There is an annual 4-H membership fee and payment is required of all members to participate in club activities. This year, with many thanks to the Havana National Bank for their donation to the Mason County 4-H program, membership fees have been discounted by half.

Cost is \$10 per member with a \$60 per family cap for membership fees. Invoices have been mailed out to anyone still needing to pay. Payments must be received by July 1, 2021 in order to be eligible to exhibit at the Mason County 4-H Show.

FARM SAFETY DAY FOR YOUTH

The annual Farm Safety Day will be held on Friday, June 4, 2021 at the Mason County Fair Grounds in Havana, from 8:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

Farm Safety education is not just for farm kids! Safety topics to be covered will include Livestock, Fire, Weather, Grain Bin, Hiking/ Survival, Equipment, Firearms, and Poisonous Plants.

The event is sponsored by University of Illinois Extension, Fulton and Mason Counties, and Fulton County and Mason County Farm Bureaus, with the help of local businesses and donors.

The event is free to attend, however **online** pre-registration is required by May 28, 2021. Online registration can be found at go.illinois.edu/farmsafetyday

Youth who are pre-registered by May 28, 2021 will receive a free gift at the conclusion of the event.

Farm Safety Day is for kids ages 6 years of age and up. Parents/adults are encouraged to attend with youth. A bag lunch and water will be provided to attendees.

State and local health department guidelines at the time of the event will be followed. Please use your best judgement if you and or your child is not feeling well.

QUALITY ASSURANCE & ETHICS (QA&E)



The Quality Assurance and Ethics training is required for all youth that enroll in horses, rabbits, poultry, dogs, and cats. Members must take the training whether they own a live animal or not. It is advised that they complete this one time as soon as they are enrolled in the project area. Failure to complete QA&E will result in the member's animal science project enrollment being cancelled and they will be ineligible to exhibit at county fairs. NOTE: Youth must be logged on to a computer for this program, either a desktop or laptop; not an iPad or iPhone. The program cannot capture the information for county staff to see when it is completed using iPads or iPhones.

YOUTH FOR THE QUALITY CARE OF ANIMALS (YQCA)

The YQCA is a livestock quality assurance program. It also replaces the Quality Assurance & Ethics (QAEC) program for youth in the following species; dairy cattle, beef cattle, swine, sheep, and goats. All 4-H

exhibitors of these animals will be required to certify in the YQCA program yearly. Failure to complete YQCA will result in the member's animal science project enrollment being cancelled and they will be

ineligible to exhibit at county fairs. Youth must certify online via the website http://yqca.org The YQCA program is for youth ages 8-21. The online version is broken into age divisions as follows: juniors 8-11, intermediate 12-14, senior 15-18, and young adults

19-21. This certification is annual with test out options of 1-3 years. The cost is \$12 and paid online.



4-H SHOOTING SPORTS LEADER CERTIFICATION TRAINING

A summer 4–H Shooting Sports leader certification training is scheduled for <u>Saturday</u>, <u>July 24</u>, 2021 in Pike County, IL. Shotgun, Rifle, Archery, Pistol, Hunting/Outdoor Skills, and Coordinator disciplines offered.

ILLINOIS CROP SCOUTING COMPETITION FOR HIGH SCHOOL AGE YOUTH



The Illinois Crop Scouting Competition is a one-day contest and will be held at the Crop Sciences Research & Ed. Center in Savoy, IL on August 4, 2021

Student teams of 2–5 high–school–aged youth (grades 9–12) with an adult coach will rotate through 10 outdoor stations at the University of Illinois South Farm fields to test their skills hands–on with topics such as identifying weeds, insects, and diseases, identifying the growth stages of corn and soybean plants, assessing abiotic injury, pesticide application, and integrated pest management.

2021 MASON COUNTY 4-H EXHIBITION— IMPORTANT 4-H SHOW CHANGES & INFORMATION!

We are excited to hold an in-person 4-H Show this year! However, the 2021 4-H Show will see some changes. These changes have been made due to the Covid-19 pandemic, in order to more safely execute the 4-H portions of the fair, and follow University of Illinois, State, and local health department guidelines.

Families can begin by carefully reading their 4-H Show Book. There have been some minor changes in a few project areas and the show schedule from previous years. If you need a 4-H Show Book, please contact your 4-H leader or call the Extension office.

Fair entries will be made from June 1 through July 1 at: https://mason4-hfair.fairentry.com/

Only one entry per livestock species will be made for 4-H. Livestock entries will be based on 4-H age, and one entry will be made for either the Jr. or Sr. Showmanship class. Youth will enter only this class for 4-H exhibition in livestock projects. Youth will be expected to exhibit animals and convey knowledge of their projects to the judge. Please read page 58 of the 4-H Show Book for more information on Showmanship. Livestock project exhibitors will receive more information after July 1, 2021 4-H Show entry deadline.

General Projects will be exhibited on Monday, July 26. You will see minor changes in exhibition checkin and conference judging set up. Buildings will be closed to spectators during judging times. We will strictly adhere to any building capacity guidelines, if required, at the time of the show.

Families should plan to bring lawn chairs and blankets to sit on while waiting outside of buildings during conference judging.

The 4-H Federation Food Stand will not be open this year. Please plan accordingly for food and drinks. It's a great time to have a family picnic!
