All club leaders, shooting sports instructors, coordinators, and assistants should also complete/re-enroll in the 4-H Zsuite online system. Please take a few moments to get this done!

4-H Federation members should be marked as members in the 4-H Federation Club as well as any 4-H clubs they are enrolled in.

A benefit of the digital option is you will have the ability to read the newsletter from your phone, tablet, or computer. You will also be able to click on links and immediately register for events and add them to your device calendars, which can be a big time saver!

Steer Weigh-In & Tattooing

SAVE THE DATE...Steer weigh-in and tattooing is scheduled for Saturday, February 3, 2024 at 8 a.m. at Green Prairie Animal Hospital in San Jose. Please plan to arrive early. There will not be a veterinarian available on this date, if you need other animal services, you will need to schedule at a different time with the clinic. In case of inclement weather on the day of the event, an alternate date is set for Saturday, February 10, 2024. You will be contacted should we need to use the alternate date.

If you want your steer(s) to be eligible for the County Rate-of-Gain Contest, the Illinois State Fair Junior Show, or the Illinois State Fair Premiere Contest, you must bring your steer(s) to be weighed and tattooed on the above date.
