If you will be weighing beef cattle, please take time to complete the form, and return it to me by <u>January 29.</u> You can mail, fax, scan/email, or hand deliver this form to me. If you enrolled in <u>any</u> of the beef projects, this form has been mailed to you. If you do not receive this mailing, you may find the form on the website at <u>go.illinois.edu/jsw.</u>

This form is required for registration and participation in the Beef Weigh-In and allows us to accurately prepare for the day. If you have any questions, or need further clarification, feel free to call the Extension Office.

If you are planning on exhibiting at the Illinois State Fair or travel across state lines, market beef exhibits must be electronically tagged along with the usual tattoo procedure.

You must also go through the weigh-in if you are planning to exhibit in the rate of gain class.

*All letters and forms were mailed and should have been received. If you did NOT receive this in the mail, you may want to call or email me so I can make sure you are enrolled in the beef project.

Counties will monitor completion of this. Failure to complete QA&E will result in the member's animal science project enrollment being cancelled and they will be ineligible to exhibit at county fairs.

Horse Lease/Ownership Paperwork— All horse paperwork is due on May 1 in the Extension Office. The means you must have own a horse or have one leased by this date.

*You must take NEW pictures. Pictures from previous years have been discarded.

You must turn in the ownership/lease form and completed your guidelines and policies form.

Please keep in mind that you are NOT required to turn in your Coggins at this time. You will be required to have it "in hand" for the 4-H fair or any show/clinic that you participate in, however.

Deadlines

Enrollment, animal ownership, and fair deadlines are just a few of the big ones to keep in mind.

There is always a lot of behind the scenes activity that takes place after deadlines.

Please keep in mind that dead-lines are set to give the 4-Her the most time to "get it done" but not a lot of time for me to get it done!

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) -The YQCA is a new livestock quality assurance program that is replacing PQA which no longer exists. It also replaces the Quality Assurance & Ethics (QAEC) program for youth in the following species: dairy cattle, beef cattle, swine, sheep, and goats. All 4-H exhibitors of these animals will be required to certify in the YQCA program yearly starting for the 2020 show season. Youth must either attend a face to face class or certify on-line via the website https://yqca.learngrow.io/. The YQCA program is for youth ages 8-18 years old. The online version is broken into age divisions as follows: juniors 8-11, intermediate 12-14, and senior 15-18. This certification is annual with test out options of 1-3 years. Youth exhibiting swine at the Illinois State Fair and 4-H fairs are no longer required to be PQA plus certified. The cost for the face to face training will be \$3 and \$12 for the online version.

4-Hers must complete the correct training in order to exhibit at the JDC 4-H Fair. **THIS IS MANDATORY.** Failure to complete the training(s) will result in the member NOT being able to exhibit their livestock project. The deadline to complete each training is **June 1, 2020**.

4-H Extension Staff in our unit (which includes Jo Daviess, Stephenson, and Winnebago Counties) will all be holding a face-to-face training. Members may attend the one offered in Jo Daviess County, however, if that does not fit into your schedule, you may attend one of the other counties' training as well. Only one face-to-face will be offered per county per year.

<u>Stephenson County</u>: Feb. 11, 2020, Freeport Public Library located at 100 E Douglas S., Freeport, IL. This will begin at 5 pm.

<u>Winnebago County</u>: March 7, 2020, Prince of Peace Church located 2336 Freeport Rd, Rockton, IL. This will begin at 9:30 am.

<u>Jo Daviess County</u>: May 3, 2020, JDC Extension Office located at 204 Vine St., Elizabeth, IL. This will begin at 3 pm.

If you are currently enrolled in one of the species listed above, you will be getting a letter and a step-by-step instruction sheet to help you. Please remember, if you plan to take the instructor-led course you must PRE-REGISTER. Payment is due at the time as registration.

You will be required to print your certificate of completion and turn a copy into the Extension Office. Please look over the directions BEFORE jumping in. I have included it for your convenience!

