In Service Join 4-H members and clubs across Illinois and the nation on Saturday, April 25 as part of *True Leaders in Service*! 4-H clubs serve their communities all year long however the month of April has been selected as a time for ALL 4-H clubs to join together to roll up

their sleeves in service to local communities. In the current COVID-19 situation, it is important that we all follow CDC and safety guidelines, but there are still ways to serve safely and practice social distancing – write and mail cards to those who are socially isolated, organize a group online to teach and share something from your 4-H project, sew PPE masks to donate locally. If you have ideas for a statewide, COVID-safe service project, this is a great opportunity to plan and promote something for others to participate in. Send your ideas to Illinois4H@illinois.edu.

The goal of the 4-H True Leaders in Service day is to encourage 4-H members in every county to make a positive difference. Service projects can be done by individuals, by 4-H clubs, or as a countywide service project. No matter what the project is, this will be a day to make a difference.

Foundation Hall of Fame Ceremony

The Illinois 4-H Foundation will honor one volunteer leader from each county at a ceremony during the Illinois State Fair. The celebration begins at 3 p.m. Tuesday, Aug. 18 as part of Ag Day at the fair right before the Sale of Champions activities begin. Supporters and families of the recipients are welcome to attend.

Western Illinois: Saturday, June 13 at Gardner Camp, Hull, IL. Register between April 1 – June 3.

Northern Illinois: Saturday, Sept. 12 at Torstenson Youth Education Center, Pecatonica, IL. Register between July 1 - September 2.

The Illinois 4-H program needs adults willing to serve as mentors and share their passion of shooting sports. Here's what you need to do:

- Contact your local Extension office and complete the required forms and background checks. Most Extension offices cover training fees with 2 year commitment from volunteers. Your local Extension staff will compete your registration.
- Complete a 3-hour online training module at home.
- Attend a 9-hour hands-on field day which runs from 9 AM to 7 PM.
- \$85 fee covers two meals; all equipment and ammunition; on-line curriculum fee; instructors manual; complete full-day individual instruction; and Level I instructor cap.

Look for These Changes at the Illinois State Fair

With the timing of the state fair and the anticipated start of school, the 4-H General Project Show at the state fair has been condensed to three days: Aug. 14, 15, and 16.

- Exhibits must be in place by 9:30 AM and remain on display until 4 PM. (new release time)
- The awards will include **Champion Medals** for the highest score in each project class and **Reserve Medals** for the second highest score in each class. Cash premiums from the state will be paid to the medal winners. **Innovation Awards** will be given to exhibits judges find inspiring, innovative, or creative and are not based on scores. Medal winners cannot receive the innovation award in 2020.
- New projects at the state fair include: Child Development, Leather, Sports Nutrition, Family Heritage, and Shooting Sports
- The **State 4-H Public Speaking Contest** will be held at the same time as the state fair. Youth can compete in a speech and also bring a project to the General Project Show. Youth must be selected in their county contest to advance and will speak the same day as their county exhibit day.
- Ewe lambs are now eligible for the premier show.
- Steers advancing to state fair must be weighed by Feb. 29.
- The junior poultry show begins Monday, Aug. 17.
- The State 4-H Poultry Judging Contest will be held at the state fair on Monday, Aug. 17.
- The junior rabbit show begins Saturday, Aug. 22.

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Hemp Grower Spotlight: Sulcanna

The University of Illinois Extension will continue with their "Grower Spotlight" webinar series on Friday April 17th, 2020 from 9:00AM-10:30AM. This webinar series serves as a platform for our local producers and allow other growers and agribusiness professionals to come together to discuss agriculture. Not only will our featured guests be able to discuss their operations in detail, these programs allow participants to ask questions throughout and gain valuable insight from those with experience.

This edition of University of Illinois Extension's "Grower Spotlight" will be moderated by Phillip Alberti (University of Illinois Extension) and will be focusing on one organization's model for profitability in an uncertain environment. Sulcanna Co occupies an historic manufacturing facility in NW Illinois' Jo Daviess County. Their focus is on hemp horticulture, genetics development, extraction, and product formulation, and they offer marketing, branding, and distribution infrastructure to support farm-branded product sales. Sulcanna has formed Illinois' only agricultural hemp cooperative, which consists exclusively of small scale hemp farmers looking to capitalize on their collective knowledge and tap into CBD and CBG retail price points.

Knowing the ins and outs of this industry before getting involved will be critical to success. The goal of this webinar will be to provide attendees with an overview of the current market structure, economics of hemp production, and what it takes to be profitable in this new industry. Additional topics will include things such as genetics, cultivation practices, compliance testing, harvest, drying, and marketing.

Throughout the educational program, participants will be allowed to contribute to a live Q and A with our guests Lance Larsen, Stacy McKaskill, and Steve Tomlins. 2020 CENSUS IN RURAL ILLINOIS

Why is it so important?

Illinois could lose two congressional seats based on the next census.

Illinois could lose nearly \$1,400 per person, per year, for each person who goes uncounted.

The 2020 Census determines how much money Illinois gets from the federal government. These tens of billions of dollars make up a good portion of Illinois' own budget and fund programs such as Medicaid, highway planning and construction, the National School Lunch Program, and Head Start. If Illinois misses even one percent of its residents in the 2020 Census count, the state will lose at least \$120 million in federal grants every year over the next decade. Be sure to get counted!

Let's get an accurate count!

Our state will benefit from a complete and accurate count. These organizations can share information and encourage folks to respond:

Businesses and chambers of commerce, community service organizations, K-12 education, faith-based organizations, organizations serving agriculture, healthcare facilities, media, and local government.
