Materials Needed:

1" x 2" piece of lumber at least 8" long (Note: The actual dimensions of the 1" x 2" will be

approximately 3/4" and

1" x 4" at least 18" long 1" long finishing nails 80 or 120 grit sandpaper



Building a Letter Holder

- ☐ Obtain the following pieces of lumber: 1" x 2" at least 8" long (base) 1" x 4" at least 18" long (sides)
- ☐ Check the lumber for squareness
 - 1" x 2" = at least one end must be square
 - -1" x 4" = at least one end must be square
- Square ends of lumber if necessary. Remember that you can square the end of a board using a wood file or rasp. If the end is very unsquare you may wish to cut off a small piece.

Prepare lumber for cutting by measuring and marking each piece:

1" x 2" — measure 6" from the square end and mark.

1" x 4" — measure 6" from the square end (NOTE: after cutting off the first piece vou will need to repeat this step for the second piece).

For rounder corners on the sides (picture 1) of the letter holder, use a rasp on the top and then re-sand.
