DO'S & DON'TS of 4-H

<u>DO'S:</u>

- •DO take time to learn about 4-H, what it stands for, and how it operates.
- •DO advise your son or daughter in selecting 4-H projects. Help them select a project they are interested in, have the ability to accomplish, and one for which you can help furnish needed materials, facilities, financing, and guidance.
- •DO keep in mind that the most important goal of 4-H is personal growth of the individual.
- •DO help your youth see the progress they have made and knowledge they have gained and not just focus only on the end result. Give them encouragement when they succeed and even more when they fail. Judging events are all about learning, not the awards. Whatever ratings are given or scores received, help your child to see progress made, things learned, goals that have been reached and areas to focus on in the future.
- •DO volunteer your hobbies and talents to 4-H leaders and 4-H youth.
- •DO keep informed of 4-H deadlines, activities, and events by taking the time to read the monthly newsletters, emails, Facebook posts, or whatever method of communication between the Extension Office is with the families.
- •DO help youth by guiding and supporting them, not by doing their project for them so they can develop their own life skills. This may include some bumps and bruises along the way, but in the end the 4-H member will be better off if they know that the 4-H project was their own work!
- •DO ASK QUESTIONS! 4-H has its own culture and language, so don't be afraid to ask questions.

DON'TS:

- •DON'T do your child's projects for them, even though you may be able to do it faster, better, simpler ,and with much less mess. Remember 4-H is Learning By Doing.
- •DON'T discourage a child's enthusiasm by providing too much corrective influence or criticism.
- •DON'T let the desire to win overpower your child's ability to learn. Do keep in mind that the 4-H experience should be an educational one.
- •DON'T schedule family outings which constantly conflict with your child's 4-H schedule.
- •DON'T view your child as an extension of yourself. Don't view his/her success or failure as a reflection of your ability or worth.
- •DON'T assume your child is always right.
- •DON'T be disrespectful to the judges when your child didn't get the award or color of ribbon you thought they should have received. Remember, the judge's opinion is just one person's opinion.

Life at 4-H Camp

We are very thrilled to announce that we will be hosting 4-H Camp - day camps this year! While we are unable to host an overnight due to COVID policies, we are excited to host three days of 4-H Day camp. These three days will give campers a similar experience to past 4-H camp without the overnight. We will again be attending Rock River Christian Camp, in Polo, Illinois. 4-H Day Camp will offer a variety of safely-led activities such as: archery, crate stacking, arts and crafts, hiking, zip-line, team building and large group games, as well as end each day with a camp evening program.

4-H Camp is open to a total of 75 youth each day that are between the ages 8-14 by June 15, 2021. Campers do not have to be a 4-H member to attend 4-H Camp. Youth may choose to attend, one, two or all three days for 4-H day camp. Camp runs from 9:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. with check-in and check-out procedures.

Camp Location

4-H Camp is at Rock River Christian Camp in Polo, IL. Rock River Christian Camp has 94 acres that have been transformed over the years into a beautiful facility for youth and adults.

Staff at RRCC are certified in First Aid, CPR and AED. There is a qualified first aid person at camp at all times. Workshop Descriptions:

Food Justice & 4-H - As a result of recent social movements, more youth are using their voices to promote food justice and influence positive change. In this session, you will learn how you can act on food justice issues in your community and in your own social networks.

How You Can Change Your Food System - Every day we make decisions that impact our food system. In this session, you will learn about how our food system functions and the power that you have to create change through the choices you make.

Food Choices and Personal Wellness - The food choices can play a big role in your health and wellbeing. In this session, you will learn about how you can leverage your food choices to help you live your best life.

Addressing Food Insecurity in Illinois - Food insecurity rates have increased in Illinois due to the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic. Food Advocacy and Civic Leadership - The process of making changes in your community can be difficult but also rewarding. In this session, you will hear about the challenges and opportunities of engaging in the civic process to promote food security and food access for all.

Food Security and Community Health - Having reliable access to healthy food is an essential part of living a healthy life. In this session, you will learn from experts in the field of food and nutrition about how food security can impact the health of an entire community.

Careers in Food Systems - Whether it's food production, distribution, marketing, safety, transportation, science, and research, or service and sales, there are many career opportunities in the world of food systems. In this session, you will have the opportunity to imagine a future for yourself and hear from people who have dedicated their careers to securing our food system.

Puerto Rico Food Security Challenge - Puerto Rico has had many challenges to its food system as a result of natural disasters and climate change. In this session, you will learn how Puerto Rico leaders are engaging with youth on the island to creatively address issues of food security through hands-on learning.

Sustainable Agriculture - Producing food to equitably feed our planet's growing population is one of the great challenges facing agriculture worldwide. In this session, you will engage in an important discussion around how we can continue to produce food in a way that responsibly stewards the earth's resources while addressing the challenges of climate change.

Food Advocacy and Youth Action in Brazil - Young people around the world are taking on the challenge of food insecurity. In this session, you will connect with leaders from the Federal Institute of Mato Grosso do Sul who are working to support service-learning projects and youth advocacy in Brazil.

Technology and Food Production - We know that food production is an art as well as a science. In this session, you will learn about the important role which STEM skills play in ensuring a secure food future for everyone.
