

PROTEIN

Low sodium canned beans
Dried beans, peas, or lentils
Unsalted or lightly salted nuts
Trail mix with less than 230 mg sodium
Canned tuna, chicken, or salmon in water
Nut butters: peanut, almond, cashew with less
than 230 mg sodium & 6 g sugar per serving



GRAINS

Cereal and oatmeal with less than 12 g of sugar Whole grain bread, pasta, or tortillas Barley, quinoa, and couscous Brown rice and instant rice Whole grain crackers Whole grain flour Corn tortillas

Basic Necessities
