Dear Friends of Extension and 4-H,

Like many organizations, Illinois Extension has moved to a remote working environment for our county offices. Yesterday, I worked with my staff to ensure that everyone has what they need to connect and work remotely for at least two weeks, with the possibility of extending the time period. Most of us saw this coming and I have to commend everyone for their upbeat attitudes as we moved into this uncharted territory.

We actually started the process of assessing our events and postponing/cancelling them Wednesday afternoon when word came from campus that we needed to cancel the Tri-State Forestry Conference planned for Saturday, March 14. Since that time, staff have been following announcements and directives and responding appropriately.

Like others, we have now postponed our events, workshops and meetings until further notice. Staff are working remotely and are in communication with me, their co-workers, volunteers and others. We will provide information to various groups related to planning meetings, online educational opportunities and other topics. Some programs will be converted to online presentations and information will be shared with the appropriate audiences. We will include as much information as possible and use it to share links to it on our website. Extension has so many online resources; we are excited to share them with people.

My main concern is the health and wellbeing- of our employees, their families, our volunteers and families and the many people involved in our programming. While this situation makes it impossible to connect face to face, we are still able to "talk" via emails and phone calls. Reach out to that staff member you usually work with. They will be happy to discuss issues and answer questions. Staff will be checking office phone messages daily and will respond when they are able. For now, the most effective form of communication is email.

Our thoughts are with everyone in our communities and beyond as we adapt to this "new normal." Please let us know if we can help.

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#### **IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING 4-H PROGRAMMING:** We know

that there are a lot of questions regarding the COVID-19 situation. IL 4-H State and local Extension Staff have been actively reviewing the situation to ensure the safety of all participants and 4-H members.

This email is to confirm the following, in alignment with campus policy: *"All large events (anticipating 50 or more attendees) that are scheduled March 13-May 31 should be cancelled as soon as possible."* 

State and National 4-H events impacted by this new policy include the following:

<u>State 4-H Awards Banquet</u> (March 14) – cancelled. Registration fees will be refunded and award items distributed to county staff at 4-H Regional Meetings in April.

**Speaking for Illinois 4-H Training** (March 21) - will be changed to an online format for a shorter timeframe. See Details in this e-news.

**IL 4-H Horse Speaking and Hippology Contest** (April 18) – The event in Champaign will be cancelled and we are looking at options for online alternatives. Details and announcement forthcoming.

**IL 4-H Horse Bowl Contest** (April 19) – The event in Champaign will be cancelled and we are looking at options for online alternatives. Details and announcement forthcoming.

**Legislative Connection** (May 6-7) - Registration will continue at this time. We will re-evaluate in April.

<u>IL 4-H State Robotics Competition</u> (May 9) – the event in Bloomington-Normal will be cancelled and we are looking at options for online alternatives. Details and announcement forthcoming.

For all 4-H events planned for summer (June-August), the plan is to re-evaluate the status of planned 4-H summer programming and make decision based on information gathered in the next few weeks. 4-H events in this category include but are not limited to:

-4-H Camp -4-H Illini Summer Academies -State Livestock Judging -4-H County Fairs and General Project Shows -County Public Speaking Contests and other competitions

At this point we are not making a central decision about 4-H club meetings and other smaller group gatherings. In these cases, individuals are encouraged to use good judgement and follow public health guidelines to mitigate the spread of the virus. Where possible, consider postponing activities for the next two weeks and/or looking at online options. High risk individuals are encouraged to minimize contact, and individuals with symptoms are asked to stay home.

**SPEAKING FOR ILLINOIS**: This 4-H training will be offered virtually instead of in person which brings a unique opportunity to ALL 4-H members in the state over the age of 14! The registration has been re-opened until Friday at noon and there will be no fee for this event. This is a required training to be able to represent Illinois 4-H at Legislative Connection events.

A few answers to questions you may have are listed below. If you have other questions, please do not hesitate to ask.

- We will be using the Zoom platform for the call. We would like attendees to use a camera when available, this will help with engagement, but is not required. Zoom can be used on your computer or phone. If video capability is unavailable you can still call in via your computer, if internet access is unavailable you may call in via the phone number listed below. The invitation will be directly sent to them upon completing registration.
- The virtual sessions will be offered on <u>Saturday March 21<sup>st</sup> from 9-11 am.</u>
- Registration will be opening back up <u>until Friday at noon</u> so invite others who would be interested!

#### Quality Assurance and Ethics Training— The Quality Assur-

ance and Ethics training is required for all youth that enroll in horse, rabbit, poultry, dog, cavy (quinea pigs), and cat. Members must take the training whether they own a live animal or not. It is advised that they complete this one time as soon as they are enrolled in the project area.

Counties will monitor completion of this. Failure to complete QA&E will result in the member's animal science project enrollment being cancelled and they will be ineligible to exhibit at county fairs.

Horse Lease/Ownership Paperwork – All horse paperwork is due on May 1 in the Extension Office. The means you must have own a horse or have one leased by this date.

#### \*You must take NEW pictures. Pictures from previous years have been discarded.

You must turn in the ownership/lease form and completed your guidelines and policies form.

Please keep in mind that you are NOT required to turn in your Coggins at this time. You will be required to have it "in hand" for the 4-H fair or any show/clinic that you participate in, however.

