



National 4-H Congress will be held November 25-29, 2022 in Atlanta, Georgia. National 4-H Congress is a world class event that is diverse, authentic, and challenge oriented. The workshops will be laser focused on the 4-H mission, the service-learning experiences promise to be hands-on, the speakers will be engaging and entertaining, and there will plenty of opportunities for networking and recreational activities. This is a once in a lifetime opportunity!

How do teens become a part of the Illinois 4-H Delegation:

- 1. Complete the **National Congress Application** by **August 1, 2022.**
- 2. We have spots for TEN Illinois 4-H teens to participate. National Congress Application will be used to select the ten Illinois teens. The Illinois 4-H Foundation has secured scholarship funds for the 10 selected delegates.
- 3. Cost The total cost this year is \$2,000 per participant. Selected youth will receive a \$1,500 scholarship to the event provided by Illinois 4-H. They are responsible for the remaining \$500 balance which must be paid prior to the event.
