# New certification required for youth exhibiting livestock

4-H members exhibiting animals entering the food production system will be required to complete the **Youth for the Quality Care of Animal** certification (YQCA). It will replace former trainings: PQA and QAEC. This program is the industry-standard certification. Check with local offices about completing the training. **The training must be completed each year**.

Horses, dogs, and cats will still be required to take the **Quality Assurance and Ethics** (QAEC) training. This training is only required once in the member's career. More information will be given in a later newsletter.

# Register online for 4-H!

Registration is now open for the 2019-2020 4-H year at https://il.4honline.com. Use your email address and password you used to enroll last year. If you can't remember your password, just click the forgot password and a new one will be assigned to you. If you can't remember what email you used please contact the Extension office and we can look it up for you. There are a few reminders to re-enrolling this year please see the list below:



- 1. Your projects you had last year are still listed. If you want to continue to take that project leave them there. If not, please <u>delete them</u>. All livestock projects will not have a number after them, so please <u>delete them</u> and select the project again. (example Dog 1 is now just Dog). Some projects are no longer being offered, and there are new projects (please look on page 4 in the newsletter for those listings).
- 2. After you have selected your project, please make sure to check the drop down box for a manual (only if you need it for your project).
- There is <u>not</u> a \$20 program fee, again, this year. Please continue through the invoicing process and check the box that says 4-H Check.
- 4. If you are a new members, or you have not previously filled out a Risk and Liability Form, one will be mailed to you. You can also pick one up at the office or find this form on our website.
- 5. Deadline for Re-enrollment is **DECEMBER 1, 2019.**

# When thinking about projects or club shirt designs make sure you are understanding copyright and trademark laws.

When an author, musician, designer, or artist creates something, it is immediately protected by copyright or trademark laws and other people can't use it or create something similar. Original works such as stories, music, pictures, plays, dances, sculpture, movies, and architecture are protected. 4-H members should use caution when working on a speech, display, or exhibit so you don't use something that doesn't belong to you.

4-H members can't draw or copy someone else's design, logo, words, or music without the permission of the original owner. That means, you can't draw a logo (such as Ford or John Deere) and use it on your exhibit. You can't create Mickey Mouse ears on your cake. You can't draw a Disney princess. You can't put SpongeBob image on your natural resource project exhibit board.

Think of it like this. You wouldn't take your neighbor's bike and ride it around to make your life easier without getting permission first. That would be stealing. When you take words, art, graphics, or photographs that aren't yours but use them like they are, that's stealing, too. Copying them from the internet is the same as stealing them unless you are using a site specifically created for free use of images.
