Please refer to last year's showbook (https://go.illinois.edu/logan4h — under the 4-H Shows heading) or contact the office to find out deadline dates for specific project enrollment (some animal/livestock have early in the year enrollment deadlines). You should be enrolled in the animal curriculum area of Dairy and Goats (if you have State Fair Milking Does) by 1/1/2021. Beef Cow 4-H members also should be enrolled by 1/1/2021. Beef Steer project members need to be enrolled by 2/1/2021. All other species and any other project areas last day to enroll is March 1, 2021 — NO exceptions!! If you are not enrolled in your project areas by the dates above, you may not exhibit the project at 4-H shows.

State Fair Livestock Program

LAMBS for the 2021 Illinois State Fair Premiere (Carcass – Wethers OR EWE lambs) programs will need to be weighed, tattooed, and tagged in each Extension Unit (spring date/location TBD). Live lambs/goats for State Fair will use self-nomination process as was implemented previously – completion of form and close-up photo of scrapie ear tags - turned in to Extension Office. STEERS will need to be electronically tagged as well as tattooed (see additional Steer Tattoo Date article). Call the 4-H office (732-8289) to make an appointment for BARROWS.

BEEF STEER TATTOO DATE – Feb. 6, 2021 - AFTERNOON

Logan County weigh-in and tattoo date for Steers will take place on Saturday, Feb. 6, 2021 from 12:30 – 2:30 pm at GREENHAVEN ANIMAL CLINIC, Rte. 136/east side of San Jose. DO NOT ARRIVE BEFORE 12:30 pm. This includes ALL steers to be shown at Logan County 4-H Show and ALL steers to be shown at the Illinois State Fair. Information you will need at weigh-in includes: 4-H member name, address, birthday of 4-H'er, BREED of steer. COVID Safety Precautions will need to be followed as directed by Greenhaven.

State Fair Premiere Program

Anyone planning to enter animals in Illini Premiere program: STEERS - may nominate 10, weighed on Feb. 6; BARROWS – may nominate 25, must be farrowed on or after Feb. 10 and must be tattooed & weighed between Feb 10 & April 15; WETHERS/EWES - may nominate 10, must be weighed/tattooed between 3/15 & 5/15

ANIMAL OWNERSHIP DATES

Beef — Steers 2/1/21, Cows 1/1/21, Heifers 6/1/21

Dairy — Cows 1/1/21, Heifers 6/1/21

Meat Goats—5/15/21 (must be tattooed for State Fair)

Dairy Goats -6/1/21 (State Fair Milking Does 1/1/21)

Swine/Horses/Dogs -6/1/20

Rabbits, Pygmy Goats & Poultry — Does—6/1/21; All Others—out of stock owned prior to 6/1

Sheep — Wethers 6/1/21 (State Fair Market Wethers & Market Ewe Lambs 5/15/21), Breeding Sheep — 6/25/21



<u>Attention Beef, Swine, Dairy, Goat and Sheep Exhibitors – YQCA Annual Training Requirement</u>

Illinois 4-H requires all youth ages 8-18 enrolled in livestock projects to complete <u>annual</u> quality assurance certification through the Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) program.

Youth MUST take this training prior to making county 4-H show entries. (Entries will NOT be approved for a live animal exhibit unless training is complete.) This <u>does not</u> apply to youth exhibiting only animal or veterinary science poster/display projects.

Youth will again have <u>two options</u> to be certified in the 2020-2021 4-H year. We hope to be able to schedule 'in person' trainings in late Spring and online-only training/testing will also be an option (however, currently logging in through the 4-H Online log-in section of the system is <u>not working properly</u>) – 4-H livestock members be sure to watch email for further notification of when the YQCA training options become available.

Attention Horse, Poultry, Rabbit, Dog and Cat Exhibitors!

Members exhibiting horses, poultry, rabbits, dogs, and cats are still required to take the **Quality Assurance and Ethics** (QAEC) training. QAEC training is only <u>required once in the member's career</u>. If it is your first year in the horse, poultry, rabbit, dog, or cat project and you also plan on taking beef, swine, dairy, goat, or sheep, you will need to take both ethics certifications (YQCA and QAEC). QAEC training should be completed prior to making county 4-H show entries. (Entries will NOT be approved for a live animal exhibit unless training is complete.)

SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

FARM CREDIT ILLINOIS SCHOLARSHIPS

High school seniors planning careers in agriculture may apply for a \$2,000 scholarship. Farm Credit Illinois will provide 30 scholarships to youth who live or farm in one of the 60 counties in their service area. The first \$1,000 will be distributed for the Fall 2021 semester, and the second \$1,000 applied during the Fall 2023 semester. Apply online at farmcreditll.com before March 12, 2021. HEARTLAND BEEF ALLIANCE SCHOLARSHIP

Open to high school seniors who are residents of Logan, Mason, Menard, Sangamon or Tazewell counties and have an immediate family member be <u>an active member in the Heartland Beef Alliance</u> – two scholarships will be awarded (amounts between \$500 - \$1000). Must be from a family actively involved in beef industry either showing or in production. **Application/essay required (Essay topic "Opportunities for Young Beef Producers")** – **due Sat, Jan. 30, 2021.** Applications available online at the "4-H Records, Awards and Scholarship Resources" page of our website: https://go.illinois.edu/lmsrecords (near bottom of page).

IAA FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS

Logan County 4-H Foundation Scholarship Opportunity

Logan County 4-H Foundation will be awarding scholarships on a competitive basis to outstanding eligible 4-H'ers who will be pursuing an education at a college of his/her choice. The recipients must have been a 4-H member for at least 4 years, be accepted for enrollment or be enrolled at an accredited college, university, or community college as well as have submitted the Illinois 4-H Award Application/County 4-H Record for the previous 4-H year (2019-2020 – submitted in Sept. 2020) if a high school senior. Educator Corner ~ Carissa Davis - How To Help Stressed Out Youth To Cope

Do you remember what stressed you out as a kid? I clearly remember worrying a great deal about my school grades and what my peers thought of me. Of course I wanted to do my best, but in my mind, I also had to be the best. That didn't always happen -- which caused me more stress.

Like adults, young people have stress. It can come in many shapes and sizes. Maybe it's due to a test grade, or a friendship, or the perceived expectations of parents. There may be family stress related to finances or farming situations.

What can we as volunteers and parents do to help young people better manage stress? It's important to pay attention to the warning signs of stress:

- Feeling sad or withdrawn.
- More irritable or moody than usual.
- Drastic changes in behavior or sleep patterns.
- Routinely expressing worries.
- Clinging more to parents.
- Sleeping too much or too little.
- Eating too much or too little.
- Complaining about school or activities they attend.

These behaviors may mean something's up and we should pay attention to determine how best to intervene or respond. Listen to the youth to better understand their thoughts, feelings and behaviors. Connect with their parents or other youth workers who know and work with the child.

We know that life events can have very different impacts on youth. For example, getting a C on a test is "no big deal" for some, but for others feels devastating. One factor is resilience -- the ability to recover from difficulties. The American Psychological Association shares these suggestions:

- Make connections with others.
- Accept that change is a part of life.
- Develop a positive attitude about yourself.
- Take care of yourself.
- Learn about yourself.
- Define goals.
- Have a hopeful outlook.

Looking back, I realize that my 4-H leader tried to help me become resilient. She talked with me about what I was doing well and what I could have changed. She also taught me how to find the good in each life experience, to know that I had done the best I could that day, and to set a goal or two for the next experience.

ILLINOIS 4-H VIRTUAL ESPORTS SPIN CLUB OPPORTUNITY

With eSports becoming one of the largest growing tech industries in the world, with an annual revenue of \$1.5 billion with an expectation to reach \$2.2 billion by 2023, it is time that our youth become poised and ready to meet the demands of this growing field.

Are you at least 12 years old and own a computer or gaming system? This year Illinois 4-H released a pilot curriculum focused on the growing field of electronic sports, or eSports, and we would like to pilot it with you! As a pilot, we hope to add to and modify the curriculum based on the feedback and input of the youth involved. Under the direction of Illinois 4-H Computer Science Innovator Eric Li, youth will be virtually guided (using Zoom) through the eSports Pilot curriculum, learn the basics of the eSports field, and learn about the hardware and software that makes eSports possible. In addition, youth will be able to play and practice their favorite games as a team, and potentially compete in one or more eSports competitions through the Spring and Summer.

Registration for this opportunity will open on Dec. 1 and close on Jan. 15, with meetings beginning the third week of January. Schedule and goals will be determined/presented in the first meeting with plans on meeting at least twice a month (and more frequently before competitions).
