How long have you been a 4-H volunteer? 13 years

How are you involved as a 4-H volunteer? **Organizational** Leader... I also help with 4-H poultry Clinics and

enjoy working events like the Pork Chop Dinner. I enjoy seeing our group achieve their goals with their projects and watching them enjoy the rewards at the fair and other competitions.

Were you involved in 4-H as a child? If so, how many years (approximately)? I was not involved as a kid. My parents raised my brother and I to have a love for livestock. We dairy farmed, but didn't raise purebred show stock. We had dairy, hogs, and sheep. I spent many days at the fair watching my friends and extended family show. Glad we had the chance to encourage our kids and now our club members to be involved.

What does 4-H mean to you? I didn't think about it being more than livestock when I was a kid, but there are endless chances in 4-H for young people to develop amazing skills. Our daughters showed sheep, but they also learned great communication skills, how to work with others, responsibility, commitment and so much more. To me, 4-H is a place for every kind of young person. No matter what a kid's interest or ability is, there is a place for them in 4-H.

What is your favorite 4-H memory/ story? My favorite memories involve our quiet girls as Clover Buds being taken under the wings of older members and watching them grow from scared kids who could barely talk to judges to confident young people. Seeing kids working together and helping each other show animals in the sheep barn will always be great memories. Jane Hendrickson was the Florence Crickets Org. Leader when our kids started and she did a great job of helping them develop confidence. We have lots of great memories of meeting nights at the Hendrickson's home.

What is your favorite indoor/outdoor activity? Working with livestock and being involved with our church are my favorite involvements.

Tell us something about you that might surprise us. I love history and conservative politics and have had the chance to travel to some amazing historic sights in the US.

If you could learn to do anything, what would it be? My brother was a great mechanic. I wish I had that ability so I wouldn't have to depend on others to take care of our vehicles!

What advice would you give to someone just starting out in 4-H? I try to tell new members 4-H will give them the opportunity to learn more and share what they know about something they really like. I advise them to start out with just one or two projects they will love to spend time on and talk about. It's easy to develop great communication skills if you are sharing about things you are passionate about. In today's social media world, knowing how to communicate with others at work and within our families is incredibly important.

Any 4-H members may participate. No pre-qualifying is needed, but you must register at the Extension office by mid-March. Cost is \$3 per entry. - Original individual formal speech
- **Original individual presentation**: either demonstration (step by step process) or illustrated talk on an idea or topic; both use visual aids.
- **Original team presentation**: either demonstration (step by step process) or illustrated talk on an idea or topic; both using visual aids.
- **Extempore speaking**: topic is selected at the event and participants have 25 minutes to prepare a 4- to 6-minute speech.
- NEW IN 2020: Interpretive Reading is the art of reading aloud from a printed page. The reading must be published works that are horse-related. They may be prose, poetry, short stories, play cuttings, narratives, book or review, or theatrical. You should NOT memorize; they are intended to be read from a page.

- Contact your local Extension office and complete the required forms and background checks. The local office will complete your registration.
- Complete a 3-hour online training module at home.
- Attend a 9-hour hands-on field day which runs from 9 AM to 7 PM. Check your local office to see if assistance is available for the \$85 fee. Training dates for 2020 are:

Southern Illinois: Saturday, March 28 at Tombstone Gun Range, Marion. Register by March 18.

Western Illinois: Saturday, June 13 at Gardner Camp, Hull. Register by June 3.

Northern Illinois: Saturday, Sept. 12 at Torstenson Youth Education Center, Pecatonica. Register by September 2.

New Certification Required for Youth Exhibiting Livestock


