## **Rules and Guidelines**

For questions about this scholarship and/or the application call the Kendall County Extension Office at 630/553-5823. *Please return to the Extension Office by September 15*.

- 1. The recipient must be first year college or trade school student or graduating high school senior planning to enter college or trade school the following school year.
- 2. The recipient must be at least a five (5) year Kendall County 4-H member, past or present.
- 3. The scholarship will be awarded on a combined basis of need and merit, based on a written application. Indicate special need on application.
- 4. The recipient may enter any college or trade school of his/her choice in any degree program of his/her choice.

## 5. Students may receive scholarship only once.

- 6. The scholarship will be paid directly to the student after proof of enrollment.
- 7. Return application to: *Kendall County 4-H Foundation, 7775B IL Route 47, Yorkville, Illinois 60560. Incomplete applications will not be considered.*
- 8. The scholarship funds will be held by the Kendall County Foundation and awarded by a selection committee composed of at least two (2) representatives of the Kendall County Foundation and two (2) representatives from the 4-H Foundation.
- 9. The scholarship does not have to be awarded annually, contingent on availability of qualified applicants and available funds.
- 10. Only the available interest from the scholarship fund will be used and not the principle. The scholarship will be a maximum of \$500.00, if awarded.
- 11. If the recipient does not enter college or trade school after receiving the scholarship, the money will be returned to the Kendall County Foundation.
- 12. Applications are available at the 4-H Office and at the guidance counselor's offices in the Kendall County high schools.
