What do you do on the day of Show-A-Rama?

- 1. Arrive at Immanuel Lutheran Church Hall (522 S. Church St., Waterloo) between 8:30 and 10:00 a.m.
- 2. Sign in with 4-H staff in your appropriate project categories and attach your show tag to your project. (You may then have to wait until your iudge is available.)
- 3. A 4-H staff member will tell you when it is your turn; then, you will talk to a judge about what you learned about your project.
- 4. The judge will award a Blue, Red, or White ribbon after the judging is completed. They will also make selections for State Fair Representative or alternate after all judging is complete.
- 5. Public viewing of projects will be open at 12:30 p.m., with a short Project Recognition at 12:45 p.m., where winners will be announced, and photos will be taken.
- 6. Projects may be taken home at 1:00 p.m.

4-H SHOW REQUIREMENTS

Remember that to show projects at the County and State levels, you must meet the following requirements:

- Attend at least four meetings during the 4-H year.
- Give a talk or demonstration at a 4-H club meeting.
- Enroll in 4-H by January 1, 2024.
- All livestock project members must show an in-progress Livestock Record Book to their Leader at their May, June, or July Club meeting prior to the county fair AND complete their book by September 15.

HOOFBEATS COMPETITION TEAM YEAR IN REVIEW

The Monroe County Hoofbeats Competition Team has had another successful year of equine-related competitions, starting in November with the Eastern National 4-H Roundup held at the North American International Livestock Expo in Louisville, KY. The competition team had three senior members who qualified for the National contest. Maya and Sydney Woodard represented Illinois in the Horse Bowl Competition. Madelynn Mohr represented Illinois in the Horse Judging Contest. The Illinois Horse Bowl Team placed 4th in the nation. The Horse Judging Team placed in the top 5 of each of their respective categories, earning 5th place overall. Maya, Sydney, and Madey enjoyed their time and experience at this national contest.

The competition season picked back up this Spring with the State Horse Judging Contest at Blackhawk East in Kewanee, IL. The Junior Team earned 4th place overall. Individual Junior Nora Moore placed 4th out of 50 junior competitors. The Senior Team members also did well, with Maya Woodard earning 1st place and Sydney earning 4th place overall in the Senior Division. The Woodards will be invited to try out for the National Team this summer.

April brought the Regional and State Horse Bowl and Hippology contests on back-to-back weekends. These contests evaluate general horse knowledge.

The Regional Contest was held in Carbondale. In Hippology, Mallory Paur earned 1st place, and Cece Cox earned 4th in the junior division; Intermediates Nora Moore and Julia Muertz earned 2nd and 11th. Seniors Sydney and Maya Woodard earned 1st and 4th. The junior horse bowl team went undefeated in their round-robin contest.

Wrapping up the season was the State Horse Bowl, Hippology, and Speech Contest located at the University of Illinois. In the speech contest, Nora Moore earned 1st in Extemporaneous and 4th in Prepared Speech. Junior members Mallory Paur and Cece Cox earned 2nd and 15th place in Hippology. In Intermediate Hippology, Nora Moore and Julia Muertz earned 6th and 25th place, and in Senior Hippology, Sydney Woodard and Maya Woodard earned 5th and 9th. The Junior Horse Bowl Team finished 4th overall in the state.

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LIVESTOCK & HORSE RECORD BOOKS

Record Books should be shown and signed by your leader at your May, June, or July club meeting before the fair. (Horses-prior to May 4-H Horse Show.)

*NEW: Members must have completed a livestock record book in 2023 to be eligible to sell in 2024, except for new members or members not previously in that project.

Books are due to the Extension office by September 15 for evaluation.

YOUTH LIVESTOCK AUCTION

To participate in the youth livestock auction, sponsored by the Monroe Co. Extension & 4-H Education Foundation, youth must meet the following requirements:

- Be a 4-H or FFA member age 8-19 on or before September 1 of the previous year.
- Be a Monroe County resident and/or reside within the Waterloo, Columbia, Valmeyer, or Red Bud school districts.
- Be a Monroe County 4-H club and/or FFA Chapter member in the Waterloo, Columbia, Valmeyer, or Red Bud school districts.
- Attend at least four meetings during the 4-H year.
- Give a talk or demonstration.
- Enroll in 4-H by January 1, 2024.
- All livestock project members must show an in-progress Livestock Record Book to their Leader at their May, June, or July Club meeting prior to the county fair.
- Members must complete a livestock record book for the previous year, with the exception of new members.
- Exhibitors may sell TWO of any species, beef, sheep, swine, goat, rabbit, poultry, or dairy basket.
- Dairy cattle and dairy goat exhibitors showing two or more dairy animals are eligible to auction a dairy basket of products or certificates with a minimum value of \$50.
- If a 4-H or FFA member receives Grand Champion and/or Reserve Champion in any species area, they will have the opportunity to sell the Grand or Reserve Champion regardless of the number of other species they plan to sell, as long as all of the additional sale requirements are met.
