4-H COVID Update

Thank you so much for your continued support this past year as we made the necessary changes to protect thehealth of our 4-H community. This summer, we are excited to be able to return to inperson versions of our events!

In line with the latest guidelines from campus, the following will be in place on or before June 30th at all 4-H events:

The university will no longer require fully vaccinated people to wear face coverings or practice social

distancing indoors or outdoors. "Fully vaccinated" means 14 days after your final dose.

- Face coverings for youth under 12 and people who are not fully vaccinated will be required indoors.
- Masks may be removed outdoors only when it is possible to maintain social distance of at least 6 feet.
- These policies are grounded in the honor code. Participants will self-identify as vaccinated or

unvaccinated; staff will not verify vaccination status for staff, youth, families, or volunteers. The 4-H

program teaches youth the values of honesty and integrity and this is a chance for us all to model andrepresent those principles. Youth will continue to pay attention to not only our words, but also ouractions.

We know this has been a year of making painful sacrifices to help stop the spread of a global pandemic, and we

are humbled by the care you have taken to keep each other safe. Last summer, in the midst of the pandemic, we

successfully moved to a virtual version of 400+ 4-H showcase events. As we go forward into this next phase,

we know we will continue to be stronger together, whatever comes our way.

We will keep aligning with CDC, IDPH, and campus guidelines and will update you on any changes. We are looking forward to seeing you this summer at 4-H events!



4-H & FFA LIVESTOCK AUCTION UPDATE

The Monroe County Extension & 4-H Education Foundation and the Youth Livestock Auction Committee are in the process of planning the 2021 Livestock Auction for local youth.

The group is exploring various options with the hope of a live auction; however, virtual plans are being considered if the need arises. One main consideration of the committee is being mindful of current economic conditions and the impact some of our local businesses have faced. We understand that some businesses and community members who have historically supported 4-H and FFA members in the past may not be in a financial position to participate in the auction this year.

With this in mind, the committee decided each youth will be limited to selling only <u>ONE</u> animal to reduce the total number of animals being auctioned this year.

NEW IN 2021: Livestock exhibitors will now be paid premiums for <u>TWO</u> livestock entries per class number. Previous year rules allowed for exhibition of two entries per class, however, premiums were only paid for one entry.
