## **4-H Show Requirements**

As we begin the new 4-H year, please remember that in order to show projects at the County and State levels at the end of the year, you must meet the following requirements:

- ♦ You must attend at least 4 meetings during the year, either in person or virtually
  - ♦ You must give a talk or demonstration, either in person or virtually
- You must be enrolled in 4-H online by December 1st, 2020 (the system is currently being upgraded but as soon as it is ready for enrollment you will receive an email with instructions)





## **4-H Club Meeting Guidelines**

As we begin our new 4-H year please keep these guidelines in mind when meeting in person:

- Remember to bring and wear your face mask to all meetings. You
  will not be allowed to stay at the meeting without a mask. If you do
  not have a mask, please reach out to your club leader prior to your
  meeting.
