

Carlinville Teacher's Grant Project

Illinois Agriculture in the Classroom grant winner Cathy Kulenkamp who teaches first grade at Carlinville Primary shares how they used the grant: "This year I took advantage of the opportunity to apply for a Illinois Agriculture in the Classroom Book Grant. I chose a book from the STEM in Agriculture category. Our classroom also participated in the Adopt a Calf opportunity sponsored by the St. Louis District Dairy Council. Every month students made connections with monthly emails giving updates on the calf we adopted. They learned that milk comes from a cow and what a cow needs to produce milk.

Our cumulative activity was to make ice cream in a baggie after reading about ice

cream. The STEM activity from the book was a perfect way to introduce coding in the classroom using Osmo and interactive coding games. I appreciate the Ag in the Classroom opportunity to



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bring Ag related books to my first grade classroom."

Tiffany Hanslow, Patty Ringhausen, and Holly Campbell from the Southwestern School District received project grants.

Illinois Agriculture in the Classroom grant applications are due October 20. They have book grants and classroom project grants available for next school year. Book Grants allow teachers to apply for \$250 in books from one of their themed collections. Project grants are \$300 and can be applied to projects that incorporate agriculture-related themes into a content-area classroom.
