

# 2020 Virtual 4-H Livestock – Wabash County

For all *Beef, Dairy, Goat, Sheep, and Swine* classes, you will be uploading a video and pictures as follows:

- Upload an approximately 60 second video: This will be a continuous video, showing 15 seconds showing the right side of the animal, 15 seconds showing the left side of the animal, 15 seconds showing the front of the animal, and 15 seconds showing the rear of the animal moving.
  - At beginning of your video, hold up a completed livestock exhibitor card to the camera for five seconds before proceeding with the rest of the video.
- Upload still photos: 1 photo of the right side of the animal, 1 photo of the left side of the animal, 1 photo of the front of the animal, and 1 photo of the back of the animal. For dairy animals, also upload a close-up photo of the udder.
  - For market beef animals, the exhibitor will also need to upload a picture of their animal's tattoo and EID button

For all *Poultry* classes, you will be uploading photos as follows:

• Upload still photos: 1 photo of the right side, 1 photo of the left side, 1 close-up photo of the head, 1 close-up photo of the tail feathers, 1 close-up photo of the wing feathers, 1 close-up photo of the foot. The photos will be uploaded when you register your projects in the fairentry.com system, so make sure to have them ready when you go in to register. For the breeding classes (see "Poultry" section below), you will take and upload two separate sets of pictures for the male and female.

For all *Rabbit* classes, you will be uploading photos as follows:

Upload 1 still photo of each rabbit: Rabbit should be "posed" as best as you can. For information on posing, see this helpful document from the American Rabbit Breeders Association (ARBA): <a href="https://arba.net/wp-content/uploads/2019/02/PosingSpring2014.pdf">https://arba.net/wp-content/uploads/2019/02/PosingSpring2014.pdf</a>. This document shows you how to pose different types of rabbits. Just do the best you can. For more information regarding posing, contact Wabash County 4-H Rabbit Superintendent Michelle Potts. Your photos should be close-ups. For the Pair of Rabbits class (see the "Rabbits" section below), you will take and upload two separate pictures of the male and female.

The photos will be uploaded in the fairentry.com system when you register your projects, so make sure you have them ready when you go in to register. *Exhibitors will be responsible for determining their market animals' weights and submitting them in the system when they register.*

- Exhibitor should show to the camera as if it were the judge.
- Hold phone camera horizontally from a distance that best captures the entire animal and exhibitor. The camera person should not move or very little. Use very little, if any, zooming in and out.
- Please wear proper dress/show attire.

Once completed, exhibit photos/videos and awards will be posted for public viewing. This is a requirement for Ag Premium Eligibility. Remember that Ag Premium awards are subject to modification or cancellation in any year for which the General Assembly fails to make an appropriation to fund the premiums." (30 ILCS 120/14(d))

# Purebred Breeding Classes

- 1. Purebred Cow 2 years and older
- 2. Purebred Heifer 1 year and under 2 years
- 3. Purebred Heifer Under 1 year, over 6 months
- 4. Purebred Bull Calf Under 1 year, over 6 months
- 5. Purebred Heifer/Bull Calf Under 6 months (must be from owner's project cow)

# **Commercial Breeding Classes**

- 1. Commercial Cow 2 years and older
- 2. Commercial Heifer 1 year and under 2 years
- 3. Commercial Heifer Under 1 year, over 6 months

#### **Purebred Breeding Classes**

- 1. Purebred Cow 2 years and older
- 2. Purebred Heifer 1 year and under 2 years
- 3. Purebred Heifer Under 1 year, over 6 months
- 4. Purebred Bull Calf Under 1 year, over 6 months
- 5. Purebred Heifer/Bull Calf Under 6 months (must be from owner's project cow)

#### **Commercial Breeding Classes**

- 1. Commercial Cow 2 years and older
- 2. Commercial Heifer 1 year and under 2 years
- 3. Commercial Heifer Under 1 year, over 6 months
- 4. Commercial Bull Calf Under 1 year, over 6 months
- 5. Commercial Heifer/Bull Calf Under 6 months (must be from owner's project cow)

# **GOATS:**

- 1. Kid Raising Any breed, born on or after January 1 of current year
- 2. Dairy Goats Does over 1 year of age
- 3. Dairy Goats Does over 6 months, under 1 year of age
- 4. Meat Goats Does over 1 year of age
- 5. Meat Goats Does over 6 months, under 1 year of age
- 6. Novelty Goats Does over 1 year of age
- Market Wether Less than 45 pounds any breed born on or after January 1, current year
- Market Wether 45 pounds or more any breed born on or after January 1, current year
- 9. Market Wether born before January 1, 2019

#### **Breeding Classes**

1. 2 Breeding Chickens (1 male and 1 female – separate pictures for each)

- 3. 2 Breeding Ducks (1 male and 1 female separate pictures for each)
- 4. 2 Breeding Geese (1 male and 1 female separate pictures for each)

### **Market Classes**

- 1. 1 Market Chicken
- 2. 1 Market Turkey
- 3. 1 Market Duck
- 4. 1 Market Goose

# **RABBITS:**

- 1. Pair of Rabbits (1 male and 1 female separate picture for each)
- 2. 1 Market Rabbit
- 3. Individual Rabbit (*Exhibitors showing in this class may not show at all in the other two rabbit classes.*)

# SHEEP:

#### **Purebred Breeding Classes**

- 1. Purebred Ewe Lamb Under 6 months
- 2. Purebred Ewe Lamb Under 1 year, over 6 months
- 3. Purebred Ewe Over 1 year
- 4. Purebred Ram Lamb Under 6 months

# **Commercial Breeding Classes**

- 1. Commercial Ewe Lamb Under 6 months
- 2. Commercial Ewe Lamb Under 1 year, over 6 months
- 3. Commercial Ewe Over 1 year
- 4. Commercial Ram Lamb Under 6 months

#### **Market Classes**

- 1. Single Market Lamb (no rams) (the market class will be divided into light, medium, and heavy weight classes)
  - Market lambs will be broken down into three classes determined by weight. Exhibitors
    may have one market lamb per these market weight classes. If an exhibitor has multiple
    market animals to enter in fairentry.com, they should just choose random weight
    classes to put them in for now. For example, if the exhibitor has two market lambs to
    enter, they should enter one each of them in any two of the market weight classes, and
    Extension staff will rearrange them by weight later.

#### SWINE:

#### **Breeding Classes**

- 1. Boar Under 6 months
- 2. Gilt Under 6 months
- 3. Litter of 4 (no barrows) Under 6 months

#### **Market Classes**

- Single Market Pig (may be barrow or gilt not shown in gilt classes) born on or after January 1, 2020
  - Market pigs will be broken down into multiple classes determined by weight. Exhibitors
    may have one market pig per these market weight classes. If an exhibitor has multiple
    market animals to enter in fairentry.com, they should just choose random weight
    classes to put them in for now. For example, if the exhibitor has three market pigs to
    enter, they should enter one each of them in any three of the market weight classes,
    and Extension staff will rearrange them by weight later.
