4-H Foods, Crops, Floriculture, and Horticulture Projects Exhibited on June 24

Macoupin County 4-H held their annual 4-H Foods, Crops, Floriculture, & Floriculture Show at the Macoupin County Fairgrounds in Carlinville on Monday, June 24. 4-H food members participated in a variety of categories such as Food Science, Food Preservation, Sports Nutrition, and all levels of 4-H Cooking. Some of the food products exhibited included coffeecake, cookies, rich cake, dinner rolls, yeast breads, scones, and biscuits. Members also displayed crops such as soybeans, corn, and cover crops display. Those members showing horticulture and floriculture projects displayed items such as fruits, vegetables, herbs, and flowers.

Each member presented their project to a judge through conference judging. During conference judging, youth explain what they made, what they learned from taking the project, and further explain their required learning activities.
