deadline program fees to be paid approaching fast!

You can enroll in 4-H at any time, however in order for you to exhibit at any of the Effingham County 4-H exhibition days, you must be entered in your projects by May 1, 2022. You may enroll in the Effingham County 4-H program at https://v2.4honline.com/#/user/sign-in

CODE OF CONDUCT & RISK FORMS

Effingham County 4-H Foundation Recognition Award Guidelines:

- 1. Applicants must be a current member or alumni of an Effingham County 4-H Club.
- 2. Applicants must have been a 4-H member for at least 5 years.
- 3. The application should be typed and the application form must be completed in full.
- 4. Applicants may only receive the \$250 Recognition Award one time.
- 5. Must have been a high school senior or currently enrolled in college 2021-2022.
- 6. Parent and leader signatures are required on application form.

7. The application form and two letters of recommendation (one from a 4-H leader and one from a non-family member such as teacher, employer, or other community leader), should be submitted to the Effingham County Extension office by 4:30 p.m., April 8, 2022. Letter of recommendation should be in a sealed envelope or emailed to logan1@illinois.edu directly from the individual writing the recommendation letter.



Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) is a national multi-species quality assurance program for youth ages 8 to 21 with a focus on three core pillars: food safety, animal well-being, and character development.

YQCA is currently required for those showing: Beef, Goats, Sheep, or Swine

The YQCA training can be done either online or in person. The cost for the face-to-face training will be \$3 and \$12 for the online version. YQCA website to register: <u>http://yqcaprogram.org</u>

QAEC requirement (new livestock members)

All 4-H members enrolled in an animal project area are required to complete the online **Quality Assurance and Ethics course** <u>one time</u> in order to stay enrolled in an animal project area.

The certification must be done if you are enrolled in one of the following projects: beef, dairy, cats, dogs, goats, horses, poultry, rabbits, sheep, and swine. Members who don't complete the certification before the show will be removed from the project and not be allowed to show. *Anyone who has already taken the certification does not need to retake the test.*