2020 4-H Camp-Registration for 4-H Camp 2019 is open! 4-H Camp is set for **June 8-12 at Rock River Christian Camp in Polo, IL.** Sign up today to get your child in on all of the amazing fun!

4-H Camp is a five-day, four-night residential camping experience that is conducted cooperatively by University of Illinois Extension staff in Boone, Carroll, DeKalb, Jo Daviess, Lee, Ogle, Stephenson, Whiteside and Winnebago Counties and the professional staff at RRCC.

Historically, parents have sent their children to 4-H Camp for a variety of reasons: to have fun, to make new friends, to develop new skills, to be physically active and to appreciate nature.

4-H Camp is about way more than one week of fun. Sending your child to 4-H Camp will allow them to create memories they will carry with them through adulthood. 4-H camp teaches youth to make good decisions, build their self-confidence, become independent and gain the ability to work well with others. These skills will help youth develop into strong adult leaders. In addition, 4-H camp counselors devote much of their personal time to ensure today's campers have the same great experience they did as children.

Campers at 4-H Camp will check-in from 6:00-6:30 p.m. on Monday, June 8 and checkout from 6:00-6:30 p.m. on Friday, June 12. During camp week, youth will engage in a variety of activities designed to challenge, educate and entertain. Two or three free-choice periods will be offered daily and will include options such as hiking, high and low ropes courses, zip lining, arts and crafts, swimming, crate stacking, team building challenges, survival skills, and much more. Evening activities will be provided by the 4-H camp counselors and include campfires, an adventure night and a dance. It is guaranteed to be a blast!

4-H Camp is open to <u>ALL</u> boys and girls, ages 8-14 by June 10. <u>4-H membership is not required</u>; however all participants will be expected to comply with the same high behavior standards expected of 4-Hers. Youth need to be interested and excited to have a week of outdoor fun, away from television and technology.

Cost is \$250 for 4-H members and \$270 for non-4-H members until March 1. After that date, the price goes up \$20.00. All camp fees must be paid in full by May 20. Download a camper application on-line at: https://extension.illinois.edu/jsw/4-h-camp or you can register online at:

-Ralph and Katherine Norris Scholarship—is offered to Jo Daviess County residents studying agriculture or agricultural related fields. The Jo Daviess County Extension & 4-H Foundation is responsible for the selection of the scholarship recipients. Scholarships will be awarded as funds permit.

-Home & Community Education Scholarship - is offered to an individual that meet the following requirements: Three \$250 scholarships will be awarded.

- 1. Must have been a resident of Jo Daviess County for one year and be a High School Senior.
- 2. Must be accepted in an accredited two year or four year college.
- 3. Must have verification of passing grades or grade point from last classes attended.

Due March 31

- <u>-Dalgarn Scholarship</u> has been established to assist a deserving graduating senior, who is an active 4-H member, and attending a four year college. One \$2,000 scholarship is awarded each year.
- -Must be a resident of Jo Daviess County.
- -Must have been active in a Jo Daviess County 4-H Club for minimum of 5 years.
- -Must have demonstrated leadership through school and community activities.
- -Must have letters of recommendation.

The following application material MUST be received no later than March 20. An interview with the selection committee will be scheduled at a later date.

- <u>-DHIA Scholarship</u> is offered to Jo Daviess County, Illinois resident or Jo Daviess County DHIA member family.
- -Must be enrolled in agriculture or agricultural related studies.
- -Preference given to those pursuing a dairy science or related degree.
- -Must be enrolled in a two or four year program. (Dairy Short Course at Madison is approved.)
- -Must be accepted at chosen school, college, or university.
- -Must be full-time student, 12 hours minimum per semester; auditing of classes cannot be included in the minimum.

- <u>-Alice and Floyd Bale Scholarship</u>— is offered to a Jo Daviess County, Illinois resident studying agriculture or agricultural related study.
- -Must be enrolled in agriculture or agricultural related studies


