LIVESTOCK & HORSE RECORD BOOKS

Record Books should be shown and signed by your leader at your May, June, or July club meeting before the fair. (Horses-prior to May 4-H Horse Show.)

*NEW: Members must complete a livestock record book in 2023 to be eligible to sell in 2024, except for new members.

The PDF versions of the books are found here: https://go.illinois.edu/LivestockRecord They may be filled in on your computer, or you may print them off and fill it in by hand (neatly).

The Instruction Guide is found here: https://go.illinois.edu/LivestockRecord Guide to help you fill out the book.

Books are due to the Extension office by September 15 for evaluation.

LIVESTOCK AUCTION

To participate in the youth livestock auction, sponsored by the Monroe Co. Extension & 4-H Education Foundation, youth must meet the following requirements:

- Be a 4-H or FFA member age 8-19 on or before Sept. 1 of the previous year.
- Be a Monroe County resident and/or reside within the Waterloo, Columbia, Valmeyer, or Red Bud school districts.
- Be a Monroe County 4-H club and/or FFA Chapter member in the Waterloo, Columbia, Valmeyer, or Red Bud school districts.
- Attend at least <u>four meetings</u> during the 4-H year.
- Give a talk or demonstration.
- Enroll in 4-H by January 1, 2023.
- All livestock project members must show an in-progress Livestock Record Book to their Leader at their May, June, or July Club meeting prior to the county fair.
- *NEW: Members must complete a livestock record book in 2023 to be eligible to sell in 2024, except for new members.
- *NEW: Exhibitors may sell TWO of any species, beef, sheep, swine, goat, rabbit, poultry, or dairy basket.
- *NEW: Dairy cattle and dairy goat exhibitors showing two or more dairy animals are eligible to auction a dairy basket of products or certificates with a minimum value of \$50.
- If a 4-H or FFA member receives Grand Champion and/or Reserve Champion in any specie area, they will have the opportunity to sell the Grand or Reserve Champion regardless of the number of other species they plan to sell, as long as all of the additional sale requirements are met.

Thank you to all of the 4-H Clubs who generously donated "Birthday Bags" for the House of Neighborly Services.



ILLINI SUMMER ACADEMIES



Valerie Branson, member of the Golden Eagles 4-H Club, attended the 4-H Illini Summer Academies (ISA), June 25-29 at University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign. ISA provides a rich career exploration experience while showcasing University of Illinois as the college of choice for youth in Illinois.

The goal is to give youth a high-definition glimpse of the college experience within a particular field of study, including staying in a dorm on campus.

Valerie attended the "Work Hard, Play Hard Academy" to learn about health careers and research in the areas of community health, kinesiology, speech and hearing sciences, interdisciplinary health sciences, and recreation sport, and tourism. Activities include participating in cutting-edge research laboratories and technology, administering CPR, applying a tourniquet, talking with Illinois graduates, developing leadership skills, visiting innovative campus sites, and working with Illini Service Dogs.



NATIONAL 4-H CONGRESS



National 4-H Congress will be held November 24-28, 2023, in Atlanta, Georgia. National 4-H Congress is a world-class event that is diverse, authentic, and challenge oriented. The workshops will be laser-focused on the 4-H mission, and the service-learning experiences promise to be hands-on; the speakers will be engaging and entertaining, and plenty of opportunities for networking and recreational activities.

This once-in-a-lifetime opportunity is open to 4-H teens ages 14-18 (as of January 1, 2023).

How do teens become a part of the Illinois 4-H Delegation:

Illinois Extension

- 1. Complete the National Congress Application by August 1, 2023.
- 2. We have spots for TEN Illinois 4-H teens to participate. National Congress Application will be used to select the ten Illinois teens. The Illinois 4-H Foundation has secured scholarship funds for the ten selected delegates.
- 3. Cost The total cost this year is \$2,000 per participant. Selected youth will receive a \$1,500 scholarship for the event provided by Illinois 4-H. They are responsible for the remaining \$500 balance, which must be paid by September 1. Once selected and approved in ZSuite for this event, they can log in to pay the balance. Staff will receive the list of selected applicants; if your county wishes to pay their deposit, we can coordinate it at that time.
