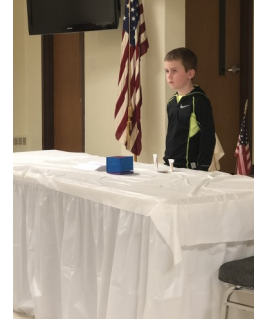

Megan Thompson (above left) gave a cooking demonstration on how to make ready to eat cookie dough and the New Ideal club members each got to sample it when she was finished.

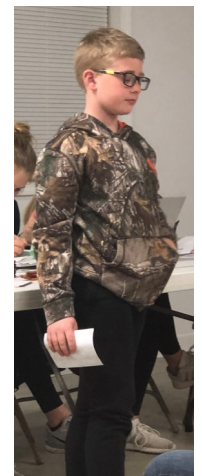
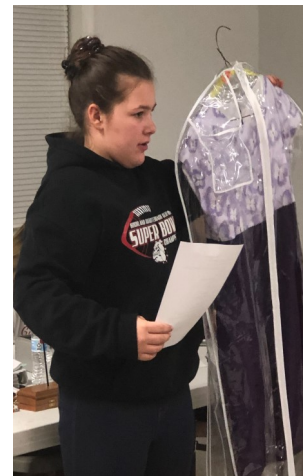
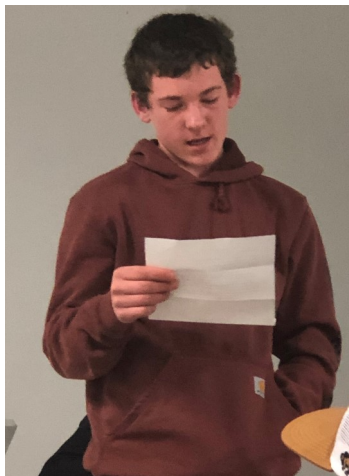
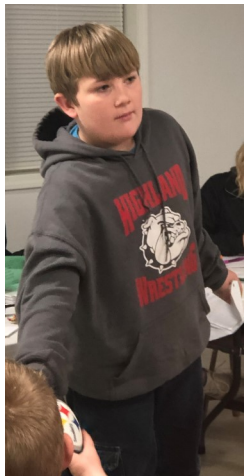

You be the judge at Illinois 4-H State Livestock Judging Contest**June 15 | 9 AM – 4 PM****Stock Pavilion | University of Illinois, Urbana**

The Illinois 4-H Livestock Judging Contest will be held Monday, June 15 at the Stock Pavilion in Urbana (1402 West Pennsylvania Ave.) beginning with registration at 8:30 a.m. All participants must be checked in by 9:30. The contest will begin at 10. Each county may enter a total of three teams, with no more than two junior teams or two senior teams. Get all the rules and details online @ go.illinois.edu/4Hlivestock. There will be three classes of beef, three classes of swine and two classes of sheep. There may also be a class of meat goats substituted for one class of the other species.

There will also be a class of 15 questions (5 from a beef class, 5 from a swine class and 5 from a sheep class). Cost for each senior competitor is \$10 to cover the cost of lunch. Juniors will be dismissed by lunch to get their own meals.

**4-H Poultry judging returns to state fair****August 17 | 4-6 PM****Jr. Livestock Barns | Illinois State Fair**

The Illinois 4-H State Poultry Judging Contest will be held from 4 to 6 PM August 17 in the junior livestock barns on the State Fairgrounds in Springfield. 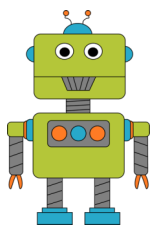
