4-H Show exhibition time is upon us! Over the past 4-H year, members should have attended at least one or more club meetings, where they have participated in the 4-H Essential Elements of Positive Youth Development... Belonging, Independence, and Generosity. Practicing these elements helps 4-H youth be prepared for the final element of Mastery.

The 4-H Show exhibition, or any opportunity to exhibit mastery of a 4-H project or skill, is the last piece to the 4-H Essential Elements of Positive Youth Development. By now, 4-H Show entries and any required trainings for show eligibility should be completed. The next steps for members are to complete and perfect their 4-H projects to their own ability and satisfaction, and to practice their communication skills for conference judging. The 4-H Show exhibition is an engagement in learning opportunity for youth to further develop their skills. Youth can take away tips and knowledge from the project expert who will be interviewing them and evaluating their project. As always, we want all 4-H involvement to be positive for youth. The summer 4-H shows are just a small piece of the overall 4-H experience. 4-H Show week is also about including everyone and giving them the sense of belonging. It is about adults actively supporting our youth by allowing them to become independent and giving them the ability to see themselves as active participants in the future. It is an opportunity for everyone to learn and continue the custom of generosity, by valuing and practicing service to others. Remember, those who exhibit kindness, respect, and fairness will always get the "A" rating and the Best of Show for mastery!

Poultry Exhibitions

The Illinois Department of Agriculture (IDOA) recently extended the ban on exhibiting poultry through the rest of the summer fair season. This announcement is to protect poultry from the highly pathogenic avian influenza.

The following are Poultry Exhibition changes for Mason County 4-H members. Youth may enter one or both options. Please check exhibition dates and times closely in the 4-H Show Book for both options.

Animal Science project - Members enrolled in the Poultry project may enter an Animal Science project to exhibit on Monday, July 25 during the 4-H General Projects Show. Please follow the guidelines on page 12-13 in the Animal Science category for the exhibit. Youth will need to be present for conference judging which begins at 9 a.m. The display/poster exhibit should focus on any activity related to the Poultry project. These projects will have the opportunity to be selected for State Fair and State Fair Alternate delegates, as well as the Best of Show in Animal Science projects. No spectators are allowed during 4-H conference judging.

Poultry Showmanship - Members enrolled in the Poultry project can ALSO enter the Poultry Showmanship class under the Poultry division. 4-H Poultry Showmanship will be judged on Tuesday, July 26 beginning at 9 a.m. in the Poultry Building. 4-H Jr. & Sr. Showmanship judging will be an activity based on knowledge of the poultry project. Spectators are welcome for this event.

Member Award Recognition Due

The Illinois 4-H Experience Award Application focuses on all of those events and activities that you have experienced during the 4-H year in four areas: Participation, Community Service, Leadership, and Project Learning. Depending upon the type and number of experiences you can report on, members can receive recognition on the Bronze, Silver, Gold, Diamond or Emerald Clover Award level. Your family calendar, 4-H notes or county summary, checkmarks, and a few written details are all that's needed for even the youngest members to submit this application. Horticulture Members Planning to Show an Herb Display

Updates were made by the State 4-H office to the Herb display class after our show book was printed and distributed. If you are planning to create an Herb Display, please see the following information. In order to be promoted to State Fair, these guidelines must be followed. Highlighted is the updated portion.

Herb Display (SF 50313)

Open to youth in Vegetable Gardening A, Vegetable Gardening B, Vegetable Gardening C, and Vegetable Gardening D

Herbs should be grown in pots (8" maximum diameter). Categories: Mint, Oregano, Rosemary, Sage, Thyme, and all other herbs. Herbs should be labeled with common and Latin names. Herbs should be in your care for a minimum of three months for state fair exhibits. Remove dead leaves from plants and check that the soil is clear of debris such as dead leaves. In addition to class Champions, Herb Category Grand and Reserve Grand Champions may be selected. When exhibiting herb plants, be sure to grow the plants in the container to be displayed to avoid transplant shock. Exhibits will be evaluated based on cleanliness, uniformity, condition, quality, and trueness to variety. Additional herb resources are located on the project resources section of the Illinois 4-H website.

- Display must include 4 or more different kinds of herbs. There may not be more than 2 different varieties of any herb. For example, peppermint and chocolate mint would be classified as two different herb varieties.
- In instances where containers display more than one variety of herb, special care should be taken that each distinct variety is accessible and clearly visible to the judges to ensure full points for cleanliness.

Conference Judging

Conference judging is designed to increase the value of the 4-H exhibit experience for 4-H members. The judge may ask you questions about your project, such as:

- 1. Tell me how you made this exhibit.
- 2. What was the most difficult part of making this exhibit?
- 3. Did you learn anything new? What?
- 4. What would you do differently next time?
- 5. Did you enjoy working on this project?
- 6. What interested you in this project?

4-H Club Leaders & Officers— End of the Year Records Due!

The 2021-22 year end club records are due to the Mason Extension office no later than 4:30 p.m. on August 31, 2022.

Required documents are:

-Club Secretary Book, complete with minutes and attendance to each club meeting, notations of motions for expenditures, and approval of motions.

-Club Treasurer's Book, including club bank statements from September 1, 2021—August 31, 2022, club expenditure receipts, and deposit slips.
-Club Annual Financial Statement (page 2 of Treasurer's Book), signed by fiscal review committee, club leader, and club treasurer.

Clubs failing to return this documentation will not be allowed to be active for the 2022-23 new 4-H year.

Photography 2 Members

Level 2 Next Level Photography project book will replace the Controlling the Image project book since it is no longer available on Shop 4-H. The new project book and pages have changed, but the skills learned and requirements will go unchanged.

Exhibit one of the options listed below:

- Exhibit one framed 8" x 10" close-up photograph using the skills learned on pages 58-61(section: Bits and Pieces) of the project manual titled Level 2 *Next Level Photography*. No photo editing is allowed in this class except cropping and red eye removal; **OR**
- Exhibit one framed 8" x 10" photo which demonstrates your understanding of a technique you learned from your Photography 2 project manual. No photo editing is allowed in this class except cropping and red eye removal. Be prepared to show the page in the manual of the technique you are demonstrating.


