



QUALITY ASSURANCE AND ETHICS TRAINING— The Quality Assurance and Ethics training is required for all youth that enroll in <u>horse, rabbit, poultry, dog, cavy (guinea pigs), and cat</u>. Members must take the training whether they own a live animal or not. It is advised that they complete this one time as soon as they are enrolled in the project area.

Counties will monitor completion of this. Failure to complete QA&E will result in the member's animal science project enrollment being cancelled and they will be ineligible to exhibit at county fairs.

<u>HORSE LEASE/OWNERSHIP PAPERWORK</u>— All horse paperwork is due on <u>May</u> <u>1</u> in the Extension Office. The means you must have own a horse or have one leased by this date. *You must take NEW pictures. Pictures from previous years have been discarded.

You must also turn in the ownership/lease form and completed your guidelines and policies form.

Please keep in mind that you are NOT required to turn in your Coggins at this time. You will be required to have it "in hand" for the 4-H fair or any show/clinic that you participate in, however.

YQCA- FOR MEMBERS ENROLLED IN DAIRY CATTLE, BEEF

CATTLE, SWINE, SHEEP, AND GOATS: The YQCA is a new live-stock quality assurance program that is replacing PQA which no longer exists. All 4-H exhibitors of these animals will be required to certify in the YQCA program each year starting for the 2020 show season. This certification is available online only at this time. Each exhibitor must complete this by **June 1**.

Please keep in mind that the YQCA is an educational component to your livestock project and is <u>required</u>. Regardless of the challenges and uncertainties that we are facing, your animal will still end up in the food chain and the industry expectation is that this training has been completed.

If you have any questions regarding this please let me know. You must complete this and submit a copy of your certificate to the Extension Office. You may continue to mail, scan/email, or drop them in our mailbox which is located outside of the our building.

<u>Swine Notch Forms</u> – completed forms are due by <u>June 1.</u>
<u>Fair Entry</u> – fair registrations will open <u>May 18.</u> If you have had time to reflect on your projects and realize you want to add one, contact me soon. Adding public speaking would be a great way to start!

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

The 4-H Everyday Sportsman's Skills Challenge - Level I

Attention 4-H Members who love the outdoors! Here's a challenge to advance your skills. Practice the three skills listed below until they become second nature to you. Now practice them again.

Once you feel confident, contact your 4-H Leader or local 4-H staff person and tell them you're ready to convince them you know your stuff! You'll need to explain the details of these skills with your words; you'll need to show them pictures; you could even make a quick video for them – but it's your job to convince them you've mastered each skill. Your leaders are prepared to test you, so don't think they're not ready for you!

Once your 4-H Leader or local 4-H staff person is convinced, they'll email me your name and county of residence. Then, you can move up a Level and learn more! Your name will be entered once into a random drawing each time you complete a skill level! Ten winners will be drawn on July 15, 2020 for a very high quality 4-H Everyday Sportsman's Multi-Tool (\$50 value) that will last a lifetime!
