General Information

Enrollment

- Enroll at il.4honline.com by March 15
- For more information about enrollment in the Jasper County 4-H program, please contact the Jasper County Extension office

Fair Entry

- Opens May 1
- Go to fairentry.com to register for specific classes
- If you are unsure if you will be showing, go ahead and register for the class—it is easier to scratch than add after the show starts
- All entries should be submitted by May 31

Ownership, and Tagging Deadlines

- All livestock and small animals must be owned by April 30
- Crossbred & Market animals must be tagged, and paperwork turned in to the Extension office by April 30
- A picture of the tag in the animal's ear must be submitted by April 30
- Every lamb, ewe, and ram is required to have a Scrapie tag
- Lambs born after the tagging date are not required to be tagged with a Jasper Co. tag (they must have a Scrapie tag)
- Animals exhibited at the Illinois State Fair have specific birth & ownership dates; you must follow guidelines listed under the **Illinois State Fair Junior Show** section of the 4-H Handbook

Birthdates

- Purebred Ewe Lamb born after Jan. 1 of current year
- Purebred Ewe born Jan. 1 Dec. 31 of previous year
- Crossbred Ewe Lamb born after Jan. 1 of current year
- Crossbred Ewe born Jan. 1 Dec. 31 of previous year
- Aged Ewe born before Jan. 1 of previous year
- Purebred Ram Lamb born after Jan. 1 of current year
- Market Lamb born after Sept. 1 of previous year

^{*}Market lambs must be ewes or wethers – no stags allowed

Health Guidelines

- Go to the website provided in the back of the 4-H Handbook for a full list of requirements
- Scrapie tags may be ordered through the USDA-APHIS
- To request these official sheep and goat tags, a flock or premises ID or both, call 1-866-USDA-Tag (866-873-2824).

Certified Veterinarian Inspection (CVI)

- CVI's must be completed within 90 days of the 4-H Sheep Show
- CVI papers must be kept at the fairgrounds in case of any questions

Records

- A livestock record must be up to date for each animal species and turned into the Extension office by the Friday before the 4-H Shows.
- Livestock records can be found online at https://extension.illinois.edu/cefj/4-h-jasper-county under the Fairs and Shows tab, or can be picked up at the Extension office

Registration papers

- Any animal shown as a Purebred must have registration papers
- Registration papers must be kept at the fairgrounds in case of any questions

YQCA

- Members enrolled in a Goat project must complete YQCA training every year
- This training can be completed online, or face-to-face trainings are offered in the spring

4-H Shows

- Animals must be on the fairgrounds by 8 a.m. Monday morning prior to the 4-H Shows
- The 4-H member must show his/her own animal (with the exception of the Master Showmanship contest, if the participant does not have a specie needed to show)
- 4-H members may show 2 lambs regardless of weight
- Market lambs must be shorn within 15 days of show

Auction – Sponsored and hosted by the Jasper County 4-H Auction Committee

- The 4-H member must be present to sell their animal and are encouraged to arrive at least 1 hour prior to the auction
- Only Market animals will be sold in the 4-H Auction
- There will be a \$5 auction fee and a \$5 waste disposal fee for Sheep projects. This fee is to be paid when
 registering for the auction. Members who choose not to sell their animal will still be responsible for the waste
 removal fee.
- It is the obligation of the seller to deliver his or her market animal to the place specified by the owner

Jasper County 4-H FAQ sheet – Sheep

Sept – December

- Submit previous year's records to the Extension office (permanent record, livestock record(s), Honor Member form, and general project form, if applicable); Deadline to submit records is Sept. 30
- Enroll in 4-H Online

Jan – Feb

- Pick up Jasper Co. tags & form for crossbred or market animals
- Order Scrapie tags for sheep and goats

March – May

- Pick up Jasper Co. tags & form for crossbred or market animals
- Register online or for an in-person training for YQCA; YQCA must be completed before fair in order to exhibit a sheep project
- Schedule appointment with your veterinarian to complete a CVI (if needed); CVI's are required within 90 days of the show
- Turn in Tagging form & pictures to the Extension office by April 30; families may email a copy of the document and pictures to Katie instead of a printed copy
- Register for 4-H show classes by May 31 at fairentry.com

June

- Fair clean-up (early June)
- State Fair Jr Show registration, must be signed by FFA or Extension staff by July 1
- Have Livestock record up to date and email to Katie by the Friday before the Sheep Show
- Make sure a copy of registration paperwork (for purebred animals) and CVI (if needed) are sent via e-mail to Katie; have paperwork at fair and readily available
- Weigh-in/4-H show/Auction/after fair clean-up

July - August

- Complete livestock records
- Cash checks from the 4-H Auction
- Send Thank You card (cookies, BBQ tickets, etc.) to Award donors and/or Auction buyers

*In order to advance to the Illinois State Fair for general projects, or to sell an animal at the 4-H Auction, members must attend a minimum of 2 meetings and 1 event. For clarification, please contact your 4-H Leader or the Jasper Co.

Helpful Hints to make your show year a success!

- Wear show-appropriate clothing
 - Close toed shoes, preferably boots
 - Long pants
 - Short or long-sleeved shirts
 - No attire promoting business, companies or farm names
- Practice, practice, practice!
 - Work with your animal from beginning of ownership to the show/auction
 - Do a mock show at home with the help of family or friends
- Study up!
 - ➤ Reference your 4-H project book
 - Go to Livestock clinics/workshops
 - > Check out YouTube videos of other sheep shows
- Smile 😊
 - While showing, animals may be difficult—it is a new environment for many animals
 - Try to keep a positive attitude and have fun
 - Keep a relaxed smile as much as possible
 - Make eye contact with the judge (but don't try to start a staring contest)
 - Whenever possible, leave several feet between you and the handler in front of you
 - Calm confidence will be part of your overall presentation
