





SEEKING 4-H ALUMNI AREA OF EXPERTISE:

The Illinois 4-H Program is developing an exciting new resource for 4-H members and their families called Illinois **4-H Spark Sheets**. Illinois 4-H Spark Sheets will be created for all ninety-one projects that 4-H members can enroll in. Each 4-H Spark Sheet will be a one page resource sheet (front/back) and will focus on a specific project.

During the month of May, extension staff statewide, along with input from their local 4-H families, will be

creating the first draft of all 4-H Spark Sheets. The next step will be to gather input and review from a broader cross-section of people.

That's where our 4-H Alumni can help! We are asking our 4-H alumni to identify your expertise in relation to the 4-H project areas. It might be your career or job, a hobby or passion or maybe a 4-H project that you excelled in as a member.

In early June, we will compile all of the draft 4-H Spark Sheets written by Extension staff and their local teams and send them out to alumni who register. We'll ask you to review the document and suggest input related to:

- Does the content reflect the current industry or subject area?
- What industry or subject area resources should 4-H families be aware of?
- What career opportunities are available in this area?
- What innovative ways is technology utilized?

Are there events sponsored by industry or organizations that would benefit 4-H members?

The review can be done completely via e-mail or possibly by phone or a video conference with a small group of alumni sharing a similar project area interest.

You can [sign up](#) for just one project area, or more, if you'd like. We anticipate that this will take about one hour for a single 4-H Spark Sheet ... it's that simple! **Please respond by Friday, May 22.**


If you could learn to do anything, what would it be? **Not sure, I've tried a lot of different things in my life.**

4-H Shooting Sports Volunteer Certification Field-Day Training Dates:

Western Illinois: Saturday, June 13 at Gardner Camp, Hull, IL. Register between April 1 – June 3.

Northern Illinois: Saturday, Sept. 12 at Torstenson Youth Education Center, Pecatonica, IL. Register between July 1 - September 2.

The Illinois 4-H program needs adults willing to serve as mentors and share their passion of shooting sports. Here's what you need to do:

- Contact your local Extension office and complete the required forms and background checks. Most Extension offices cover training fees with 2 year commitment from volunteers. Your local Extension staff will complete your registration.
- Complete a 3-hour online training module at home.
- Attend a 9-hour hands-on field day which runs from 9 AM to 7 PM.
- \$85 fee covers two meals; all equipment and ammunition; on-line curriculum fee; instructors manual; complete full-day individual instruction; and Level I instructor cap.

The celebration begins at 3 p.m. Tuesday, Aug. 18 as part of Ag Day at the fair right before the Sale of Champions activities begin. STATE 4-H INFORMATION:

Look for These Changes at the Illinois State Fair

With the timing of the state fair and the anticipated start of school, the 4-H General Project Show at the state fair has been condensed to three days: Aug. 14, 15, and 16.

- Exhibits must be in place by 9:30 AM and remain on display **until 4 PM**. (new release time)
- The awards will include **Champion Medals** for the highest score in each project class and **Reserve Medals** for the second highest score in each class. Cash premiums from the state will be paid to the medal winners. **Innovation Awards** will be given to exhibits judges find inspiring, innovative, or creative and are not based on scores. Medal winners cannot receive the innovation award in 2020.
- **New projects** at the state fair include: Child Development, Leather, Sports Nutrition, Family Heritage, and Shooting Sports
- The **State 4-H Public Speaking Contest** will be held at the same time as the state fair. Youth can compete in a speech and also bring a project to the General Project Show. Youth must be selected in their county contest to advance and will speak the same day as their county exhibit day.
- **Ewe lambs** are now eligible for the premier show.
- Steers advancing to state fair **must be weighed by Feb. 29**.
- The **junior poultry show** begins Monday, Aug. 17.
- The **State 4-H Poultry Judging Contest** will be held at the state fair on Monday, Aug. 17.
- The **junior rabbit show** begins Saturday, Aug. 22.

Taking an Animal Project? READ THIS

For members enrolled in dairy cattle, beef cattle, swine, sheep, and goats:

The YQCA is a new livestock quality assurance program that is replacing PQA which no longer exists. All 4-H exhibitors of these animals will be required to certify in the YQCA program each year starting for the 2020 show season. Attend either a face to face class or certify on-line via the website yqca.org The YQCA program is for youth ages 8-21. The online version is broken into age divisions as follows: juniors 8-11, intermediate 12-14, senior 15-18, and young adults 19-21. This certification is needed each year with test out options of 1-3 years. Youth exhibiting swine at the Illinois State Fair and 4-H fairs are no longer required to be PQA plus certified. The estimated cost for the face-to-face training will be \$3 and \$12 for the online version.

For members enrolled in horses, rabbits, poultry, dogs, and cats:

The Quality Assurance and Ethics training is required for youth in horses, rabbits, poultry, dogs and cats. You only need to take it once in your lifetime. Those who don't complete the training will be removed from the animal science project and will not be eligible to exhibit at county fairs. The website is open year round @ web.extension.illinois.edu/qaec/.
NOTE: Youth must be logged on to a computer for this program, either a desktop or laptop; not an iPad or iPhone.
