Educators Explore Agriculture

Ten educators from Calhoun, Cass, Christian, Greene, and Randolph counties explored more about agriculture during the Summer Agricultural Institute conducted by the Macoupin County Agricultural Literacy Program June 20-21. During the institute, educators toured several sites and tried hands-on activities as they learned more about the agriculture industry. Educators earned 14 professional development hours.

Traveling workshops included DICKEY-john, Illinois Department of Agriculture, Macoupin Veterinary Services, Sloan Implement Company, and Springfield Plastics.

Teachers completed many hands-on activities, learned more about agriculture and career opportunities, and received resources to use in their classrooms from different presenters. Presenters included Kevin Daugherty from Illinois Agriculture in the Classroom; Lydia Oker from Illinois Pork Producers; and Connie Niemann from Macoupin County Agricultural Literacy Program

On their evaluation one teacher commented: "I would encourage all educators to attend a summer ag institute." Another said, "It is awesome.
