

Those who don't complete the training will be removed from the animal science project and will not be eligible to exhibit at county fairs.

The State Youth Leadership Team plans and implements the state Jr. Leadership Conference, plans and teaches the Speaking for Illinois 4-H program, and assists (behind the scenes and in front of the audience) for many other statewide events. Team members have the opportunity to serve on statewide planning committees and advisory groups, including the Illinois 4-H Foundation Board of Directors, Illinois Farm Bureau Youth Education Committee, Illini Summer Academies planning committee, and Teen Leadership Conference planning committee. Members also have the first opportunity to attend National 4-H Conference in Washington, D.C. each spring.

Preparing for College? Look at Discovering STEM at ACES and the Ag Discovery Program!

Discovering STEM in ACES is a two-week virtual experience, July 11- 23, 2021, via Zoom from the University of Illinois. It is designed to help the students explore STEM programs dealing with food, environment, and human sciences. Students are selected based on grades, stated interest in STEM areas, letter of recommendation, and a final zoom interview. For students interested in exploring opportunities associated with becoming a veterinarian and working with wildlife, there is a program offered through the USDA called Ag Discovery Program. The **2021 regional hippology contest** will be held virtually on March 13. The contest will be conducted in the same manner as the 2020 regional hippology contest using the Compass Blackboard online learning management system (LMS) and remote proctoring software Proctorio. The contest will consist of 10

stations and a 50 multiple choice question written exam.

Also on March 13 will be a **virtual regional horse bowl contest**. Last year horse bowl was not transitioned to a virtual format, but this year there will be virtual testing of horse bowl knowledge, albeit without the characteristic reading of questions and quick response on the buzzer. Instead, the regional Horse Bowl contest will consist of a fill-in-the-blank and/or short answer written test administered through Compass Blackboard with actual horse bowl contest questions used as the virtual test questions. Participants will still compete in teams and a team score will be compiled from the three highest scoring team members.
