4-H Project Materials for this 4-H year will continue to be at the expense of the 4-H member. When project materials arrive in the office, an invoice will be prepared for each 4-H member and a club invoice will also be available for the leader.

Payment can be made at the time of pick up by either the member or the leader or it can be mailed to the office within two weeks. 4-H member is not officially enrolled in the project until payment is received.

Project materials can also be shared amongst members to deter the cost.
