

#### About the Scholarship and Eligibility

- 1. This is a one time scholarship that is awarded to current 4-H members age 17 or 18 by September 1st who qualify.
- 2. Applicant must have completed High School or are in their last eligible year of 4-H membership.
- 3. Awards will be based on the 4-H member's involvement, achievements, leadership, and the impact that 4-H has had on their life and growth.
- 4. The amount of the scholarship will be determined on an annual basis by the McHenry County 4-H Youth Foundation. Scholarships are dependent on Foundation's fundraising success and at the Foundation's discretion.
- 5. Applicant must be an active, registered McHenry County 4-H member in good standing at the time of application.
- 6. Applicant may reapply the following year if not selected and is still enrolled in the McHenry County 4-H program.
- 7. This scholarship application is a two step process. 1) Applicants will begin with the written application that will be reviewed by independent judges. 2) If the applicant gualifies, an interview will be set up as the second step in the application process.
- 8. Scholarship recipients will be announced at the 4-H Awards Night during the week of the McHenry County Fair.

### Section 7 - 4-H Story/Essay

Type up a 4-H Story/Essay in a separate document and attach the printed copy with this application. Use the formatting instructions below (**Application Format Checklist**).

#### Application Format Checklist

- Include a maximum of four (4) pages, single sided, of typed responses to the items listed below.
- Standard 8 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" by 11" white paper should be used.
- Type size should be **no smaller** than 11 point Times New Roman, Arial, or Cambria font.
- Paper should be double spaced, this allows space for Judges review comments.
- Paper should have 1" margins on all four edges.
- Page numbers should be included on each page.
- Your 4-H Story/Essay should include:
  - At least one paragraph about one item listed from Section 3 4-H Citizenship/Community Service. Be sure to include things that contributed to the welfare of your club/group members, other individuals, or community. Indicate the size and scope of what you did.
  - At least one paragraph about one item listed from Section 4 Experiences in 4-H. Pick one of the leadership involvements, either from club/county, state, or national level, and further discuss it. Explain how the experience impacted you and any possible skills you have gained from taking part in the leadership role.
  - At least one paragraph about one item listed from Section 5 -Activities/Experiences Other Than 4-H. Be sure to include things that contributed to the welfare of other individuals, or community. Indicate the size and scope of what you did.
  - 4. Identify one of the life skills that you have learned from your 4-H experience. Include a short paragraph explaining how this particular life skill has been of benefit to you and possibly those around you. Describe briefly how this life skill will play a role in your future.



### **Section 8 - References**

Included with your application should be three (3) single page letters of reference. At least one reference letter needs to be from someone involved in the 4-H program. At least one reference letter needs to be from someone outside of 4-H. Do **NOT** include reference letters from family members. Reference letters may be a copy or original. (Be sure to retain a copy/original for your future use).

- 1. All application materials must be put in a minimum of a 9 X 12 manilla envelope and sealed. Please do not staple the materials.
- Applications can be submitted in person to the Extension Office or by mail. If hand delivered, applications must be **received** at the Extension Office **no later than 4:30 p.m. on June 1st**. No Exceptions! Envelopes should be labeled "McHenry County 4-H Youth Foundation Scholarship."
