STEPS TO ENTER YOUR PROJECTS:

- 1) Look over the **4-H Online Judging Exhibitor Tip Sheet** to help guide you through the process.
 - 2) Review the Madison County Showbook for general project guidelines.
- 3) Review the **4-H Fair Entry Exhibit Requirements** to see what photos and documents are needed for your projects.
- 4) Fill out the **4-H Project Report**. This will take the place of the questions that a judge would normally ask you during an in person judging conference.
- 5) IF a video is required (see step 2 info.) please follow these instructions for uploading your video.
- 6) Review the Family Instructions on how to enroll your projects in Fair Entry.

Nice work to this club who spent time at Hitz Home cleaning up the pavilion area.


They came away with 10 bags of leaves and weeds!