**SHOOTING SPORTS VOLUNTEERS NEEDED**-Many young people don't have someone to show them how to safely handle a firearm or bow. Think back to the person who taught you to shoot. IF YOU HAVE A GUINEA PIG AND WOULD LIKE TO EXHIBIT IT AT FAIR BE SURE TO CONTACT ME AND WE CAN CHECK TO SEE IF YOU ARE IN THE CORRECT PROJECT. **YOUTH FOR THE QUALITY CARE OF ANIMALS (YQCA)** -The YQCA is a new livestock quality assurance program that is replacing PQA which no longer exists. It also replaces the Quality Assurance & Ethics (QAEC) program for youth in the following species: *dairy cattle, beef cattle, swine, sheep, and goats*. All 4-H exhibitors of these animals will be required to certify in the YQCA program yearly starting for the 2020 show season. Youth must either attend a face to face class or certify on-line via the website <u>https://yqca.learngrow.io/</u>. The YQCA program is for youth ages 8-18 years old. The online version is broken into age divisions as follows: juniors 8-11, intermediate 12-14, and senior 15-18. This certification is annual with test out options of 1-3 years. Youth exhibiting swine at the Illinois State Fair and 4-H fairs are no longer required to be PQA plus certified. The cost for the face to face training will be \$3 and \$12 for the online version.

4-Hers must complete the correct training in order to exhibit at the JDC 4-H Fair. **THIS IS MANDATORY.** Failure to complete the training(s) will result in the member NOT being able to exhibit their livestock project. The deadline to complete each training is <u>June 1, 2020</u>.

If you are currently enrolled in one of the species listed above, you should have received a letter and a step-by-step instruction sheet to help you. Please remember, if you plan to take the instructor-led course you must PRE-REGISTER. Payment is due at the time as registration. Registration is now open. I have the limit set at 40, so spots are limited!

You will be required to print your certificate of completion and turn a copy into the Extension Office. <u>Please look over the directions BEFORE jumping in.</u>

4-H Camp is a five-day, four-night residential camping experience that is conducted cooperatively by University of Illinois Extension staff in Boone, Carroll, DeKalb, Jo Daviess, Lee, Ogle, Stephenson, Whiteside and Winnebago Counties and the professional staff at RRCC.

Historically, parents have sent their children to 4-H Camp for a variety of reasons: to have fun, to make new friends, to develop new skills, to be physically active and to appreciate nature. 4-H Camp is about way more than one week of fun. Sending your child to 4-H Camp will allow them to create memories they will carry with them through adulthood. 4-H camp teaches youth to make good decisions, build their self-confidence, become independent and gain the ability to work well with others. These skills will help youth develop into strong adult leaders. In addition, 4-H camp counselors devote much of their personal time to ensure today's campers have the same great experience they did as children.

Campers at 4-H Camp will check-in from 6:00-6:30 p.m. on Monday, June 8 and checkout from 6:00-6:30 p.m. on Friday, June 12. During camp week, youth will engage in a variety of activities designed to challenge, educate and entertain. Two or three free-choice periods will be offered daily and will include options such as hiking, high and low ropes courses, zip lining, arts and crafts, swimming, crate stacking, team building challenges, survival skills, and much more. Evening activities will be provided by the 4-H camp counselors and include campfires, an adventure night and a dance. It is guaranteed to be a blast!

4-H Camp is open to <u>ALL</u> boys and girls, ages 8-14 by June 10. <u>4-H membership is not re-</u><u>quired</u>; however all participants will be expected to comply with the same high behavior standards expected of 4-Hers. Youth need to be interested and excited to have a week of outdoor fun, away from television and technology.

Cost is \$250 for 4-H members and \$270 for non-4-H members until March 1. After that date, the price goes up \$20.00. All camp fees must be paid in full by May 20. ## 2019-nCoV: What the public should do

The current outbreak of 2019 novel coronavirus (2019-nCoV) was first identified in China but has now spread internationally, impacting an increasing number of countries. Sustained community spread is occurring in China. Limited person-to-person spread, most associated with close contact with a patient with confirmed 2019-nCoV, has been seen outside of China. No community spread of 2019-nCoV has been identified in the United States at this time.

In the coming days and weeks, we expect more confirmed cases in the United States, including some person-to-person spread. The goal of CDC's aggressive ongoing public health response is to prevent spread of 2019-nCoV in in the United States.

#### What you should do

- STAY INFORMED CDC is updating its website daily with the latest information and advice for the public. (<u>www.cdc.gov/ncov</u>)
- REMEMBER TO TAKE EVERYDAY PREVENTIVE ACTIONS that are always recommended to prevent the spread of respiratory viruses.
  - » Avoid close contact with sick people.
  - » While sick, limit contact with others as much as possible.
  - » Stay home if you are sick.
  - » Cover your nose and mouth when you cough or sneeze. Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands; germs spread this way.
  - » Clean and disinfect surfaces and objects that may be contaminated with germs.
  - » Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If soap and water are not available, use an alcoholbased hand rub with at least 60% alcohol.
- IF YOU FEEL SICK with fever, cough, or difficulty breathing, and have traveled to China or were in close contact with someone with 2019-nCoV in the 14 days before you began to feel sick, seek medical care. Before you go to a doctor's office or emergency room, call ahead and tell them about your recent travel and your symptoms.

#### What you should not do

- DO NOT travel to China.
- D0 NOT use facemasks. CDC does not recommend the use of facemasks for the general U.S. public to prevent the spread of 2019-nCoV.
- D0 NOT show prejudice to people of Asian descent, because of fear of this new virus. Do not assume that someone of Asian descent is more likely to have 2019-nCoV.

All persons in the U.S. including those of Asian descent—who have not traveled to China or been in contact with someone with a confirmed or suspected nCoV case in the last 14 days are at low risk of becoming sick.
