

The Rock Island County 4-H


Rural Go Getters Report Submitted by: Hannah Close

Mercer County Scholarships

4-H Memorial Scholarship: This was established with memorial funds from Dylis

McCutchan and Daniel Mclaughlin. Dylis was a leader of Hamlet Handy Helpers for over 40 years. Daniel was a Mercer 4-H alum and a long-time member of the Young Riders Club. Both of these individuals knew first-hand the value and impact that 4-H can have on youth. The scholarship funds continue to grow as more people donate in memory of loved ones. The memorial scholarship is open to current Mercer County 4-H members graduating from High School or in their final year of 4-H. It is intended those entering or currently attending a college, university or trade school. For the application and full details visit, extension.illinois.edu/hmrs/4-h-mercer-county. Deadline to apply is March 15, 2020.

Patti Jeanne Higgins Scholarship:

This scholarship is for one year, available to high school seniors or persons enrolled in their first year of college, university, technical, or vocational school. Two \$500 scholarships will be awarded. Applicant must be a resident of Mercer or Warren County and actively involved in 4-H for a minimum of three years. Preference will be given to applicants who are or were a member of the Alexis All-Star 4-H Club. Applicant is required to verify acceptance to or present enrollment at their school prior to receiving the money.

Applicant shall be required to submit a written application. In addition to eligibility guidelines, the following will be considered in selecting recipients: academic performance and honors, rank in class, ACT score, financial need, character and personality. Consideration shall be given to maturity, industriousness and motivation, intellectual interest, moral character, and demonstrated leadership.

Ag Careers Day


The next Ag Careers Day will be held on Saturday, March 7 at Black Hawk East. This

Ethics Requirements for 2019-2020

Youth enrolled in horses, poultry, rabbits, cats & dogs:

Youth enrolled in beef, sheep, swine, and goats:

Online - The training can be completed here: Online training here: yqca.org.

2. **In Person** - We will offer one in-person training per county in the winter/spring. Cost of certification through this method is \$3, but it will only certify you for one year.

<u>Note:</u> This requirement only applies to youth planning to show a *live* animal. It does not apply to youth exhibiting a poster related to an animal.

- Ownership/Nomination deadline is March 15 May 15
- Weighed and tattooed between March 15 & May 15
- Addition of Premiere Ewe Lambs is new for 2020

Breeding Animals

Beef Heifers-June 1, 2020

Gilts - June 1, 2020

Ewes & Rams - June 25, 2020

Cows and Heifers - Cows Jan. 1, 2020/Heifers June 1, 2020

Dairy Goats - Milking Does by Jan. 1, 2020/Kids & Yearlings by June 1, 2020

Meat Goats - May 15, 2020

Horse - Ownership/Lease/Registration papers are due to the County Office by May 1. State fair papers are due to Donna Miller at the Illinois State Fair Office by June 1. Remember that two color photos must accompany the paperwork.


