

Attention 4-H Swine, Sheep, Goats, Beef and Dairy Show Participants:





I am pleased to announce the release of the 2020 Illinois 4-H Robotics challenge video and document!

On July 16, 1969 we as a civilization accomplished the impossible and sent three brave souls to the moon and back. Over the next 50 years, we have sent rovers to Mars, explored interstellar space with our Voyager 1, and have even put a Tesla into orbit! We now know secrets of the galaxy that were once hidden and have been able view objects that we never thought we could, like a black hole. With the privatization of space, companies have been able to test and develop technologies that will both make commercial space flight a possibility, as well as allow us to go further than we have ever thought we could go. 

Any 4-H members may participate. No pre-qualifying is needed, but you must register at the Extension office by mid-March. Cost is \$3 per entry. You'll share ideas with others as you develop the ability to speak in public about the horse industry and the 4-H Horse project. Learn more @ go.illinois.edu/4Hhorsespeaking. There are 5 divisions

- Original individual formal speech
- **Original individual presentation**: either demonstration (step by step process) or illustrated talk on an idea or topic; both use visual aids.
- **Original team presentation**: either demonstration (step by step process) or illustrated talk on an idea or topic; both using visual aids.
- **Extempore speaking**: topic is selected at the event and participants have 25 minutes to prepare a 4- to 6-minute speech.
- NEW IN 2020: **Interpretive Reading** is the art of reading aloud from a printed page. The reading must be published works that are horse-related. They may be prose, poetry, short stories, play cuttings, narratives, book or review, or theatrical. You should NOT memorize; they are intended to be read from a page.



Industrial Hemp Production Workshop slated for March 24

Freeport, IL----The signing of the Illinois hemp bill has provided opportunities for the cultivation, distribution, and processing of hemp for fiber, grain, and CBD. This versatile cash crop has the potential to empower small farmer, but is not without its own set of challenges regarding planting methods, fertility, harvesting, storage and extraction. To help give some perspective on the lessons learned from the 2019 growing season, University of Illinois Extension will be hosting its 2nd annual "Industrial Hemp Production Workshop" at Highland Community College's Student Conference Center on March 24th, 2020. The workshop will begin at 8:30 and run until 3 p.m.

"We learned a lot this year, but I am not sure that anyone was truly ready for the challenges associated with growing hemp," Extension Educator Phillip

Alberti said. "We are a long way from giving research-based recommendations to our growers on how to grow hemp, start to finish. But what we can do is bring together those who have faced these challenges head on and share their experiences while research programs are developed."

The "Industrial Hemp Production Workshop" will host a wide range of presenters who are involved in the industry, discussing topics such as production challenges, variety selection, greenhouse/indoor propagation, seeding methods, extraction, insurance, and marketing.
